PINELLAS PARK CIVIC ORCHESTRA

The Pinellas Park Orchestra will be performing a special concert on Sunday, May 3rd to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the City of Pinellas Park. The orchestra has had a twenty year affiliation with the city at the Performing Arts Center and calls it 'home.' It will be the last concert of the 2014-2015 season.

Rehearsals, of course, are well under way for this performance and will be a grade level higher in complexity. It should be apparent to the listening audience and appreciably more difficult for the players.



Topical selection for the evening will be Elgar's Pomp & Circumstance, the traditional procession at all graduations; Salute to Ol' Blue Eyes, Frank Sinatra's 100th birthday; Centennial Waltz by Strauss, An American Salute (When Johnny comes Marching Home), Porgy & Bess, a 1936 copyright by George and Ira Gershwin, and Malaguena, a most beautiful of all Spanish Dances. Suzanne Ruley, soprano and Jeff Clark, baritone, will be on hand for vocal selections.

Make an attempt to attend this concert, placing the date on your calendar, and support the City of Pinellas Park and the orchestra. If you have never attended before this might be a good concert to 'cut your teeth' on. A selection of classical, pop, and show tunes, music to satisfy everyone's taste. The Performing Arts Center is located at 4971 78th Ave, Pinellas Park and getting there could not be easier.
