t the end of Drew it curves to the left and just before the causeway there are a couple of parking lots. Small one at the water on the right and large on the left side of the road (Coachman Park). They are FREE!! Right there before the road curves again is the pier that the "Clearwater Ferry" sails from. This is an inexpensive and fast way to travel to Clearwater Beach area. Avoid the traffic jam on the causeway, avoid the over priced parking lots. You can take your cooler/chairs etc. Some people have the small pull alongs to handle their items. The cost is currently \$4.00 per person (one way). The ferry departs on the hour and return on the half hour. The time table is extending and it is best for people to call. It drops you off at the Marina near the bait house.

They only had three days that they would be in Washington and they asked the friend/priest if he could perform their marriage ceremony. # **Annual IITS Shuffleboard Tournament**



Consolation Team Winners were: Pete Henderson (who recently celebrated his 90th birthday) and Ross Duncan.







### Help break the mosquito cycle

Mosquitoes only need ½ to ½ inch of standing water for the larvae to survive. Some simple suggestions are to:

- Empty water from flower pots, garbage cans, recycling containers, and buckets any item that can hold water.
  - Flush birdbaths weekly.
- Flush ornamental bromeliads or treat with BTI, a biological larvicide available at home stores.
  - Clean roof gutters, which can become clogged and hold water.
  - Stock ornamental ponds with mosquito-eating fish.
  - Cover rain barrels with screening.
- Check for standing water under houses, near plumbing drains, under air conditioner drip areas, around septic tanks and heat pumps.
  - Take steps to eliminate standing water, improve drainage, and prevent future puddling.
- Protect your skin from mosquito bites when outdoors: wear mosquito repellent (products containing DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus) or long sleeves and pants.

By taking these simple preventative measures, we can help reduce the number of mosquitoes



in our neighborhood and minimize mosquito-borne diseases.

### Mosquito Myths - Among the many misconceptions:

- Bug zappers are effective against mosquitoes. Bug zappers do not control mosquitoes and can reduce the populations of beneficial insects.
  - Electronic repellers keep mosquitoes away. No, they don't; save your money.
- Residential vegetation can produce mosquitoes. They may be resting in the vegetation, but standing water is required to "produce" mosquitoes.
- Bats, owls and other birds can control mosquitoes. Although they may include mosquitoes in their diet, they do not consume enough mosquitoes to

make an appreciable difference in their populations.

- Some mosquitoes can be two inches long. They don't get that big. What you may have seen is a crane fly.
  - Mosquitoes nest in vegetation. Mosquitoes do not nest.


ontrary to what one cranky television doctor (House, M.D.) would like you to believe, lupus is a very real disease that hundreds of thousands of people deal with every day.

Lupus is an autoimmune disease in which the patient's immune system attacks healthy parts of his or her own body, resulting in inflammation, swelling, and pain, among other symptoms.

What can make lupus dangerous is when it attacks vital organs such as the heart, lungs, or liver. It is more likely to affect women than men, as well as people of non-European descent. However, if caught early, those affected by lupus have a good chance of living normal and healthy lives.

Symptoms of lupus include the following, and if it seems like many apply to yourself, you may want to visit your doctor:



- Joint and muscle pain. Arthritis is another common side effect of lupus. Almost three-fourths of all patients report joint and muscle pain to be the first sign that they have lupus. Look for arthritis in the wrists, small joints of the hands, elbows, knees, and ankles.
- Skin irritation. Many lupus patients wind up with skin rashes, especially on the face. Sores, flaky red spots, and scaly rashes are also possible, and can be located on the face, neck, back, hands, and arms.
- Chest pain. The disease can cause inflammation of the heart and the lungs, which can result in very strong chest pains that can put people at an increased risk of a heart attack or a stroke.




