



Homo sapiens made it to Europe earlier, scientists say

odern humans may have reached Europe thousands of years earlier than previously thought, according to the *U.S. News & World Report* website. Fragments of bones and teeth found in a Bulgarian cave, identified as belonging to homo sapiens,

have been dated to 46,000 years ago. Before this, the earliest European bone fragments, found in Romania, were dated to 40,000 years ago. Those bones had Neanderthal DNA in them, indicating that interbreeding had occurred some 200 years before.

Scientists believe that homo sapiens migrated from Africa about 47,000 years ago, during a brief global warming period. Thus, for about 7,000 years or so, humans and Neanderthals lived on the same continent and interacted at least somewhat. The first humans to reach the Danube Valley in Europe probably numbered only a few hundred people and likely never made their way west past the Alps before dying off. Modern Europeans probably descended from a second wave of migration from Africa

Ancient footprints point to ancient lives

Scientists have discovered more than 400 ancient footprints in hardened volcanic sediment in east Africa. As the Science News website reports, the footprints may provide a look into the social of lives of hunter-gatherers who lived some 10,000–12,000 years ago in the region.







The footprints were found in northern Tanzania and are the largest collection of ancient human footprints ever found in Africa. One set of tracks was made by a group of 17 people walking southwest—14 women, two men and one young boy. Researchers speculate that the women were foraging for food as the males visited them. Some present-day hunter-gatherers form largely female food-gathering groups, scientists say. It's unknown whether they were gathering plants or hunting prey.

Another set of footprints show six tracks heading northeast. Instead of people traveling in a group, they were probably one man and two women walking slowly together, a woman and a man walking briskly, and another woman running—presumably at different times.

Moon rocks created by high impact

giant meteor may have wiped out the dinosaurs on Earth, but another one may have formed the crust of the moon.








"Rocks on Earth are constantly being recycled, but the moon doesn't exhibit plate tectonics or volcanism, allowing older rocks to be preserved," says one scientist. "By studying the moon, we can better understand the earliest history of our planet. If large, super-heated impacts were creating rocks on the moon, the same process was probably happening here on Earth."
