HIGHLIGHTS OF THE JANUARY 16, 2020 LHRO BOARD MEETING

- All board members were present.
- Open forum
 - ^o Lot 90 was reviewing the Rules & Regulations and noticed in the last section that residents are asked to notify the office if they are expecting any commercial vehicles. Does the office really want us to notify them anytime we are expecting commercial vehicles at our coaches? The board will get back to #90.



- Occupance of the White Elephant Sale door to door? Can the bake sale solicit baked goods from residents, door to door, for the White Elephant sale? Response was "Go for it."
- ° Lot 200 said there is a rodent problem in the park. She and another resident have been fighting rats in their coaches. Beth Carroll responded that the Park recently had an inspection by the Pinellas County Health Department. Two coaches were cited for "harboring." This means there was standing water which can attract rats. Also, citrus fruit trees with dropped fruit. Lot 40, who walks early in the mornings, said that she often sees large rats as she walks.
- ^o Lot 256 said that Dish and other commercial vendors are never given permission to solicit within the park. They often state they have been given permission by the office. Call the non-emergency police phone number if you see them in the Park.
- ^o Lot 164 said that bird feeders attract rats. Eliminate their food source and you will no longer have a rat problem in the park.
- Election of Officers. The board elected the following officers for 2020:
 - President Susan Zerbe
 - ° Vice-President Fred Wimmer
 - ° Secretary Karen Larrimore
 - ° Treasurer Kathy Hartwell
- President's Report Susan Zerbe thanked Gerry Killham and Mary Lou Fraher for presiding over the annual member meeting.
- Manager's Report
 - o The sewer line along the back of #284-256 often backs up. Due to the prior problems a sewer line cleanup was done. Lots of diapers were found in the line. Beth Carroll is authorizing a cleanout of that section of sewer every six months at \$3200 each time. Suggestions were to send a notice to those units or perhaps go door to door to talk to those residents. Gerry Killham volunteered to accompany a board member to talk to the residents.
 - One of the begin in February and go into March looking for leaking toilets and other water issues. This has been done twice before and each time it resulted in a reduction of our overall water usage. About twenty things will be looked at. Problems will have to be fixed at the homeowner's expense.
 - ° There was a Park-wide inspection by the Pinellas County



Health Department. The Park came out with a satisfactory rating with the exception of two coaches who had water "harboring" issues. Those owners have been notified. And one coach had an excess of construction debris, which can harbor rats. If fruit is found lying on the ground near fruit trees, maintenance will pick it up, take a picture, and dispose of it. The office will send out one warning letter. If the problem persists the tree will be cut down.

- Obeth Carroll and Bruce DeWaters met with the paving contractor who recommended seal coating the asphalt on our streets. The cost would be \$35,000 which includes repainting lines. It will extend the paving warrantee one year. Beth will get three bids. The contractor feels the coating will last five years.
 - Lot 198 spoke to this: We have many cracks and rainfall will only enlarge them. He feels the sooner this is done, the better.
- Treasurer's Report: We ended 2019 in the black, over \$10,000. The financials have been reviewed. Two journal entries needed to be adjusted. A mortgage prepayment of \$57142.99 was made in December. We are waiting to see how this affects our monthly payment. The 2019 audit is in process.
- Standing committee reports
 - ° Sales and Marketing: There is no more Sales and Marketing Committee, but Sandy Clark (lot 273) is in charge of an open house, should it be decided we need one. Currently only three coaches are for sale.
 - Ong Range Planning: Ron Teeter (lot 244) gave the report. The committee met on December 19. They suggested a water usage study which is already being planned. They also are concerned with the safety of the parking curbs in front the card room. It is a tripping hazard as did not stop a golf cart from running into the card room doors. They are willing to look into options.
 - ^o Emergency Management: Steve Schultz reported on behalf of the committee. The team, consisting of Fred Wimmer, J. P. St. Laurent, Billy Shedd, Bob Bernier, and Steve Schultz met prior to the hurricane season. They were fully prepared in the event of a storm. Looking forward to a storm-free 2020 season.
 - Unfinished Business
 - O ADA access to benches/swings: This was a resident survey item. 86 responses to the survey were received. 51 people said that nothing should be done about access to benches and swings. The reasons stated were the expense, loos of green space, and a negative visual impact. The board voted, by majority, to take no action on this matter.
 - ° Traffic safety options: Two issues were survey topics. One was the traffic direction around the lake. This issue was split. After some discussion the board voted to make the road from North Drive to the pool stop sign one way going south. From North Drive to the stop sign by the flag poles (east side of the lake), there will be a center line, the stop sign by the flag poles will be returned, and the one-way signs will be removed. The other issue regarding speeding. 51 survey respondents said speeding is an issue. After much discussion the board voted to take no action nor expend money on speeding. If you see a commercial vehicle speeding within the park, take down thecontinued on page 13

