





R.O. REVIEWS BUDGET PROCESS FOR RESIDENTS

n March 15, the Board of Directors arranged to have our accountant speak at length about park finances at an open meeting. The completed budget will be circulated to the full membership for review (both electronically and via the postal service). Our accountant reported no disagreements with Park Management and found internal controls satisfactory. She reminded those present that our park manager is not a licensed accountant but feels the close business relationship that has developed with our past, present and future treasurer's keeps things running in a businesslike and orderly fashion. She reported that the manager is doing an excellent job and works closely with the accounting firm on a regular basis. Having a licensed accountant on staff would prove helpful but costly and it may be something to consider in the future

Once the budget has been reviewed by the membership, questions may be sent in to the R.O. Board prior to May 15. All questions and their answers will be made available when they have been organized. This info will also be available on the park web site.

The Board encourages all residents to inform the office of their email address. Mailing heavy multipage financial documents is very costly and time consuming.



CANCER DRIVE UPDATE

ello everyone, Just to let you know that I received several more donations, making this year's total \$3,272.00 and an eight year total of \$22,127.00. YAHOO!!!!!

HIGHLIGHT OF BOARD WORKSHOP APRIL 2, 2015

- Director Sue Stevens and Park manager Beth Carroll have reviewed all our insurance coverage. Several items (Lanai, pool wall, fencing etc.) have been removed as they were excluded from wind damages. This action resulted in a savings of \$285.00
- Additional coverage was added to allow rebuilding the entire clubhouse "to code" following any major claim.
- 3 new yellow & black street speed Humps will be installed soon. The Humps allow 10 M.P.H. speeds when passing over them, with no inconvenience. This is being done to slow all park traffic to the posted limit. There have been a number of complaints about delivery vehicles and some residents who have disregarded the park 10 MPH speed limit. A few residents continue to make illegal turns and don't obey the ONE WAY signs. One Way traffic was established to eliminate problems at busy parking areas around the clubhouse and park office. All residents are requested to please obey all traffic signs.
- The Dumpster Area is being upgraded to allow easier access for container pickups.
- 17 homes are currently "under contract" for sale.
- Christmas lights installed permanently on the lakeside palms will be removed. Excessive summer heat has damaged them.





decide to sell your home. The manager has located a couple Title Companies who do cooperative closings on a regular basis. If a closing has no "unusual problems", it normally takes about two weeks to finish the transaction. After discussion with buyer and seller and taking their time lines into consideration, the final closing date will be set by the title agent. Both the seller and the purchaser will pay approximately \$750.00 to complete the sale. If the Title Company finds problems with the sale, there may be extra costs, depending on how much additional work must be done. Each sale is different, but the \$750.00 figure is the average you might plan for. The office takes care of the initial steps for board approval and sends it to the chosen title company. Once the title agent has completed the closing, the office will finalize the closing with a meeting with the buyer(s) to transfer the certificate and go through the rules and regulations. Buyers and Sellers are responsible to pose all questions regarding the legal process and paperwork to their chosen title agent.

These Captains will be knocking on your door between now and the middle of May. They need to know if you're a Summer Resident (that is if you are here for most of the summer months). Also tell them where you will go if asked to EVACUATE Lake Highlander. They will try to answer any storm related question you might have such as:



- 1. Where is the nearest shelter?
- 2. What can I do with my pets?
- 3. What motel can I go to?
- 4. I need "OXYGEN". Is there a special needs shelter?
- 5. Can I use the Club house or Library/Poolroom as a shelter?
- 6. Remember to collect the "Hurricane Guide" information put out by the Tampa Bay Times or Tampa Tribune. The different TV Channels put out a good Guide also. We will also give each resident a good Hurricane Guide published by Pinellas Co.
- 7. Like last year, we will make up a Summer Residents List.

Below are three services you need to PRE-REGISTER for now:

- 1. Pet shelter -- Call Animal Control at -- 582-2600
- 2. Special Needs --at Dunedin Middle School—Your Block Captain has the Registration Form..
- 3. You need transportation to a Shelter -- Your Block Captain has the Registration Form If MANDATORY orders are given to evacuate, there are *no facilities under any hurricane* conditions available here at Lake Highlander. There are public shelters available, but first try to go to your friend or relative's house. Make sure they are in a non-evacuation zone. You can make reservation at a few motels. When ordered to evacuate be sure you have all outside furniture, all potted plants, bicycles, and all grills secured or placed inside of the shed or house. And of course secure your awnings. If the Park sees any items in the carport after Evacuation orders are given, they will pick it up and throw it away. OUCH! Also remember to keep an eye out for your neighbor. Remember our Library and Poolroom can not to be used as a shelter under any hurricane conditions. If mandatory evacuation orders are given, the Library/Poolroom and the Clubhouse doors will be locked. That is the combination will be changed. The RO Board decided on March 26, 2009 that these facilities would not be used as a shelter under any conditions. We have a 17 member RECOVERY TEAM. I'll talk about them in a later Piper issue. About June 1st during Coffee Hour someone from the Dunedin Fire Dept. will come to talk to us about Hurricane Preparedness. HURRICANE MYTHS; PAST HURRICANES ALWAYS SEEMED TO MISS US. It will never happen here!
