And, I will take it to the RCS pantry. Last spring we took 150 pounds......Every little bit helps!!!



Veteran's Corner

his month I would like to talk about a few items I missed last Month on Flag Etiquette Do's and Don'ts:

When a flag is so worn it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be
destroyed by burning in a dignified manner. You can also take the flag to the Elks, VFW,
American Legion or other Veterans Organization; also some Boy Scout Units will take them.

Displaying the Flag Indoors

- When on display, the flag is accorded the place of honor, always positioned to its own right. Place it to the right of the speaker or staging area or sanctuary. Other flags should be to the left.
- The flag of the United States of America should be at the center and at the highest point of the group when a number of flags of states, localities, or societies are grouped for display.
- When one flag is used with the flag of the United States of America and the staffs are crossed, the flag of the United States is placed on its own right with its staff in front of the other flag.
- When displaying the flag against a wall, vertically or horizontally, the flag's union (stars) should be at the top, to the flag's own right, and to the observer's left.
- When placed on a staff the U.S, Flag must be placed above all other flags.
- When displayed with other flags the U.S. Flag goes to the observers left.
- When placed on a podium the flag should be placed on the speakers' right.

Veteran Suicides 35 PER DAY???

From 16 veteran suicides per day five years ago, to 18, to 20 and finally to 22 per day in 2013. Unfortunately, the scandal-plagued Veterans Administration has gone out of its way to make the vet suicide rate disappear from public view and hasn't issued any new statistics for two years. In reality, the veteran suicide rate is estimated at 35 per day by many veterans groups and even many impartial observers. The discrepancy comes from the fact that the VA only counts the suicides of veterans enrolled in VA programs at the time of their self-inflicted death. The veterans who kill themselves awaiting VA services and benefits, often over a year, and those that don't enroll at all increases that number to 35 per day. I am very interested in the correlation of their deaths with the medications dispensed by the VA. Hopefully the loss of our brothers and sisters will be dramatically reduced in the near future!

Congressman David Jolley is doing the following:

With veterans dying by suicide at a heartbreaking rate, we need to take a hard look at all possible factors in order to help prevent these tragedies. It is critical that we understand whether

there is any impact of certain psychiatric drugs prescribed for issues like P.T.S.D., depression or traumatic brain injuries, on the decision of a veteran to take their own life.

That is why he has introduced legislation requiring the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to conduct a review of veteran suicide deaths over the past five years. The bipartisan legislation, called the *Veteran Suicide Prevention Act* (H.R. 4640), would study the medications prescribed to veterans at the time of their death by suicide.

Specifically, the *Veteran Suicide Prevention Act* would require the VA to record the total number of veterans who have died by suicide during the past five years, compile a comprehensive list of the medications prescribed to and found in the systems of such veterans at the time of their deaths, and report which Veterans Health Administration facilities have disproportionately high rates of psychiatric drug prescription and suicide among veterans treated at those facilities. The VA would then be required to submit to Congress a publicly available report on the results of their review, along with their plan of action for improving the safety and well-being of veterans.




