aren and Kermit want to say thank you to everyone for your wonderful welcome. We are glad to be here at La Plaza, one of the prettiest parks around.

Some Friendly Reminders:

Rent is due on the 1st to 5th without late charges being applied. If you are going to be late, call the office and speak with Karen or Kermit to request an extension late rent. DO NOT LEAVE A MESSAGE.

We understand some residents don't get their Social Security until the 13th to 15th – we will make a note of that. If it is later that the 15th then late charges will be applied. Put lot number on all checks or money orders – NOT ON THE ENVELOPE.

Two concerns that are happening in the park:

1. Renting your home – you need written permission from the office before you rent (per rules & regulations). Renters **must** be approved before moving in. This can take 48 hours or more. We do not allow daily or weekly rentals – Ex: Airbb (Air BnB), VRBO (vacation rentals by order); Home Away, etc.

Seasonal rentals – the office needs name and dates of rental....If advertised, need price.

2. Homes for Sale – you need to notify the office when you put your home up for sale. We need – contact information and price, as people come into the office daily and we can give them a sheet with all homes that are for sale, which can mean a quicker sale for you.

Just a note to remind you that you will still have at least one more water bill after you leave. However, we try to read it the day you leave and can tell you what the final bill will be. The compactor is for household trash and broken down boxes. The area around the compactor is to be kept clean and it is **not a dumpsite**.

No construction material; furniture; mattress or box springs; washer, dryer or stoves.

This is not the park's responsibility to remove, it is yours. Every time we take a truckload to the dump it cost money and could cause a rise in your future rent.

FYI:

Any outside upgrading/construction must be approved in writing by the office before you start. Also, you need to check with Code Enforcement to see if a permit is required. EX – new windows, roof, steps, siding, etc., do require permits and a licensed contractor.

We want to thank Wilder LLC for the new clubhouse roof, the upgrading of the kitchen with new paint and new self-cleaning oven/stove.

If you haven't seen it, drop by and take a look and also check on the new fountain in Lake La Plaza, it's magical at night!

We are in the process now of putting in new ceiling tiles in the clubhouse.

WOW – and there is still more to come.





(1) 8oz package Philadelphia cream cheese ½ lb butter ------ Cream together

Let dough stand till firm, or refrigerate a couple of hours.

Roll out thin, about 1/8". Cut out making circles. Thumb print on the dough.

Fill with any filling.

Bake in 400 degree oven for approximately 15 minutes or until golden brown.

When cool, sprinkle with powdered sugar.

BAKED APPLES

- (4)Medium apples (McIntosh are the best for this recipe)
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ¼ cup regular sugar
- (1) tsp. Vanilla
- (1) tsp. fresh lemon juice
- ½ cup Maple syrup
- (1) Stick melted butter



Peel and core apples, leaving them in whole form – place in an oven safe dish
**Mix together: brown sugar, regular sugar, vanilla, lemon juice, syrup & butter
Pour over apples evenly.

Bake 350 degrees for 45-55 minutes

Serve with ice cream & whipped cream

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


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La Plaza MHP Residents --- Join the FMO

That is Neighborhood Watch and why do we have it? Neighborhood Watch is a program that the local Police Departments are urging neighborhoods and community's to organize to try to maintain a safe environment. We have had Neighborhood Watch in La Plaza now for about 2 years. We have had the Largo Police, specifically Julie Williams, come in and talk to us. You may see Neighborhood Watch signs on some of the houses as well as at both entrances. The Largo Police ride through here in the middle of the night at the request of Lou Goodwin who is the chairman of our Neighborhood Watch Program.

The message behind this is that we are all part of the Neighborhood Watch. If you hear, see or suspect that something is not right, if you are frightened by a noise in the middle of the night, if you observe a flashlight shining in someone's windows or their car in the middle of the night, you need to call the police. You need to give specifics and they may ask a lot of questions, but this is to help them understand exactly what they are facing when they come into our community. You can request that your identity be kept confidential and they will honor that. Call 911 if you feel it is an emergency situation or you can call the non-emergency number (727-587-6730). Just don't wait until the next day and tell Lou that you were frightened during the night by a noise outside your house.

Many of our residents are part of the Neighborhood Watch Team; however, we would like to see more volunteers. In the fall we will be recruiting for more members. The role is to be aware, never take aggressive action and educate your neighbors to make our community a safe place to live.

Just a reminder; if you have a bike, tricycle, scooter or golf cart, <u>make sure you lock them up</u> <u>or secure them in some way.</u> We have recently had some of these items stolen during the night.

You can put your name, La Plaza, and lot # under the seat. If they are found this will be identifying information for the police to follow up on.
