The new year finds 13 empty lots and only 9 homes on my active sale (For Sale Sign displayed) list. The current sale picture at Gateway as of the first week of December was: three (3) double-wide on 1st Street; three (3) single-wide and two (2) double-wide on Bay Street, and; one (1) double-wide on 1st Lane.

Our Gateway community typically experiences the comings and goings of approximately 10 to 15 percent of residents over the course of a year. Those who arrive and wish to take advantage of our wide, flat and less trafficked streets are advised to use caution whether you walk, ride a bike/trike or exercise a pet. Early morning (6 - 8 a.m.) and late afternoon (5 - 7 p.m.) seem to be the times throughout the week days where vehicle traffic (many residents of Gateway do work) is most evident. Take the time to read the article that follows and be conscious and cautions as you ride/walk and enjoy the streets of Gateway.



BE SAFE AS YOU WALK

Suggested by Virginia Ehrman

The period of daylight has grown shorter and residents nonetheless will be out and about on the streets of Gateway. Our community, due to its restricted speed, relatively wide straight streets together with our flat terrain offers great attraction to those who choose to walk for exercise, walk their pets and ride bikes. Please take into consideration and practice the following safe pedestrian habits:

1. Walk Facing Traffic

This gives you the best chance to see traffic approaching closest to you and take evasive action when needed. This may be confusing because the opposite rule is true for cyclists, who cycle in the same direction as the traffic flow.

2. Be Visible

Wear bright colors when walking in the daytime. When walking at night, wear lightcolored clothing and reflective clothing or a reflective vest to be visible. Bike riders, walkers and golf cart operators should have and use electric lights, front and rear. Park street lighting is adequate but at any point where a street light is not lit, the dark area becomes a blind spot for drivers. Non-functioning street lights should be reported to Duke Energy and the Gateway office. Drivers are often not expecting walkers to be out after dark, and you need to give them every chance to see you. It may be a good idea to make your pet visible also!

3. Be Predictable

Make a practice of staying on one side of the street while walking rather than weaving randomly from side to side.

4. Keep The Volume Down

Don't drown out your environment when listening to music with your earbuds or headphones. Keep the volume at a level where you can still hear bike bells and warnings from other walkers.

5. Hang Up And Eyes Up

Distracted walking is as dangerous as distracted driving. You are less likely to recognize traffic danger, tripping hazards, or passing bikers. Potential criminals see you as an easy target. Adopt habits that can keep your phone in your pocket, or at least make it a practice to stop in a safe place to complete your phone tasks before moving on.

6. Walk Dogs On Short Leashes

It is terrifying and tragic to witness dogs running out into traffic or getting into a fatal dog fight, whether on leash or off leash. But when walking your dog on a long leash there is also a danger that you will trip other walkers or bikers. You will keep your dog safer as well as those who pass by you if you use proper leash walking etiquette.