 - ^o Bob Anderson, lot 164, said that volunteers are needed to open and close the common buildings. The list will be in the office. Please volunteer.
- Meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FEBRUARY 10, 2020 SOCIAL CLUB MEETING

- Treasurer Bob Bernier reported the following: January 1st checking balance was \$7,143.33. He first reported activity for January 1-17 (tenure of previous treasurer). Deposits were \$1,437.00. Expenses were coffee hour 1/5 \$181.00, coffee hour 1/12 \$161.00, memberships \$510.00, 50/50 \$47.00, events, \$488.00, totaling \$1,387.00. Expenses were Loche Kline \$33.15, Karen Judson \$47.05, Reimburse petty cash \$84.49, Sunshine bakery 1/5 \$125.70, James McKaugham \$150.00, Grace Hughes \$65.08, Monthly Media \$23.75, Amazon \$179.98, Walmart \$5.22, Tampa Bay Times \$38.00, Winn Dixie \$8.56, totaling \$760.98. The second part of the report was beginning January 17-31 (during Bob's tenure as treasurer). Checking account balance 1/17/20 was \$7,706.51. January deposits totaled \$946.98. Income was coffee hour 1/18 \$204.00, coffee hour 1/25 \$198.00, Memberships \$145.00, Razzmatazz \$145.00, return clubhouse lights \$179.98, Baby Boomers \$75.00, totaling \$946.98. Expenses were Sunshine Bakery 1/18 \$121.40, Sunshine Bakery 1/25 \$121.40, Bunko (Liz Longhurst) \$22.67, Winn Dixie Flowers \$8.56, Razzmatazz \$180.00, Secretarial supplies \$12.15, Newcomers night \$99.45, Treasurer supplies \$32.76, Suncoast Hospice Christmas trees \$7.48, Sam's Club \$15.56, Pay Pal \$21.00, totaling \$642.43. January total income was \$2,333.98 and total expenses were \$1401.41. Checking account balance as of January 31, 2020 was \$8,011.06.
- Old Business:
 - ° There seems to be a lot of excitement about the possibility of a ping pong table. Park Manager is looking into the liability issues. Assuming approval the Social Club will purchase a portable ping pong table which can be used anywhere. It would cost \$200-\$300. Anyone in the park would be able to use it. Likewise, the corn hole boards and bean bags can be used by anyone in the park at any time.

 - ° President MacMillan thanked those who are organizing events on their own, such as Bunco, painting, etc.
 - ° A new CD player has been purchased for water aerobics.
 - ° A host is need for the Easter dinner.



- ° A collection will be taken up at Saturday's coffee for park employee Mike who is off work due to surgery. The Social Club will contribute at least \$200.
- ° Park picnic will be March 26 at Philippe Park.
- ° There will be a dance on March 28 with Ron & the Classics.

PROPOSED SOCIAL CLUB BY-LAWS CHANGES

Article IX Section 3 currently reads as:

Article IX Committees

Section 3: Any Ancillary new club or group should notify the Social Club of their formation.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IX, SECTION 3: Amend to read as follows:

Section 3: Any club or group <u>shall</u> notify the Social Club of their formation <u>if they wish to enjoy the privilege of 50/50 drawings.</u>

ARTICLE IX SECTION 4, CURRENTLY READS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 4: The Social Club will make the following information available to the Lake Highlander RO management as follows:

- a) A copy of the most recent Social Club By-Laws and any amendment(s) thereto.
- b) A list of newly elected social club officers each year.
- c) A list of persons who conduct ancillary clubs or groups.
- d) Within thirty (30) days of the year end (December 31) the Social Club shall submit a financial accounting of all funds received, funds disbursed and balance remaining at year end. The Social Club accounting shall also include financial accounting from all ancillary committees/clubs as stated above.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IX, SECTION 4: Amend to read as follows by elimination of Section 4) c and Section 4) d.

