**merican Red Cross Month.** The American Red Cross was founded by Clara Barton in 1881. Today its supporters, volunteers, and employees provide compassionate care in five vital areas: People affected by disasters in America; support for members of the military and their families; blood collection, processing, and distribution; health and safety education and training; and international relief and development.

# Going the store? Why leave the house?

Shopping online has exploded in recent years. One example: A survey conducted by 72 Point Inc. and commissioned by Door to Door Organics, an online organic grocer, found that shoppers increased their online grocery purchases by an average of 29 percent in the past year, and those shoppers do about 19 percent of their weekly grocery shopping via the Internet.

# Extra sleep may not lead to longer life

ost of us look forward to sleeping late on the weekend. After a hard week of work, we deserve a few extra hours, right? But a study from the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology & Metabolism suggests that sleeping in may contribute to a higher risk of diabetes and heart disease.



Researchers tracked more than men and women age 30-54, using devices that recorded their movement to determine when they fell asleep and woke up for a one-week period. Close to 85 percent went to bed later and got up later on their days off from work, and those people tended to experience lower levels of HDL cholesterol (the good kind) along with higher triglycerides, greater resistance to insulin, and a higher body mass index, even after controlling for factors like physical activity, calorie consumption, and alcohol use.

The implications are clear: Maintaining a consistent sleep schedule, even on weekends, is better for everyone's long-term health.

# Aspirin prevents skin cancer?

spirin is known to cure our aches and pains and improve heart health. It may also be useful in preventing certain kinds of skin cancer, according to an article on the Discover magazine website.

Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) like aspirin and ibuprofen are already known to help prevent cancers in the colon, lungs, prostate, and breasts. A meta-

analysis of studies, some previously unavailable to researchers, turned up evidence that non-aspirin NSAIDs can reduce the risk of developing squamous cell carcinoma by 15 percent, and that when aspirin is added to the mix, the risk drops to 18 percent. NSAIDs are known to inhibit COX-2, an enzyme produced by skin cells in response to ultraviolet light.

Talk to your dermatologist about aspirin, and otherwise limit your exposure to UV light to stay safe from skin cancer all year round.




The new Doyle Tower at Morton Plant Hospital, scheduled to be completed in 2016. Another example of how the community gave back.



# Keep the speed up when you walk

brisk walk is good for your health, especially as you grow older. A study reported on the LiveScience website found that older adults who maintain **L**a speed of 3 miles per hour when they walk have a 50 percent lower risk of heart disease than people with a pace of two miles per hour or slower. And folks who walk an average of seven blocks a day have a 47 percent lower chance of developing heart disease than those whose walks add up to just five blocks a day or less. So put your shoes on and get walking.


# Help your brain stay healthy

eeding and stimulating your brain well can keep it healthy throughout your life. The American Academy of Family Physicians offers these tips for keeping your mind in tiptop shape:

- Eat a healthy diet. Choose nutritious foods like antioxidant-rich vegetables, fruits, and whole grains, and omega-3 fatty acids, and cut out saturated fats. Avoid fad diets that offer only short-term results.
- Watch your weight. Maintain a healthy weight and pay attention to your blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood sugar, which are all associated with an increased risk of dementia.
- Exercise your brain. Keep learning new things all the time. Puzzles and games that stretch your mind can help you maintain good brain health. So can staying active socially, so keep up your friendships and strive to meet new people.

# Mission to gravity: Space probe searches for waves

European space probe will try to confirm a theory about gravity developed by Albert Einstein, according to the Reuters website. Launched late last year, the LISA (Laser Interferometer Space Antenna) Pathfinder will assume an orbit between the Earth and our sun, collecting data about gravity waves.



Einstein predicted the existence of ripples of gravity that bend space and time some 100 years ago, but finding those ripples on Earth has been impossible. The space-based experiment will monitor two cubes of a goldplatinum alloy to determine whether they maintain their distance from each other in free fall. The results will allow scientists to observe minute oscillations caused by gravity waves.

# Time behind the wheel

riving is embedded in our national psyche. If you feel as though you live in your car driving between home and work, consider these statistics from the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety and the Urban Institute:

• Americans drive an average of 29.2 miles a day, for a total of 10,658 miles a year.



- Women tend to take more drives, but men spend more time on the road, driving 25 percent more miles than women.
- Drivers 30-49 years old drive an average of 13,140 miles a year. Teens and senior citizens over 65 drive less than other age groups.
- We drive more in the summer—30.6 miles a day, as opposed to the winter months, when we're on the road for just 25.7 miles daily.
- Education seems to be correlated to how much people drive: Those with no more than a high school education drive an average of 19.9 miles a day (32 minutes), while drivers with a college degree are in their cars for 37.2 miles (58 minutes).

# Library use on the decline?

re libraries in danger of disappearing? A Pew Research Institute report found that most Americans strongly support their local public libraries, with 65 percent saying that the closing of a local library would have a major impact on their community. They like library services that contribute to education, along with those that help veterans, immigrants, and other special constituencies, and value access to computers and other technologies.

Still, library use appears to be trending downward: Forty-six percent of Americans age 16 and older have visited a library or bookmobile at least once during the past year, down from 53 percent in 2012. Twenty-two percent have used their library's website in the past year, down from 25 percent in 2012, and 27 percent have gone to the library to use computers and Internet resources, down again from 31 percent in 2012.





# Take the perfect family portrait

Portraits of your children as they grow up can become a treasured memory, but getting them taken can sometimes be a struggle. If you're determined to take just the right picture, try these for tips for portrait photography without tears:



- Take the picture early. A photo session first thing in the morning is easier on everyone. You can dress your kids appropriately and let them change into "play clothes" afterward instead of forcing them to get cleaned up and changed later in the day, when they're more apt to be tired and cranky.
- Have some variety. If you have more than one child, restrain the urge to dress them in matching outfits. A more picturesque option: Dress them in different outfits of the same color.
- Don't overdo things. Keep clothes and accessories simple. Remember that your focus should be on the child's face.
- Plan ahead of time. Get your child a haircut a few days before the portrait session, not that morning. If the cut turns out to be too short or severe, time will relax the look.
- Smile! Try to avoid a forced, insincere smile on your subject's face. Relax and let your child's personality shine through.
