




Vakesh Rajani, M.D.

This story about our own Harry Lester is posted in the Quad-Cities Online 9/29/2014. Former Moline wrestling coach Harry Lester will be inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame Illinois chapter on Oct. 19. Lester coached the Maroons from 1975-1985, leading the program to the 1980 Class AA third-place trophy.

Lester brought fun, innovation to the Moline wrestling program

arty Mahieu knew the gesture was done without fanfare, but what Harry Lester did more than 30 years ago is a memory he cannot forget.

Whenever one of his wrestlers would need shoes or equipment, Lester, the former Moline coach, would find a way to provide whatever the wrestler needed. Mahieu, who wrestled four years under Lester before graduating in 1980, remembers the gear would be slightly used or brand new.

Lester would get the equipment and pay for it with his own money.

"He would never bring attention to it," Mahieu said. "That was something."

Being there for his wrestlers meant something to Lester.

"I had so much fun with the kids," Lester said. "My memories are terrific."

The impact he had on them resonates, even 29 years after he retired.

One of his endearing qualities was introducing water skiing to his wrestlers. Lester, who will be inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame Illinois chapter next month, owned a boat and often would take his team on the water during the summer.

Workouts and expectations provided challenges, but he also knew laid-back moments should be involved.

"He was a guy," 1977 Moline grad Todd Rosenthal said, "who was fun to be around."

In a sport that requires mental and physical toughness, Lester knew what it took to be there for his kids. There were serious, light-hearted and compassionate times. Blending all that created an atmosphere that left an impression.

The stories and memories about him are fresh decades later.

"He had a great sense of humor," said Kevin Puebla, who won the 1975 Class AA 126-pound state title as a senior. "But he also always had the room open. He put in the time to make us better."

Lester's lasting legacy in the program is introducing Greco-Roman wrestling to his kids.

Called "the godfather of Greco in Illinois" by Rosenthal, Lester said former Rock Island coach Bill Smith introduced him to the style. Learning more about Greco got him fascinated by it, taking him to clinics and tournaments all over the world.

Once he became the Moline head coach prior to the 1974 season, Lester taught the technique to his wrestlers. He believed Greco gave the Maroons an upper-body weapon since wrestlers are not allowed to use their legs in the style.

Using the under-hook move that was unfamiliar at the time helped Moline crown several Greco national champions and produce two individual state champions under Lester.



"You can show them these tricks that the great competitors use," Lester said. "If they could learn that, their talents would come out to the fullest."

The results reaffirmed Lester knew what he was talking about.

"There was a reason why so many of us did well," Mahieu said. "We would go to (Greco) tournaments and mop up because of his technique and knowledge."

Under Lester, the Maroons wrestled in year-round tournaments and started weight training. Both were new ideas at the time, but have developed into the norm. The nearly full-time commitment was viewed with excitement, not reluctance.

What he created was the foundation for a strong program. In his 12 seasons, the Maroons won four Western Big 6 Conference titles and had seven individual state medalists. Puebla won a state title in Lester's first year and Poppy Guererro captured the 1980 Class AA 132-pound championship.

Moline also finished third in the 1980 Class AA state tournament, 4.5 points behind firstplace Addison Trail. That remains the Maroons' last traditional state tournament trophy after the IHSA changed to a dual-team format in 1983.

"Wrestling for him, I felt very confident. I felt I was prepared," Puebla said. "He expected us to do well."

In return for the work, Lester was there as more than a coach. That sparked a lasting relationship with his wrestlers.

"I tell you what, Harry made the wrestling room fun and entertaining," Mahieu said. "He always had a joke or story to help us get through practices. ... It was a great honor to wrestle for him."

Meet Harry Lester

Harry Lester is a 1954 Rock Island graduate and was the Moline wrestling coach from 1974-1985. He is one of three coaches in program history to have two individual state champions. Lester guided the Maroons to a third-place finish in the 1980 Class AA state tournament.

After retiring as a Moline physical education teacher and head coach in 1985, he moved to Dunedin, Fla., where he still resides. Lester is a 1992 inductee into the Illinois Wrestling Coaches and Officials Association Hall of Fame.

- 4. Bake, uncovered, as 350 degrees for 30-40 minutes or until heated through.
