

Homeowners Membership Information

The Florida Statutes that control our HOA are; Articles of Incorporation Chapter 617, The Florida Mobile Home Act Chapter 723, Florida Administrative Code Chapters 61B-29 Through 33, and 35, and La Plaza Homeowners Association, Inc.By-Laws. The existence of our HOA authorizes it to be the entity that represents all homeowners at the Annual Statutory (Rent

Committee) meeting with the park owner dealing with rent increases, services and amenities.

In March of 2018 the La Plaza HOA was incorporated as a nonprofit corporation with over two-thirds of homeowners signing the formation authorization. Signing makes those homeowners HOA members and a combination of the above documents makes all other homeowners eligible to become members. The HOA nonprofit is to protect members and directors and they are shielded from personal liability for the nonprofit's actions.

All persons owning a mobile home in the park are eligible for membership in the HOA with limited exceptions specified in the By-Laws and Articles of Incorporation. The law requires the HOA to account for members in good standing and members that are not. Members are charged dues (currently \$10.00 annually) from January to January that determine standing, voting rights, Director and committee chair eligibility and gives each homeowner a voice.



"PROTECT YOUR LIFESTYLE and STAND-UP for HOMEOWNERS STRONGLY OPPOSE SB 818 sponsored by Senator Ed Hooper, (R-Clearwater)

This anti-homeowner bill is very alarming to homeowners and will negatively impact our standard of living. Many of us are retired or unable to move and we need affordable housing. When we chose a mobile/manufactured home community as our lifestyle, the park or community owner made promises about living in his park.

This anti-homeowner bill basically gives the park owner permission to ignore many of the promises and guarantees he made and that we are paying for. There are so many upsetting parts to this bill and these are just a few of them.

- Removes the right to assume a lease and receive the initial prospectus that goes with the lot in accordance with the DBPR decision in 2011 and upheld on appeal.
- Permits adding an unlimited number of units to a park with no requirement to increase or add amenities for the new units. This would dramatically affect our pool, clubhouse, exercise area, or game area.
- Permits changing the current prospectus without disclosure to homeowners.
- Permits them to be able to have new residents sign for an integrated prospectus which was not approved by the DBPR and not one presently approved for your park.
- Requires a new buyer to make changes prior to occupying the home which should be purchased as is. Resales may become impossible.
- Removes the requirement for certified mail if there is an eviction notice.
- Permits one notice of all rent increases regardless of the anniversary date which will be too confusing.
- Prohibits an experienced negotiator or attorney from attending the negotiating committee meeting.

This bill will cause so much upheaval and unhappiness. We have more faith in the Legislature than to let this happen to our Seniors, Veterans, and all those of us living on fixed incomes." ***ASK FOR A NO VOTE ON SB 818 - PROTECT YOURSELVES.***

WHY SHOULD SENIOR CITIZENS BE CONCERNED?

It has been the experience of the FBI that the elderly are targeted for fraud for several reasons:

1) Older American citizens are most likely to have a "nest egg," own there home and/or have excellent credit, all of which the con-man will try to tap into. The fraudster will focus his/her efforts on the population most likely to be in a financial position to buy something.

2) Individuals who grew up in the 1930's, 1940's and 1950's were generally raised to be polite and trusting. Two very important and positive personality traits, except when it comes to dealing with a con-man. The con-man will exploit these traits knowing that it is impossible or difficult for these individuals to say "NO" or just hang on the phone.

3) Older Americans are less likely to report a fraud because they don't know who to report it to, are too ashamed at having been scammed or do not know they have been scammed. In some cases an elderly victim may not report the crime because he or she is concerned that relatives may come to the conclusion that the victim no longer has the mental capacity to take care of his or her own financial affairs.

4) When an elderly victim does report the crime, they often make poor witnesses. The conman knows the effects of age on memory and he/she is counting on the fact that the elderly customarily not be able to supply enough information to investigators such as: How many times did the fraudster call? What time of day did he/she call? Did they provide a call back number or address? Was it always the same person? What did the fraudster look like? Did they have any recognizable accent? Where did you send the money? What did you receive, if anything, and how was it delivered? What promises were made and when? Did you keep any notes of your conversations?

5) Lastly, when it comes to products that promise increased cognitive function, virility, physical conditioning, anti cancer properties and so on, older Americans make up the segment of the population most concerned about these issues. In a country where new cures and vaccinations for old diseases have given every American hope for a long and fruitful life, it is not so unbelievable that the products offered by these con-men can do what they say they can do.