Section 4: The Social Club will make the following information available to the Lake Highlander RO management as follows:

- a) A copy of the most recent Social Club By-Laws and any amendment(s) thereto.
- b) A list of newly elected social club officers each year.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IX: Amend by the addition of Section 7.

Section 7: Any club having a minimum of 20 participating members may benefit from holding 50/50 drawing privileges. Clubs holding a 50/50 drawing shall be the Coffee Hour

A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY

[Editor's note: Those not from Michigan may not be aware of this favorite drink of the Great Lakes State natives, but it <u>is</u> delicious. At one time we saw it for sale at Publix but have not seen it recently.]

Tames Vernor was Michigan's first registered pharmacist. In 1861, he started to work on a "Ginger Drink" blending pure ginger root with other essential oils to produce an "extract" to make



the drink. The Civil War then broke out and Vernor joined the Union Army. After returning from the war in 1866, he found an oak cask in which he had mixed his extract years earlier. Combining it with sparkling water, the drink tasted tremendous! Vernor went on to "secretly" age his formula in wood for 4 years. His extract later became available to the public in the early 1900s. A 25¢ bottle made 5 gallons of the drink! In 1921, the company he had formed coined the phrase "Deliciously Different" as people couldn't get enough of the drink. Many of us remember the green and yellow plant on Woodward Avenue near Wayne State [University]. Opened in 1951, the sign atop the building was a Detroit icon as hundreds of glimmering lights showed Vernors Ginger Ale being poured into a glass by their trademark bearded gnome. Vernors was the tonic for those bad colds, the flu, and upset tummies while we missed school. It also tasted great with ice cream, and we still love it today, more than 150 years since its creation.

I am nuts about nuts, and I eat them every day. A recent Harvard study of 119,000 people who were followed for three decades found that eating nuts on a daily basis lowered the risk of death from any cause by about 20%. Other impressive studies showed that nut consumption is linked to lower risks for Alzheimer/s disease, heart attack, diabetes and sudden cardiac death. Tree nuts will help to reduce the bad (LDL) cholesterol and raise your good (HDL) cholesterol. Adding tree nuts to your daily eating habits also can reduce your chances of dying the study of t

nuts to your daily eating habits also can reduce your chances of dying from a malignant tumor and seems to be protective against pancreatic cancer and colon cancer. Nuts are especially good for your heart and brain because they are loaded with healthy fats and lots of great fiber. Because tree nuts contain so many nutrients, we want to pick the types that are most nutritious such as Pecans, Almonds, Walnuts, Macadamias, Hazel nuts, Brazil, and Pistachios. Peanuts and Cashews are not quite as healthy as the other nuts, but they are still better than most other snack foods.

Make a point to find and consume the freshest nuts. Sure, nuts are high in calories, yet studies consistently show that the more often people eat nuts, the leaner they tend to be (within reason).

A recent study found people who frequently ate nuts gained less weight than individuals who never ate nuts and were about 43% less likely to become overweight during the 28-month study. Try to choose nuts instead of junk food snacks like chips or candy. I find that even the trail mixes almost always have too much sugar.

ARE YOU SMARTER THAN SHERLOCK HOLMES?

r. Watson had a new card puzzle for Sherlock Holmes. He picked four cards out of a pack of 52 cards and laid them face down on a table. Watson asked Mr. Holmes if he could tell the value of each card in order (no suit, just the number). He offered five hints to Sherlock.

- 1) The left card can't be greater than the one on the right.
- 2) The difference between the first card and third card equals eight.
- 3) None of the aces are present.
- 4) No face card was included (i.e. no queen, king, or jack).
- 5) The difference between the second and fourth card is 7.

Sherlock smiled and told the value of all four cards to Dr. Watson.

Here is the answer. Don't peak until you have tried to solve the puzzle.

The cards are 2, 3, 10, and 10. To maintain the difference of eight and keeping in mind the third and fourth hint, the first and third cards can be 2 and 10 or 10 and 2. But keeping in mind the first hint, we know that the first card is 2 and the third is 10. Similarly, if we see the fifth hint, the difference between the second and fourth card should be 7. Thus we know the second card is 3 and the fourth card is 10.




