hat a difference a year makes! At this time a year ago we were repairing homes damaged by Hurricane Irma and there were 16 empty lots. This December finds 12 empty lots and fewer than 10 homes on my active sale (For Sale Sign displayed) list throughout the park. The current sale picture at Gateway as of the second week of December was: three (3) double-wides on Bay Street; three (3) single-wides and one (1) double-wide on 1st Street, and; one (1) single-wide on 1st Way.

Of some concern on my survey was that I noticed unattended dogs in our newly constructed dog park enclosure. Two dogs, no people in sight, fortunately it was shady and the day was cool.

I have been told that the notorious 106th Avenue duck feeding woman of Sienna Bay has moved and this could result in substantially fewer Muscovey ducks over-nighting at the Gateway side entrance gate. My son, who visited recently, noted with some concern that a Muscovey approached him as he was exiting the 7-11 to the north of the park no doubt seeking a handout.

Residents are reminded that it is a violation of the law to feed, shelter or otherwise nurture any of the animals, especially the Muscoveys, that are found in and about our community. I strongly recommend you avoid any physical contact and you not permit your pets wander in areas where the presence of wild animals is suspected. Take care to keep your carport clear of duck feces.

BE SAFE AS YOU WALK

Suggested by Virginia Ehrman

The period of daylight has grown shorter and residents nonetheless will be out and about on the streets of Gateway. Our community, due to its restricted speed, relatively wide straight streets together with our flat terrain offers great attraction to those who choose to walk for exercise, walk their pets and ride bikes. Please take into consideration and practice the following safe pedestrian habits:

1. Walk Facing Traffic

This gives you the best chance to see traffic approaching closest to you and take evasive action when needed. This may be confusing because the opposite rule is true for cyclists, who cycle in the same direction as the traffic flow.

2. Be Visible

Wear bright colors when walking in the daytime. When walking at night, wear light-colored clothing and reflective clothing or a reflective vest to be visible. Bike riders, walkers and golf cart operators should have and use electric lights, front and rear. Park street lighting is adequate but at any point where a street light is not lit, the dark area becomes a blind spot for drivers. Non-functioning street lights should be reported to Duke Energy and the Gateway office. Drivers are often not expecting walkers to be out after dark, and you need to give them every chance to see you. It may be a good idea to make your pet visible also!

3. Be Predictable

Make a practice of staying on one side of the street while walking rather than weaving randomly from side to side.

4. Keep The Volume Down

Don't drown out your environment when listening to music with your earbuds or headphones. Keep the volume at a level where you can still hear bike bells and warnings from other walkers.

5. Hang Up And Eyes Up

Distracted walking is as dangerous as distracted driving. You are less likely to recognize traffic danger, tripping hazards, or passing bikers. Potential criminals see you as an easy target. Adopt habits that can keep your phone in your pocket, or at least make it a practice to stop in a safe place to complete your phone tasks before moving on.

6. Walk Dogs On Short Leashes

It is terrifying and tragic to witness dogs running out into traffic or getting into a fatal dog fight, whether on leash or off leash. But when walking your dog on a long leash there is also a danger that you will trip other walkers or bikers. You will keep your dog safer as well as those who pass by you if you use proper leash walking etiquette.



Coffee aids in kidney disease fight, study says

mong coffee's health benefits may be a reduced risk of death from kidney disease, according to the Healthline website.

A study recently written up in the journal Nephrology Dialysis Transplantation examined data from 4,863 Americans.

The subjects were divided into four groups. Group One consumed the amount of caffeine in one cup of iced tea per day. Group Two took caffeine equivalent to one cup of coffee per day. Group Three had one or two cups, and Group Four had multiple cups per day.

Subjects in Group Two, researchers found, had a 12 percent lower risk of dying from kidney disease. Group Three showed a 22 percent lower risk, and Group Four, which consumed the highest amount of caffeine per day, saw a 24 percent lower risk.

Scientists caution that caffeine poses other health risks, and patients on fluid-restricted diets should take coffee into account of their daily fluid intake. Cream, creamers, and syrups can also cause problems for people with kidney disease, including increased phosphorus and potassium levels. Check with your doctor, as always.

Water might help reduce women's UTIs

Tomen who suffer from frequent urinary tract infections (UTIs) may find relief by simply drinking more water, an article on the WebMD website advises.

A yearlong study in Europe followed 140 premenopausal women who experienced recurring UTIs at high rates. At the beginning, the subjects drank less than six eight-ounce glasses of water per day. As the year went on, half the participants drank slightly more than six glasses, while the rest kept to the same regimen.

Researchers found a significant reduction of UTIs among the women who drank more water per day. The average number of UTIs among subjects in the first group was 3.2, but dropped to 1.7 for women whose water intake increased.

"Drinking more water to improve one's health is probably safe and, if tap is used, pretty inexpensive," said one doctor (who was not involved in the study). "Producing additional urine—and thus increasing voiding frequency—may raise one's awareness of the importance of keeping the bladder as empty as possible, which can help reduce UTIs."


