



orkshop on "How to Protect Yourself From Identity Theft" presented by the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office and your Neighborhood Watch Association.

Identity Theft is a serious crime. Identity Theft happens when someone steals your personal information and uses it without your permission.

Identity Theft can disrupt your finances, credit rating, and reputation.

At the very least, it takes time, patience, and lots of money to recover from your identity being stolen.

Some victims of Identity Theft never fully recover. Recall the horror stories of victims homes being stolen, victims who were financially wiped out being left for broke.

Most frauds originate from offshore e.g. the Middle East, China, Jamaica, etc.

Due to international boundaries, foreign country regulations, and local customs, the majority of fraud investigations do not result in any recovery for the victim.

Fraud is a preventable crime if you are aware.

Your Neighborhood Watch Program can only be as strong and effective as its membership . In the first nine months of operation, membership has grown to about 150 residents representing about half the homes in the Park.

The goal is for every resident to be a member of the "Watch".

Membership does not cost anything, BUT, it could save you a lot.

Learn the ABCs of skin cancer

hat dark spot on your skin may be a freckle—or it may be skin cancer. How can you tell? The American Academy of Dermatology takes an alphabetical approach to identifying potentially dangerous skin conditions:

- A: Asymmetry. Is the spot or mole generally circular, or does one side look different from the other?
- **B:** Border. Is the edge of the item uneven, notched, or blurry? ٠
- C: Color. Does the object vary in color in different areas?
- **D: Diameter.** Is the area larger than a pencil eraser?
- **E:** Evolving. Has the object changed its size, shape, or color?

Contact a dermatologist if you answer "yes" to any of these questions.

Just a rash? Check it out



Never too late to succeed

poor boy named Harlan with only a sixth-grade education wouldn't have made anyone's list of the most likely to succeed. His first major success came when at the age of 39, when he was able to come up with the financing to open a small-town gas station and restaurant. He did pretty well, too—but only for a while.

With the onset of World War II, Harlan's once-solid customer base left the small town to enlist in the military or take factory jobs in the city. Still, he managed to hold on until a new interstate highway eliminated his drive-by trade. Then, after nearly 30 years in business, Harlan was forced to sell his dream to pay off his debts.

Broke and nearing 70, Harlan could have closed the curtain on his career ambitions. Instead, he took to the road, offering to share his pressure-cooking techniques with other restaurant owners if they'd agree to become his franchises. He sold only five in the first two



years, but he stuck it out.

Four years later the self-proclaimed Colonel Sanders had sold more than 600 Kentucky Fried Chicken franchises. And by the time Harlan Sanders died at age 90, KFC was a worldwide brand.

Is today's success holding you back?

imanthes was a celebrated Greek artist of the 4th century B.C. As an aspiring young painter, Timanthes worked with a respected tutor to learn his craft. After several years, he produced what he believed was his masterpiece.

Delighted with his accomplishment, the young artist stopped striving to further his art. Instead, he devoted hours each day to gazing at his painting, mentally patting himself on the back for his achievement. Then one morning, when he arrived at the studio, he was horrified to find that someone had slathered paint across the canvas, destroying his work. The tutor eventually confessed that he'd done the deed.

"I did it for your own good," he explained. "The painting was holding you back." He urged the artist to try again: "See if you can do better."

Timanthes took his teacher's advice. His next effort, "The Sacrifice of Iphigenia," became his signature work and is regarded as one of the finest paintings of its time.
