Hurricane Irma

handra and I, with a few other hardy, or foolish, souls, elected to stay here and weather out the fringes of Irma when it was headed for Miami. Irma headed for Naples and then we were under mandatory evacuation. We loaded our car on Friday and got out.

There was plenty of company, in fact, we retreated from Irma along Interstate 75 at about 10 mph while Irma pursued us at 16 mph. The storm was so large there was literally no place to go. Every hotel was booked, gasoline was scarce and fast food places were shut down all the way to Atlanta. In spite of emergency declarations by the governors of both Florida and Georgia, in spite of publicized arrests of hotel owners, every hotel that we stayed at, from Comfort Inns to Fairfield by Marriott, more than doubled their prices over their usual advertised rates.

News services told us there were 118,000 people in storm shelters in Florida, hardly a dent in the 5.8 million under mandatory evacuation. There is simply no way to evacuate 5.8 million people from a long narrow peninsula in a few days. We settled into Tifton, Georgia simply because we finally found a hotel room and the building looked strong enough to survive.

Other than the price gougers, people showed resilience and good will. Various churches handed out free food to evacuees. When the restaurants were closed, the people trapped in our hotel put together a pot luck, a surprisingly tasty event. We danced, we sang, we watched the weather reports. We worried.

Everyone had a dog, a cat or, in one case, a pig. One lady brought six fish. Scupper did not know what to make of the pig, and the pig, Petunia, had no use for any dog.

The eye of the storm passed over Tifton on Monday. On Tuesday we got reports that power was restored to IITS. The four-hour return trip took us nine and a half hours, of which three hours were spent in a miles-long line before the only open gas station.

On the way out and especially on the way back we saw huge convoys of utility service vehicles, mostly bucket trucks and cranes. There are reciprocal agreements among the electrical providers all across the USA for such services. However, we were incredulous that hundreds of those same badly needed utility vehicles were lined up for miles in front of a Florida agricultural inspection station. Whose bright idea was that?

It was dark when we got back. Our house was intact! A flashlight inspection showed zero damage!

It's several days later and we're still cleaning up tree and shrubbery litter.

Our 1st hurricane in Florida

where the few days after Labor Day as Irma headed towards the U.S. She made landfall on several islands in her path, wreaking havoc and destruction, leaving many people homeless, and businesses destroyed.

As the path started shifting more towards Florida around the 6th, it started looking more and more like we were going to have a hurricane in our state, and quite possibly in the Tampa Bay area. We saw it hit Key West, as those locations started evacuating north. Then we got the evacuation orders for Zone A in Pinellas County

We initially made the decision to evacuate on Thursday to Huntsville, AL where my sister lives, but the logistics of getting us, two dogs and a cat ready to make a 10 hour+++ trip was overwhelming. Even though we had received evacuation orders, it wasn't quite 'real'. So, I worked from home on Friday, where we stayed glued to the TV. Again, we had the discussion about evacuating to Huntsville. In the meantime, family and friends from afar were 'encouraging' us to leave. Our daughter in fact threatened to drive to FL and forcibly remove us if needed, LOL. However, you guessed it, still not 'real'.

Then on Saturday morning, IRMA made the turn that put her in the possible direct path of Tampa Bay. It got real, real quick. So, you guessed it, we had yet another discussion about evacuating. In the meantime, in our community, there were several different scenarios – some had already evacuated to family/friends or hotels out of state, some were evacuating to a safe zone locally, and some were going to 'ride it out'

After talking with several of our neighbors and friends in the community, we made the decision to stay in Largo with friends of ours. The deciding factor for us was that while we did not feel safe staying in our home, we did not want to go so far away that we could not quickly get back to see how everything fared after the storm.

We headed to Largo on Saturday am, so Jim could help our friends board up their windows. They needed some supplies, so we headed back over to Clearwater. As we passed by the Lowe's on Ulmerton Rd, we could see that the parking lot was completely full. The Lowe's in Clearwater mall was much the same – shelves bare, and the line by the lumber door snaked all the way to the back of the store and around the corner. It had obviously gotten 'real' for lots of other people also.

Saturday afternoon, we headed back to Largo with our menagerie in tow – Betsy, Lacey, and Mia our cat. They had three people at their house, plus three dogs! We put Mia in a crate with her food/water and a litter box, in the office where no one else was. Luckily all the dogs got along (except for Rudy, their chihuahua, who insisted on letting everyone know he was the boss)! It seemed like a normal weekend evening at that point.

We got up on Sunday and finished the last-minute hurricane preparations – realizing that IRMA was headed pretty much right towards Tampa Bay. Like everyone else who chose to stay in the area, we were constantly texting, posting on FB, etc., that we were ok. Pretty normal on Sunday most of the day – no extreme winds, just a few gusts and light but steady rain. Anxiously watching the TV to see what was going to happen next . . .

Watching the devastation in other areas was hard, but we kept hoping that we would be spared. Then late on Sunday evening, (before the electricity went out), IRMA shifted again, and we had hope that we would endure a Category 1 hurricane, rather than the Category 3 or 4 that we had been anticipating. When the electricity went out, we sat around for a bit, then decided there was nothing we could do, so went to bed. Surprisingly enough, we did get a fair amount of sleep in between the wind gusts.

Monday morning was very stressful – at that point we didn't know how our homes had fared. As soon as the restriction was lifted, we headed home to check on the situation. I'm sure all of you felt the same relief we did when we discovered that for the most part there was no major damage to our homes. Some broken branches, a few pieces of siding, downspouts, few shingles, etc. – all fixable! Those who had evacuated out of state, or who were part time residents were anxious about the condition of the park and their houses. Our FB pages were lit up with posts. Jamie Brogley did an awesome job of taking pictures and posting them to relieve anxiety, as did several other residents.

Many residents (including us) returned to their homes on Monday, despite the fact we had no electricity. Fortunately, the day was cooler than normal, so it was not unbearable. It was good to sleep in our own bed! I woke up Tuesday morning to the happy news that electricity had been restored in our community.

I've learned a few things from this:

- Keep your important papers where you can get to them quickly especially if you don't have them electronically
- Make a plan for what you want to take with you in case of an evacuation heirlooms, jewelry, etc.
- It's just 'stuff' almost everything these days is stored electronically, so having the paper isn't as important
- Our pets are very important to us saw many posts as to why someone would put themselves in danger because of a dog/cat/bird, whatever. My opinion is that those people have never had a pet that they loved. We never considered leaving without our pets. Mia was quite stressed over being displaced, but at least she survived the hurricane.
- IITS is a great community, with neighbors who care about each other.

I am personally hoping that we will not have to experience anything like this again, but we do live in Florida – so we get the really, really good with the occasional bad.


