LOCAL CORONA VIRUS AT A GLANCE

t this time (June 12) there are 1810 reported cases in Pinellas County with 101 deaths attributed to the disease. There were 51 reported cases in the Gateway Zip Code (33716).



Hillsborough County, 3174 cases with 96 deaths; Manatee County, 1253 cases with 114 deaths, and; Sarasota County, 716 cases with 89 deaths.

Masks and Social Distancing

The recent protests put an end to the idea that social distancing is something on the minds and critical to the thinking of our children and grandchildren. Recent uptiks in COVID cases, especially among millennials and safety forces, are certainly not attributable to the relaxing of restrictions placed upon our business communities and national economy.

My personal observations regarding the use of masks goes something like this: Older more likely than younger; women more likely than men; indoors more likely than outdoors. Home Depot and Lowes, few if any masks; grocery stores, masks worn.

It should go without saying that should you feel ill or are in close contact with someone who is ill with a cold or other flu like symptoms, that you should be reasonable and responsible when it comes to your travels out and about among the now more active public.

In addition to the fourn ladies mentioned in the June NewsNDos we would also acknowledge the efforts of **Dorinda Barnes** of 1st Street and **MaryIn Stevens** of 1st Way whom we have come to find out have sewn and distributed masks to the Gateway and Pinellas County community. Thank you Dorinda and MaryIn.

FLORIDA TESTING RESULTS

The total number of Floridians tested has nearly doubled over the last month to 1.33 million, about 6% of the population. The number testing positive (active COVID) continues in the 3% to 5.5% range. Compare this to Ohio, which has consistently ranged at double the Florida rate and though with one half the population has nearly the same number of deaths as our state. Ohio governor Mike DeWine (R) and his health director Dr. Amy Acton were quick to close Ohio businesses, impose restrictions and have been slower yet to re-open. When this disease has run its course, it will be interesting to compare the results as relating to the steps taken by various governing bodies.




GATEWAY MEN'S GOLF
