The Board of Directors is in need of Directors and a Secretary.

At a Homeowners meeting this year, Len Stevens said that at the FMO training meeting, we were told that some parks no longer have a Board of Directors. They stated that they could not get people to come forward and be on the Board. The FMO President's park is one of those parks. They have no meetings. They have no one to support the residences of the park in issues with management. The only thing they do is having a yearly negotiation meeting with management.

A few things that your more recent Boards have worked with management on are, redoing the pool and hot tub, requesting a dog park, having the towing times and parking issues better suited for residences, requesting palm tree replacement, fixing the fountain in the lake and we are currently working on updating the HOA By Laws which are from 1984. The Board often makes suggestions to management that have improved our park, which hopefully improved YOUR home — investment when you may sell it.

Gateway Homeowners Association often has openings for Board members. Sometimes they leave for personal reasons or may move out of the park. There have been 2 openings for several months. I have asked for volunteers to fill those positions, no one has come forward.

In addition, 2 positions are expiring at the end of 2019. Gateway Homeowners Association needs Board members to represent the residences, or we will end up like some other parks that have no Board.

There is an old saying — "There is power in numbers," power through the Board representation, the FMO and the support of the homeowners. Each year membership is going down. I have heard various excuses why someone does not want to attend meetings. The most popular are — I don't like someone on the Board or how the meetings are conducted. My personal feelings are that I don't care about if I like someone on the Board or behavior at the meeting; I have worked hard and saved to buy my home- IT IS AN INVESTMENT AND SO IS THE GATEWAY COMMUNITY. I WANT TO HEAR ABOUT HOW THINGS ARE MAY EFFECT THAT INVESTMENT. DON'T YOU??? I have gone to meetings since moving into Gateway, as President and a Board member, I have joined the FMO. Former Board member, Janice Cook and I have attended their District meetings. I enjoy hearing other parks' issues and how they are dealing with them and how the Florida Statues affect us as a Mobile Home Community. 


