



MY HEP-C ADVENTURE - PART 1

They are finally talking about Hepatitis-C on TV. For a long time you never heard anything about it. I think, at first, they didn't seem to distinguish the different types of Hepatitis. When you heard anything about it, they simply referred to it as Hepatitis.

I am certainly not a doctor. I am not even a nurse. So, I will issue this disclaimer. The facts, in this series of articles, are "my truths". I am making statements that are to the best of my knowledge on the subject. The internet is loaded with information about Hepatitis should you wish to do further research. In addition, should you have any questions regarding my experience with Hepatitis, my phone number is in the park directory.

My very first introduction to Hepatitis was a news story where a few people had gotten Hepatitis and some restaurant (it happened to be a buffet) was suspected as being the source of the infection. In that case, what they were actually talking about was Hepatitis-A.

The primary source of Hepatitis-A is from eating "poop"! You may be thinking, "Well, I don't generally do that, so I should be safe." However, what I am really saying is that it is from eating food, which has been touched by a person's hands, who has Hep-A and did not do a good job of cleaning their hands after going to the bathroom. In many cases, Hepatitis-A will cure itself. Your body will fight the virus and expel it, when you go to the bathroom. You may only feel that you have eaten something that did not agree with you or you had a minor bout with some kind of flu. If your body does not take care of it, itself, and you end up going to the doctor, they will help you fight the virus and all will be well. The main point is that the symptoms should show up within a few days of the exposure and it is very curable.

The primary source of Hepatitis-B is from sexual contact with a person who is infected with Hep-B. With Hepatitis-B you will most likely end up going to the doctor. They will treat the virus and all will be well. The symptoms will show up within a month or two of the exposure, and, like Hep-A, it is very curable.

Hepatitis-C is an entirely different animal! The only source, of Hep-C, is thru blood-to-blood contact with another person who carries the Hep-C virus. Somehow their blood makes contact with your bloodstream thru some break in your skin. Let's say that a friend accidentally cuts their finger and you help clean up the wound and apply a band aid. If they carry the Hep-C virus, and if you have some kind of minor break in the skin of one of your fingers, and if their blood makes contact with that minor break in your skin, you may make contact with the Hep-C virus.

The really strange thing about Hep-C is that the symptoms may show up within a couple of months from the time of exposure, or the symptoms may never show up. It is very possible that a person can be exposed to Hep-C, become a carrier of the virus and never have symptoms. They could possibly live the entire rest of their life and end up dying of old-age and never even know that they are Hep-C carriers.

I know that many of you may be thinking that, with all of the blood tests that have been done on you, you surely have been checked for Hep-C somewhere along the line. Not true! A standard battery of blood tests does not include a test for Hep-C. I believe, strongly, that everybody (or at least every Baby Boomer) should be tested.

You probably think that the main reason that a person should be tested is for the purpose of starting treatment to get rid of the virus. That is not necessarily so! If the Hep-C virus iscontinued on page 38
