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






#### FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

- 1. Please do not stop our maintenance men asking for permission to do something on your property, nor ask them to ask the managers for you. If you need information you are welcome to contact us directly either by phone or at the office.
- 2. There is no on street or grass area parking at any time. Kermit does not want to have to resort to calling in a towing company but he will if it continues. Contact us directly if you have any questions.
- 3. Renting your home: You need written permission from the office before you rent (Per rules and regulations). Renters MUST be approved before moving in. This can take 48 hours or more. We do not allow daily or weekly rentals. If you have someone living with you or renting from you, we need to know and that person needs to be approved. The home owner is responsible for paying the lot rent, not the renter. We cannot accept payment from the person renting the home. Please be sure to have the lot number on your check or money order.

#### FYI:

Any outside upgrading/construction must be approved in writing by the office before you start. Also, you need to check with Code Enforcement to see if a permit is required. (Example: new windows, roof, steps, ramp, siding) do require a permits and a licensed contractor.

You will find posted on the bulletin board (and I do have more copies in the office) an INFOR-MATION SHEET FOR PINELLAS COUNTY SOLID WASTE FACILITY. The address and phone number is: Pinellas County Solid Waste, 3095 114th Avenue North, St. Petersburg, FL 33716 (727-464-7500). The website is <u>www.pinellascounty.org/solidwaste</u> Household Electronics and Chemical Waste drop-off center and the Recycling drop-off center are located at 2855 109th Ave. N. (off 28th St. Ns.)

The compactor is for household trash and broken down boxes only. The area around the compactor is to be kept clean and it **IS NOT A DUMP SITE.** 

#### <u>No construction material, furniture, mattresses or box springs, washers, dryers or stoves</u> <u>or anything else that is not household trash.</u>

This is not the park's responsibility to remove it, it is yours. Every time we take a truckload to the dump it costs money and could cause a rise in your future rent.



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**NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH**

hat is Neighborhood Watch and why do we have it? Neighborhood Watch is a program that the local Police Departments are urging neighborhoods and community's to organize to try to maintain a safe environment. We have had Neighborhood Watch in La Plaza now for about 2 years. We have had the Largo Police, specifically Julie Williams, come in and talk to us. You may see Neighborhood Watch signs on some of the houses as well as at



both entrances. The Largo Police ride through here in the middle of the night at the request of Lou Goodwin who is the chairman of our Neighborhood Watch Program.

The message behind this is that **we are all part of the Neighborhood Watch**. If you hear, see or suspect that something is not right, if you are frightened by a noise in the middle of the night, if you observe a flashlight shining in someone's windows or their car in the middle of the night, you need to call the police. You need to give specifics and they may ask a lot of questions, but this is to help them understand exactly what they are facing when they come into our community. You can request that your identity be kept confidential and they will honor that. Call 911 if you feel it is an emergency situation or you can call the non-emergency number (727-587-6730). Just don't wait until the next day and tell Lou that you were frightened during the night by a noise outside your house.

Many of our residents are part of the Neighborhood Watch Team; however, we would like to see more volunteers. In the fall we will be recruiting for more members. The role is to be aware, never take aggressive action and educate your neighbors to make our community a safe place to live.

Just a reminder; if you have a bike, tricycle, scooter or golf cart, **make sure you lock them up** or secure them in some way.

You can put your name, La Plaza, and lot # under the seat. If they are found this will be identifying information for the police to follow up on.

Officer Vu Tran has been selected to take on the Community and Crime Prevention officer position for Largo Police department. Officer Tran is replacing Officer Julie Williams who is retiring from the Department. Julie has requested that we introduce ourselves to Officer Tran so he can become familiar with our community.
