WEED PROGRAM

s most of you are aware, we have a problem with the growth of weeds during the summer months, typically May through September. The weed problem we are concerned about is in the planter boxes and the front of the homes. Even those home5 that have mulch or stones in the planter boxes will have weed growth.

The board does send "friendly reminders" to alert residents as stated in rule #16..."Each shareholder is responsible for the neat and orderly appearance of his or her premises at all times. However, the general response to the friendly reminders has been less than satisfactory.

We would like to aid in solving this problem by having our maintenance staff spray weed killer in the planter boxes or in front of the home for any resident that desires to participate.

There will be a \$40.00 per year fee to cover the cost of the material for spraying from May through September. If you wish to participate in this program, send a check or pay cash to Jane in the office. If you choose to participate in this program, our maintenance staff will spray, beginning in May and ending in September. However, if you have ornamental plants that could be harmed by the spraying, you will have to make other arrangements, since we will not be responsible for any damages. If you choose not to participate, the weed issue for planters and the front of your home will continue to be your responsibility, and be subject to the terms of rule #16 concerning work done in your absence.

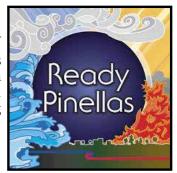


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NEW ANDROID MOBILE PHONE APP !

Pinellas County Emergency Management's Ready Pinellas application is a mobile disaster preparedness and decision support application designed to assist Pinellas County citizens in planning ahead, or when tropical storms approach our area, providing an outline of steps and recommendations and current information.



Ready Pinellas App Features:

Know Your Zone: When a tropical storm approaches it's critical for residents to know their Evacuation Zone. It's best to find out your zone before hurricane season so you can access your risk and make plans. As a user, you can enter your address and determine your evacuation level, the closest hotel accommodations, the closest general or special needs shelter. Note: not all shelter and hotel accommodations will be available in all storm levels. Check back with this feature when a storm is approaching.

Readiness Checklist: The Readiness Checklist is a tool to provide users an easy guide for preparedness ahead of hurricane season. There is a Blue Sky Readiness Checklist for pre-storm preparations, and as a tropical storm approaches and Pinellas County is placed in the 5-day or 3-day cone as indicated by the National Hurricane Center, the app will present the 5-day Readiness Checklist and then the 3-day Readiness Checklist.

Get a Plan: This feature helps citizens, businesses and special needs citizens create an emergency preparedness plan. Users can enter information about the location of their homes and businesses, family members, pets and family contact information and an individualized emergency plan will be developed that users are able to print or maintain online.

Alert Pinellas: The most important step you can take to be prepared is to know when a hazard is coming. The Alert Pinellas emergency notification service allows Pinellas County to send urgent messages by voice to landlines and mobile devices, text, TDD and via email. Registration is free, and users can register each address where they live and work to get alerts for multiple locations.

Storm Surge Protector: This interactive tool depicts the impact that different levels of storm surge flooding would have on a neighborhood, home or business. Users can type in their address and see a representative graphic illustration of their structure type with a depiction of the projected height of storm surge for the different evacuation levels. It also displays the specific evacuation level for the address and the amount of storm surge predicted for that evacuation level in a neighborhood view.

Special Needs: Pinellas County's special needs program is intended for those who need transportation or require minimal medical assistance while seeking public shelter. Registration for a special needs shelter is required and this feature allows users to register.



Pet Preparedness: Get information on sheltering your pet, and a list of supplies needed to weather the storm. Find out information on pet collection or information about locating stray animals following a hazard event. There are also pet friendly shelters and pet coordination for special needs citizens. A link brings you to registration forms.

Social Media: Follow Pinellas County on social media for general county information, breaking news, preparedness tips and real-time updates.

All Hazards Preparedness Guide: Download a PDF version of Pinellas County's All-Hazard Guide, with information on how to prepare for and respond to hurricanes, tornadoes, flooding, lightning and manmade disasters.

National Hurricane Center: Connect to the official source for worldwide tropical predictions, weather, water and climate data, and analyses of hazardous tropical weather. Find translations and podcasts.

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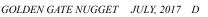

DUKE ENERGY. Below is a summary of our meeting with 4 representatives on Friday, June 9th regard posts (commonly called meter pedestal)... elow is a summary of our meeting with 4 Duke Energy representatives on Friday, June 9th regarding our meter

Don, Dennis, Jim, and Mike -

Thank you for meeting with us on Friday to discuss your questions about Duke Energy facilities at Golden Gate Mobile Home Park (MHP) Community. It was nice meeting you all!

Here are a few highlights we captured from the meeting. Who is responsible for the electrical equipment on-site?

