Tell we can call it winter, and for us Floridians it is. I don't know about all of you but I get cold when it is 70 degrees. I know, it's kind of silly but true. So! Here is a recipe for good ole bean soup and don't forget to mix up your favorite corn bread recipe to sit alongside a steaming bowl. I used to soak my beans but not necessary with this recipe. Enjoy!

NAVY BEAN SOUP (MADE IN YOUR CROCKPOT)

(don't forget to use a crockpot liner, get them at Walmart near plastic storage bags)

- Add 1 # bag of navy beans, uncooked and washed
- 1 large or two small stalks of celery (chopped fine)
- 1 large carrot (chopped fine)
- 1/2 large sweet onion (chopped fine) keep the rest for putting on the table for anyone who wants more
- Add 6 cups of water (I put in five with one cup of chicken broth)
- Add cubed ham and a good ole ham bone if you have one
- 1 large bay leaf and some pepper to taste (don't forget to remove the bay leaf before serving, they are bitter)
- Stir it up and plug it in! Sit back and enjoy the smells of winter!
- Cook on high for 4-6 hours (test your beans after 4 hours) or low for 8 hours (test beans after 6)
