Spotlight on Residents – Dick Tilton

Dick Tilton is a soft spoken, big man, with a laid back demeanor.

He is very quiet until you get him going, and then he is full of laughter and stories

Dick was born and raised in a little town named Fulton, in upstate New York. Fulton lies between Rochester and Syracuse. While in high school, he drove a cab part time. He was very active in sports. He was on the football team until he and some of his friends got caught smoking, and the coach threw them off the team. Then he made the soccer team, but after being struck by a puck, he suffered a broken foot and that ended his soccer career. He also spent some time playing softball.



A lot of the boys in Fulton became friends with Dick as he is a quite likeable fellow. He referred to this group as a "gang", but not like the "gangs" of today. They were all Boy Scouts and just hung out together, but sometimes got into a bit of mischief, not to hurt anyone or anything, but just to have fun. His grandmother owned some acreage in Fulton and leased part of it to a man who raised cantaloupe. Dick and his buddies used to go into the field and steal some of the melons. A railroad had been built through town and right through the middle of his grandmother's property. The boys used to get up on a bridge and when the engine passed they would throw cantaloupes on the train. Often they were seen, but never caught. They also threw snowballs in the wintertime. This spot was up on a hill and you could see the town and the police station from that spot. They watched and laughed as the police made their way up the hill, but by the time they got there, all the boys had disappeared. Dick got quite a chuckle telling me about this.

After graduation, he joined the navy in 1941. The attack on Pearl Harbor was over so he felt this would be a good time to enlist. He was in Samson, New York for boot camp, then his group was sent by train to Philadelphia and then on to Rocky Mount, North Carolina. Upon arriving in North Carolina about 30-40 of the men saw a neon sign that said "Beer", so they went hustling over to the little dive to get some beer. Dick was smart enough not to follow them and

it's a good thing because the bus left without them and to this day, Dick does not know what happened to those guys left behind. Dick and the others went on to Miami and then Key West where they attended "sound school" where they learned about sonar. Dick chased submarines with a sonar machine while in the Navy.

Dick was an only child and his parents were in bad shape, so the Navy gave him an honorable discharge so he could go back to Fulton. His folks had a little cottage right on the lake so he did lots of fishing and swimming. Dick drove a bakery truck and Shirley, the girl he married, worked in a bakery for the same company. They did lots of roller skating growing up and later did lots of camping in an RV in New York, after their marriage. They married in 1950 and had two daughters and a son. Their son died quite young. Tragedy stuck again years later when their oldest daughter passed away in Oregon and her son's death followed. Dick's wife passed of a heart attack six years ago in 2009 after 59 years of marriage. His youngest daughter, Sherrie is married and is "head" of the Bay Care corporate office located on Drew behind the park. Her son works at Mease Countryside. Sherrie comes once or twice every week to visit Dick and check

t lot #249 lives a petite little blue eyed lady, with a bubbly personality, whose name is Shirley Fennell. She is a fascinating lady with many interests and stories to tell. I was enthralled talking to her about her life, family and interests.

Shirley was born and grew up in Vandergraft, PA. In 7th grade she met Dave, the boy whom she later married. They graduated high school and she attended Carnegie Institute of Technology with a degree in Home Economics. She went to work as a County Home Economist for Penn State in New Castle, PA. She married after she completed her education. Her husband got his Master's degree and taught elementary school many years.



Dave and Shirley had two daughters that kept Shirley busy, but after they got a bit older, she began substitute teaching part time while they were living in Grove City, PA. Later they moved to New Jersey as teacher's salaries were better there.. Shirley taught Home Economics to middle school girls and taught sewing classes at night school. Dave was quite a workaholic. He drove a school bus in the morning, taught school, drove the kids home after school and then drove part time in the evenings for a charter bus company. He became so fond of buses that he formed his own bus charter company and had 22 buses running 24/7. That lifestyle took its toll on him and after 41 years of marriage, while driving an empty bus, he steered the bus into a parking lot and succumbed to his death in 1997. Shirley continued the business for a couple years before closing it.


Larry Taylor, #257, our HOA president is still recovering from the fall he took when he tripped over a garden hose. Please take it easy Larry and get well soon.
