Get to the root of problems

When you can't solve a seemingly impossible problem, do you just throw your hands high in frustration and walk away? Most of the time that's not an option. Try reframing the problem with these suggestions from Tina Seeling, author of Inside Out: Get Ideas Out of Your Head and Into the World (HarperOne):

- **Revise your question.** Turn the problem around by re-examining your real goal. Instead of "What new product will make lots of money?" ask, "What do our customers buy, and what do they avoid?" or "How can we offer more of what already works?"
- Look for bad ideas. You can unleash your creativity by flipping the process. Try to identify what doesn't work, what's failed in the past, or what would completely capsize any solution. You may be able to adapt a seemingly impractical solution, or eliminate a factor that's holding you back.
- Question your assumptions. Many of us fall into the trap of assuming that the answer we're seeking will look like solutions that have always worked. Take a close look at the problem, your organization, or your industry and identify practices that have never been questioned. Ask, "Why are we doing it this way?" You'll often find a new approach by going against the conventional wisdom.

Play these roles when developing ideas



Thinking creatively requires different mindsets at different stages of your project. If you can shift gears yourself, do that; if not, bring in a colleague to help you sort through the issues. Focus on these key roles as spelled out by Walt Disney:

- **Dreamer.** Don't limit your vision at the outset. Let your mind roam widely as you explore concepts, ideas, and solutions. You don't have to be practical at this stage—just allow yourself to daydream as you think about what you want to achieve.
- **Realist.** Once you've got a plan or idea you want to put to work, start narrowing it down until it's doable. You may end up eliminating the less practical aspects, but if you keep your mind on the core idea, you'll come up with a plan that satisfies your goal while succeeding in the real world.
- **Critic.** Poke holes in your plan so you can patch them up effectively. Run a test or set up a pilot program before rolling your solution out completely. Don't think of obstacles as failures; use what you learn to make your idea viable.

Giant lizards once roamed Australia

ovies like *One Million Years B.C.* show humans battling dinosaurs, but T. Rex and other prehistoric creatures died out long before Raquel Welch's ancestors designed the first fur bikini. Still, recent discoveries suggest that prehistoric could have fought large reptiles, or at least co-existed with them at one time.

Scientists from the University of Queensland have dug up a small bone that they have determined could have come from a gigantic lizard that lived in Australia as recently as 50,000 years ago.

As reported on the eScience News website, the bone is only 1 centimeter long, but scientists are certain that it belonged to a huge creature that may be related to the Komodo Dragon or another species known as Megalania Prisca. Megalina once roamed eastern Australia, and reached a length of 11 to 16 feet. Its sharp, curved teeth would have been a ferocious challenge for early humans in the territory, but so far no evidence of any terrifying encounters have been unearthed.



How much do you know about science?

Where rely on science and technology for many of the necessities and conveniences of modern life, but how well does the average U.S. citizen really understand science? - Comets comprise a core of ice and a tail of gases: 78 percent.
- Tides are created by the moon's gravity: 76 percent.
- The polio vaccine was developed by Dr. Jonas Salk: 74 percent.
- Astrology is different from astronomy: 73 percent.
- Cell phones use radio waves: 72 percent.
- A light-year is a measure of distance: 72 percent.
- Amplitude (height) determines the loudness of sound: 35 percent.
- Water boils at a lower temperature in Denver than in Los Angeles: 34 percent.

Never too late to succeed

poor boy named Harlan with only a sixth-grade education wouldn't have made anyone's list of the most likely to succeed. His first major success came when at the age of 39, when he was able to come up with the financing to open a small-town gas station and restaurant. He did pretty well, too—but only for a while.

With the onset of World War II, Harlan's once-solid customer base left the small town to enlist in the military or take factory jobs in the city. Still, he managed to hold on until a new interstate highway eliminated his drive-by trade. Then, after nearly 30 years in business, Harlan was forced to sell his dream to pay off his debts.

Broke and nearing 70, Harlan could have closed the curtain on his career ambitions. Instead, he took to the road, offering to share his pressure-cooking techniques with other restaurant owners if they'd agree to become his franchises. He sold only five in the first two



years, but he stuck it out.

Four years later the self-proclaimed Colonel Sanders had sold more than 600 Kentucky Fried Chicken franchises. And by the time Harlan Sanders died at age 90, KFC was a worldwide brand.

Is today's success holding you back?

Timanthes was a celebrated Greek artist of the 4th century B.C. As an aspiring young painter, Timanthes worked with a respected tutor to learn his craft. After several years, he produced what he believed was his masterpiece.

Delighted with his accomplishment, the young artist stopped striving to further his art. Instead, he devoted hours each day to gazing at his painting, mentally patting himself on the back for his achievement. Then one morning, when he arrived at the studio, he was horrified to find that someone had slathered paint across the canvas, destroying his work. The tutor eventually confessed that he'd done the deed.

"I did it for your own good," he explained. "The painting was holding you back." He urged the artist to try again: "See if you can do better."

Timanthes took his teacher's advice. His next effort, "The Sacrifice of Iphigenia," became his signature work and is regarded as one of the finest paintings of its time.
