

LEMONGRASS

How to store:

Store lemongrass loosely wrapped in the fridge for up to several weeks. Or, wrap it well and freeze it. If you're going to freeze it, consider chopping or mincing it and then freezing it in 1-tablespoon bits (an ice cube tray is useful for this—freeze until hard and then transfer to a sealable plastic bag for longer-term storage), so it's ready to use and you can simply throw it into marinades, dressings, and stir-frysright from the freezer.

How to cook with lemongrass:

Lemongrass is most often used in 1- to 2-inch pieces in soups, stews, and teas. Just add the trimmed pieces of lemongrass stalk and leave them in the soup or stew until it imparts as much flavor as you want. Be kind to your diners and remove the pieces before serving since they tend to be woody and don't make for the best eating.

Lemongrass can also be minced and added to stir-frys or rubs for grilled or roasted meats or seafood. Use only the bottom few inches for mincing and remove the tough, woody outer layer of the stalk, since that it the most tender part of the lemongrass stalk and will keep your dish from having woody-seeming bits in it. You'll also need to truly mince it into teeny tiny pieces because even that more tender core can be quite fibrous.

Whichever way you use it, know that the longer you cook lemongrass the more intense its flavor becomes. For a flavor that is as light and delicate as its scent, add lemongrass towards the end of cooking

Health benefits:

When used medicinally, lemongrass may be taken by mouth, rubbed on the skin, or inhaled as an aromatherapy treatment.

Taken orally, lemongrass is often used to calm stomach discomfort and other gastrointestinal issues including cramps and vomiting. Lemongrass may also be consumed to treat:

- Hyperttension
- Epilepsy
- Musculoskeletal pain
- Cough
- Rheumatism
- Fever

- Common coldDiabetes
 - Sleeplessness
 - Anxiety
 - Cancer prevention

Applied to the skin, lemongrass or lemongrass oil is used to treat a headache and musculoskeletal pain. As an aromatherapy treatment, lemongrass oil extract may be inhaled to treat muscle pain, infections, cold, or flu symptoms.





Captain Rickenbacker and his crew floated for days on the rough waters of the Pacific. They fought the sun. They fought sharks. Most of all, they fought hunger. By the eighth day their rations ran out. No food. No water. They were hundreds of miles from land and no one knew where they were.

They needed a miracle. That afternoon they had a simple devotional service and prayed for a miracle. They tried to nap. Eddie leaned back and pulled his military cap over his nose. Time dragged. All he could hear was the slap of the waves against the raft.

Suddenly, Eddie felt something land on the top of his cap. It was a seagull!

Old Ed would later describe how he sat perfectly still, planning his next move. With a flash of his hand and a squawk from the gull, he managed to grab it and wring its neck.. He tore the feathers off, and he and his starving crew made a meal - a very slight meal for eight men - of it. Then they used the intestines for bait.. With it, they caught fish, which gave them food and more bait...and the cycle continued. With that simple survival technique, they were able to endure the rigors of the sea until they were found and rescued after 24 days at sea.



Cave drawing of bull is earliest of its kind

rcheologists have discovered the oldest known drawing of an animal on the wall of a cave in Indonesia, according to the U.S. News & World Report website. It's some 40,000 years old, about five feet wide, and it depicts a bull-like creature in a red silhouette.

Along with similar drawings on cave walls in Borneo, the drawing sparks renewed debate about the role of art in ancient times. Similar cave paintings have been found in France and Spain, though they're just 33,500 to 37,000 years old.

Cave dwellers began sketching humans engaged in hunting activities and dancing some 14,000 years ago in both Europe and Asia. The findings raise the possibility that humans migrated from Africa to Europe and then Asia, bringing their artistic sensibilities with them.

Invasion of the space worms

ong-term space travel poses many challenges, but one of the most daunting is the loss of muscle mass in a zero-gravity environment. On a voyage to Mars, for example, space travelers could arrive on the red planet too weak to stand. Now, reports the Popular Science website, thousands of worms headed to the International Space Station (ISS) may help solve the problem.

Scientists plan to study muscle atrophy in the worms and then treat them with a special brand of RNA designed to stop the breakdown of protein and preserve the muscles in their bodies. If all goes according to plan, this could alleviate one danger to astronauts remaining in space for long periods of time.

Science is simply common sense at its best, that is, rigidly accurate in observation, and merciless to fallacy in logic.
