Many have found this a good time to do Spring cleaning. And of course, reading. The Lake Highlander library has been very busy which is evident from the number of returns.

On Easter Sunday evening, an impromptu gathering occurred to sing "Amazing Grace." The Lake Highlander Facebook page is a great tool for letting people know what is happening. Quite a few people enjoyed the small gathering. There was lots of laughter as everyone greeted their isolated neighbors.

As with most Canadians, Patsy and her husband left Florida for their return to Canada and the forced 14-day self-quarantine.

"We are quarantined in Canada for another 7 days [as of March 26]. Justin Trudeau today enacted the Quarantine Act which includes heavy fines and prison for anyone returning from outside the country and failing to stay home for 14 days. We are on the second floor of a senior building, not permitted in hallways or stairwells, so we have a bucket we lower on a rope for deliveries. The grocery store delivers to the hallway. This is this week's take [see Patsy 1 and 2]. I clean everything with a Clorox solution in the foyer and let air dry before anything comes into the rest of the dwelling. There is a new number for reporting people gathering in groups – 4141."



A FASCINATING SHORT SEA STORY: SS WARRIMOO

he passenger steamer SS Warrimoo was quietly knifing its way through the waters of the mid-Pacific on its way from Vancouver to Australia. The navigator had just finished working out a star fix and brought the master, Captain John Phillips, the result. The Warrimoo's position was LAT 0° 31' N and LON 179 30' W. The date was 31 December 1899.

"Know what this means?" First Mate Payton broke in, "We're only a few miles from the intersection of the Equator and the International Date Line".

Captain Phillips was prankish enough to take full advantage of the opportunity for achieving the navigational freak of a lifetime. He called his navigators to the bridge to check & double check the ships position. He changed course slightly so as to bear directly on his mark. Then he adjusted the engine speed. The calm weather & clear night worked in his favor.

At midnight the SS Warrimoo lay on the Equator at exactly the point where it crossed the International Date Line! The consequences of this bizarre position were many:

The forward part (bow) of the ship was in the Southern Hemisphere & in the middle of summer. The rear (stern) was in the Northern Hemisphere & in the middle of winter.

The date in the aft part of the ship was 31 December 1899. In the bow (forward) part it was 1 January 1900.

This ship was therefore not only in:

Two different days,

Two different months,

Two different years,

Two different seasons

But in two different centuries - all at the same time.





HEALTH TIPS

Article Review: Vitamin D (Deficiency) and Role In Health

It is commonly recognized that we need a proper amount of vitamins, minerals and vital nutrients to maintain good health, among other things like exercise and proper diet. Yet, rarely are we tested annually for adequate levels or processing of these across the wide spectrum of our body's health. Just to name a few of the disorders which information indicates a deficiency of Vitamin D can impact are:

- Dementia/Alzheimers
- Vulnerability to diabetes, heart diseases, stroke and cancer
- Dry eyes syndromes, age-related macular degeneration
- Multiple Sclerosis and auto-immune diseases
- Inflammatory Rheumatic diseases
- Lupus
- Depression



Of course, Vitamin D/D3 is not a cure-all alone for these and other health issues but one that ought to be regularly and simply addressed with your physician. The easiest source of Vitamin D/D3 is from regular exposure of natural sunshine to your skin, if tolerated. The body recognizes and optimizes this source well. Otherwise, supplements under a monitored medical program is the next best alternative if needed. Minimum daily requirement levels usually are not near enough. Proper levels of support elements like magnesium are required for Vitamin D to work well. Also, be sure to take authentic Vitamin D3 with Vitamin K-2 and not the synthetic Vitamin D2. Vitamin K-2's role is to assist in the transport of calcium to the appropriate areas of one's body so that such calcium does not build up as blockage elsewhere. It has been learned that this latter condition of blockage was truly caused by lack of K-2 and not due primarily to too much Vitamin D.

As additional notes, dietary sources of magnesium are the darker green vegetables. For supplements, consider the more effective types like magnesium citrate and magnesium threonate. One additional idea, lower zinc levels have also been identified as a contributing factor to Alzheimers, as well as affecting blood clotting, immune functions, thyroid health and wound healing for starters. It is a good idea to keep up with the latest independent medical studies on these valuable vitamins. Again, coordinate body testing with your physician.



Home Exercise Routines

[Editor's Note: The April Piper included some exercises you can do at home. This article re-emphasizes the need to stay fit when you can't get to the gym or attend Margaret's classes.]

dding a fitness routine to your daily schedule is a great way to stay in shape both mentally and physically. Many of us are missing our regularly scheduled fitness activities offered in our communities or at our local gyms, but that doesn't mean you can't stay fit at home! Check out these exercise suggestions below for an effective at-home workout. The number of repetitions and sets of each exercise is up to you. You can customize this routine based on the amount of time you have.



*** If you're new to an exercise routine, please obtain clearance from your medical doctor before starting a new program or attempting any of these activities.