- Duke installs, owns, and maintains all distribution equipment on the line side of the meter can. This includes, but is not limited to, distribution poles, transformers, primary wire, secondary wire, and service wire.
- The customer installs, owns, and maintains the meter post (commonly called meter pedestal), the meter can, and all wire on the load (home) side of the meter. Duke owns the meter itself
- The secondary underground cable for the Commercial accounts within the MHP is the responsibility of the MHP as well (i.e. – MHP sewer lift station, MHP community center, etc.)

Who is responsible for replacement of the Zinsco meter cans/posts?

- Duke Energy owns the meter itself, but not the meter can or meter post.
- If the inspecting authority requires you to replace the meter can or meter post, Duke Energy representatives will gladly come out and disconnect the service for you in order to make the replacement, and then reconnect the service for you when you are done.
- If we cannot work inside these meter cans for safety reasons, this may require an outage for more than just the customer requesting the work.
- If our facilities (service or secondary) need to be relocated in order to accommodate that request, then we do have to pass the cost of the relocation along to the person requesting the relocation. Duke will still own and maintain everything on the line side of the meter for the MHP residential accounts, regardless of who covers the installation cost.
- 1. Why did my neighbor pay less for his new service than I did?

The cost of new facilities varies based on a number of variables (new load, distance, specifications, etc.) Duke Energy Engineering representatives will gladly come out to evaluate each customer request independently and on a case-by-case basis.

- How can the Association direct new residents prior to moving into the community? 2. There are several ways to ensure a smooth transition:
- If the customer does not need a new service installed and wishes to use the existing meter and meter can, please make sure they set up the account as quickly as possible.
- The customer can call 1-800-700-8744, and provide the move-in date to the Customer Care Center representative.
- We would advise the customer to emphasize to the Customer Care Center representative that the meter does not need to be pulled, in case the previous owner instructed us otherwise.
- If the customer does need a new service installed, or if a new home is to be pulled into the ...continued on page 22

lot that is larger than the previous home, please also call Duke Energy at 1-800-700-8744.

- Let the Customer Care Center representative know that you need a new service.
- The Customer Care Center representative will create a Work Request and forward it to Engineering.
- The Engineering Department will ask for load information, and the Designer will need 2-3 weeks to determine whether line work is required.
- If no new line work is required, then we can set the meter as soon as your inspecting authority notifies us that the electrical inspection passed. Overhead service drops from a pole to a meter post are usually the only instances when line work is not required on a new service.
- If new line work is required, please allow an additional 4-8 weeks, depending on the extent of the line work.
- In order to speed up the installation of underground service, the customer can choose to dig the trench for the new underground service cable. This will also reduce the cost for the underground service.
- In all cases, starting with calling the Customer Care Center representative (1-800-700-8744) is best. The calls are monitored and tracked to ensure a quick response, and we can prevent delays by having the account information entered from the start of the project.

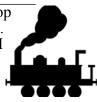

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Artificial intelligence is coming

rtificial intelligence sounds scary in science fiction stories and movies, but it's becoming a big factor in business success, according to a report from Tata Consultancy Services. Its survey of 834 executives across 13 global industry sectors found that 84 percent of organizations see AI as essential, and 50 percent believe it will transform their businesses.

AI doesn't appear to be cheap, though. Seven percent of business survey said they invested more than \$250 million on AI in 2016, and 2 percent expect to spend a billion dollars by the year 2020.

Energy drink and vodka? Think again

Red Bull or Monster Energy are all the rage, and so is mixing them with alcohol for a more potent cocktail, especially among young people. But is it safe? In research reported on the WebMD website, the answer looks like "no."

Canadian researchers analyzed 13 studies involving alcohol mixed with highly caffeinated energy drinks. They found a higher rate of injury among people indulging in such cocktails compared with simply drinking alcohol by itself. Injuries included car accidents, falls, violence, and suicidal behavior.

The authors point out that the stimulant effects of energy-drink caffeine can mask the impact of alcohol, even though alcohol still has an impairing effect on the body and the brain.

Watch your waist in your 40s to avoid dementia later

arrying belly weight during the 40s appears to increase the risk for dementia in the 70s, whereas carrying extra midsection weight later in life isn't as accurate an indicator. Researchers say these findings are disturbing because 50 percent of adults in the United States are considered abdominally obese.

Researchers at Kaiser Permanente studied 6,583 people who were between the ages of 40 and 45. An average of 36 years later, 16 percent of the participants— who had been measured for abdominal density—were diagnosed with dementia. Abdominal obesity increased the risk of dementia regardless of whether people had normal overall weight or were overweight or obese overall—and regardless of the health conditions including diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and stroke.

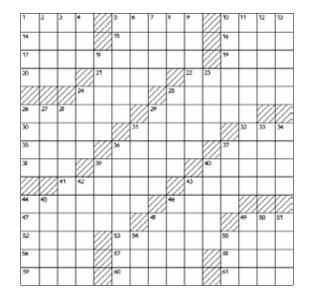
