Spotlight on Residents – Gerry Fisk

erry was born in Detroit, Michigan and graduated high school and attended Wayne State College where he was studying to become a teacher. He was a printer in Detroit for 8 years and also tended bar.

His parents moved here because of the brutal northern winters. Gerry came here to visit them one winter and returned to find Detroit with 12 inches of snow, so it didn't take him long to make up his mind to move here to warm sunny Clearwater, Florida in 1972.

Gerry studied nursing and became a CNA which kept him busy for quite some time. He married young, but only for a couple years, and they never had any children. He worked part- time for the City of Clearwater

Police Department from 1987-1990 and worked on Clearwater Beach, guarding the boat marinas and in traffic control. He also rode with police on their beats. He spent 8 years at Sam's Club doing various demonstrations. Gerry was employed by the Florida State Lottery from 1987 to 2001 traveling the area between Clearwater and Dade City. He delivered the lottery tickets and repaired the lottery machines.

Gerry is retired, but does a lot of volunteer work as he likes to help other people any way he can. He has served soup at the St. Vincent de Paul soup kitchen and he has helped at the Humane Society. After his 16 year old German Shepherd died, Gerry took in a rescue dog named Marley who is part lab. You might see Gerry out walking with his cane and the dog on a leash. It looks like Marley is walking him though. Gerry buys ant killer and sprinkles along the dog walk area as he said it is infested with ants.

For sixteen years Gerry played Santa for the Clearwater Parks and Recreation Department riding the big float at the end of the parade. He is always willing to help out his neighbors and looks after some of their homes when they are away or starts up their automobiles if they are gone for extended periods of time.

A project which Gerry has gotten very involved in is Safe Haven, a homeless shelter next to the Pinellas County Jail on 49th Street which houses 450 people. Gerry collects clothing from anyone wanting to donate and he delivers it to the shelter. Once a month he makes about 25 sandwiches and takes downtown to the police department to distribute to homeless people. He said many people come and contribute for this cause.

Gerry moved into our park in 2001 and has owned 3 homes here. Most of his family is deceased, except for two half- brothers, who still live in Detroit. For a long time, he was not active in the park, but when there was no one to set up the food and drinks for Bingo, Gerry volunteered to do that and cleans up afterward. Since he has done that, he now has a purpose in the park and has made many new friends. He loves the beauty of Island in the Sun Park.

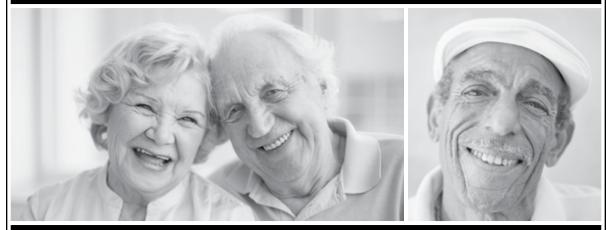