Warm-Up. First, warm up your body! If you can, go on a brisk 5-10 minute walk around your neighborhood to get your muscles warmed up. Prefer to stay inside? March in place, step side to side, or turn on your favorite tunes and dance around the living room for a few minutes. After heating up your muscles, dedicate some time to your joints. Think about starting at the top of your body and working your way down. Move your head left and right and tilt your head side to side to warm up your neck. Raise your shoulders up and down, then add some shoulder circles. Roll your shoulders forward for 30 seconds or so then reverse the motion rolling your shoulders back maintaining the circular pattern. Holding your arms out directly in front of you (you may choose to sit in a chair), do some wrist circles in one direction and then reverse the motion. Next, stand with your legs hip width apart, slowly making a figure 8 shape with your hips. Continue in one direction for about 30 seconds and then reverse. Have a seat in a chair and lift one foot off the ground and begin making circles with your ankle. Start in one direction, then reverse the motion. Repeat with the other ankle. Whatever warm-up you prefer, the goal is to warm your muscles and joints to prepare your body for exercise.

Chair Squats. If you have knee issues, you may choose to skip this exercise (please consult with your doctor). Squats are a great way to strengthen your lower body. If you can, find two chairs to use for this exercise. One chair will be used for squatting, and the other chair will be used for balance. Place the chairs one behind the other facing the same direction leaving enough room for you to stand between the two chairs. Place your hands on the chair in front of you for balance, then slowly push your hips back, bend your knees, and lower your body to the chair. You may choose to lightly sit on the chair or barely touch it before standing up and returning to the starting position.



Wall Push Ups. Wall push ups are a great way to strengthen your upper body. Stand about two feet behind a wall and place your hands on the wall about shoulder height. Begin to bend your elbows out to the sides as you bring your face and chest close to the wall. Your heels will most likely come off the floor – that's ok! Press your hands into the wall to straighten your elbows and return to the starting position.

Toe Stands. Grab one of the chairs you used for the squatting exercise and stand directly behind it using the chair for balance. Slowly raise up onto your tiptoes then slowly lower your heels back to the floor.

Knee Extensions. Using the same chair, have a seat keeping your back straight and knees bent. One leg at a time, slowly extend your leg out in front of you. Hold this position for a few seconds and then lower back to the starting position. Repeat with opposite leg.

Chest Expansions. While still sitting in your chair. Bring your arms straight out in front of you (shoulder height) and place your palms together. As you inhale, open your arms wide extending your fingertips in opposite directions. As you exhale, bring your arms back to the starting position. Continue moving in these motions along with your breath.

Relax. At the end of your routine, you may choose to stay sitting in your chair for a little relaxation time. You're encouraged to maintain proper posture and place your hands in your lap. If you'd like, close your eyes and take a few deep breaths. Imagine your favorite person, place, or thing; think about anything that brings you joy and gratitude. With a smile on your face, slowly blink your eyes open, take one last deep breath, and celebrate the positive work you just completed for your body and mind!

LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

ittle Free Library started as a grassroots effort to inspire the love of reading. In 2009, Todd Bol of Hudson, Wisconsin, built a model of a one-room schoolhouse as a tribute to his mother. She was a teacher who loved to read. He filled the box with books and put it on a post in his front yard. His neighbors and friends loved it, so he built several more and gave them away. The premise behind the project was "Take a book, leave a book."

By 2010, the name Little Free Library was established, and a nonprofit organization had been started. Through Little Free Library book exchanges, millions of books are exchanged each year, increasing access to books for readers of all ages and backgrounds.

Dunedin has 14 Little Free Libraries throughout the city. One of those honors the memory of Del Miezio's wife Sharon and is sponsored by their sons Adam and Peter. You can find it at the law office of Freeborn & Freeborn at

360 Monroe St. Del says his wife was an avid reader and very instrumental in establishing our Lake Highlander library. Adam and Peter wanted to honor their mother by bringing the joy of books to others in our community. This is the only Little Free Library in Dunedin on private property.



POOR MAN'S BURRITO BOWLS

These easy, no-frills burrito bowls are super-fast and affordable.

Ingredients


- 2 cups uncooked rice
- 2 cans of black beans
- 1 can Mexicorn (or regular corn)
- ½ tsp cumin
- ½ tsp garlic powder
- 1 16 oz. jar salsa
- 6 oz. Velveeta Cheese (or fresh shredded cheese if available)

Instructions

- 1. Cook rice according to package directions.
- 2. While the rice is cooking, make the beans. Add both cans of black beans (undrained) to a small sauce pot, along with the cumin and garlic powder. Heat over medium heat, stirring often, until heated through.
- 3. Once the rice is cooked, build the bowls. Add one cup of cooked rice, ½ cup warm black beans, ½ cup corn, 1/3 cup of salsa, and ad 1 oz. sliced Velveeta or shredded cheese (about ¼ cup) to each bowl.

"Thank you," says Fred.






