



DID YOU KNOW?

As a reminder to new residents, current LHOA Members and those who have not joined the <u>deadline</u> for the 2020 membership <u>renewal</u> (\$15 a year) is December 31st 2020. A small insurance policy premium. Without these funds, the Association will have limited resources to meet its mandates. LHOA will have representatives at the weekly coffee if they resume, monthly board meetings and the December Member meeting. Also at our homes found in the inside page of the Voice.

What are the LHOA mandates? Be prepared to purchase the park within 90 days of receiving a letter stating that the park is being sold for a different use then a mobile home park. Members have the only vote! Second, the Board requests a meeting with the park owner or representative with 90 days of receiving the rental increase and property tax pass-on plus any issues effecting a majority of members (usually maintenance concerns.) And lastly and no less important be available to Members who have question or issues and desiring information. In your corner as it is the same as ours. LHOA is Florida registered corporation, files taxes and maintains that status each year. One of the few rental HOA's in the county that are incorporated.

LHOA is a member of the FMO (Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida.) The FMO is our only lobbying group looking out for resident/owners of all types of manufactured homes in the Florida Statehouse. Park owners have their own lobbying group. Individuals can also join the FMO and do. Depends on how you view your investment.

The LHOA Board now has 7 Director, a full complement, and many thanks for the recent additions and your commitment to the community. The complete register of Officers and Directors is in the front of the Voice and posted on the HOA section of the resident's bulletin board in the laundry/PO box room.

Join and maintain your LHOA membership no matter if full time or seasonal.



VETERAN'S CORNER

Teterans and Gold Star Families will be granted free access to national parks, wildlife

refuges and other Federal lands managed by the Department of the Interior starting on Veterans Day this year and every day onward.

"With the utmost respect and gratitude, we are granting Veterans and Gold Star Families free access to the iconic and treasured lands they fought to protect starting this Veterans Day and every single day thereafter," said Secretary of the Interior David L. Bernhardt.



Entrance fees for the National Park Service and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and standard amenity recreation fees for the Bureau of Land Management and the Bureau of Reclamation sites will be waived for Veterans and Gold Star Families. They will have free access to approximately 2,000 public locations spread out across more than 400 million acres of public lands, which host activities to fit any lifestyle, from serene to high octane, including hiking, fishing, paddling, biking, hunting, stargazing and climbing.

Many Department managed lands have direct connections to the American military, such as frontier forts, Cold War sites, battlefields, national cemeteries, and memorials. These special places pay tribute to our veterans and serve as reminders of their courage and sacrifice throughout the history of our nation, from Minuteman National Historic Park where colonists stood in defense of their rights, to Yellowstone National Park, which was protected from vandalism and poaching by the 1st U.S. Cavalry before the National Park Service was established, to Mount Rushmore where modern warriors attend reenlistment ceremonies.

Details on program

For purposes of this program, a Veteran is identified as an individual who has served in the United States Armed Forces, including the National Guard and Reserves, and is able to present one of the following forms of identification:

- Department of Defense Identification Card
- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)
- Veteran ID Card
- · Veterans designation on a state-issued U.S. driver's license or identification card

Gold Star Families are next of kin of a member of the United States Armed Forces who lost his or her life in a "qualifying situation," such as a war, an international terrorist attack, or a military operation outside of the United States while serving with the United States Armed Forces

A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #29

Defully everyone has survived the first dose of holiday dinners. Certainly different this year. I remember my parents, Uncles and Aunts, talking about trying to celebrate during the WW2 years with rationing and many shortages. Not to mention many who were thousands of miles away from home and some never to return. I remember why we said our blessings at the dinner table.

In the November issue I had promised to begin laying out over the next several months on how our bodies were designed relating to food and exercise (movement.) At the end, my goal is help in understanding how

we were designed, how that compares to our lives now and lastly how to start a change. Easy and hard at the same time.

Our human story probably wasn't one single day in time but between 200-350,000 years ago, we as humans (Homo sapiens) finally rolled of the assembly line of life. That assembly line had actually begun eons before we landed. I wasn't there.

Our body (all of it) was specifically designed to survive each and every day. Not a very simple task. Basically we were male and female, thin or muscular depending on the abundance of food and amount of movement needed to find food each and every day. Our skin was purposely dark in the beginning to limit the amount of a necessary vitamin, (D), produced with help by the sun. We were very strong, athletic, could climb trees and walk for miles. We also didn't speak much because there wasn't much of a language. We were built to survive and surely did.

Food was very abundant and mostly year round. Food is really packaged sugar that becomes energy with oxygen for every cell in our body to do a specific job (including fat believe it or not.) day and some from fat to sustain us. Food was very abundant. So we ate. Probably sat for a bit as we do now after eating a meal. We were feeling happy. **Then!** We did something **absolutely extraordinary**, we stood up and walked farther on. For our next meal! We walked (moved!) This sequence happened every 3-4 hours throughout the day. Somewhere close to dusk we began to find the same or another safe place to sleep which was our only protection. Curfew was darn early then! Next day, you guessed it, same plan. Day after day. It was our quest! We are here because the search for food and safety was relentless. Brought us to almost every corner of Mother Earth.

Next month we look at what has gone wrong for many of us. I ask each of you to see how your day compares to what was described above.
