



YOU NEED TO KNOW!

f you are new to Lincolnshire, a current Member or haven't helped in a year or so please take the opportunity to join or renew your Homeowner's Association membership. Current Lyearly assessment is \$15. Board listings are on the laundry room bulletin board.

The Annual Member meeting is on February 18th at 7 PM. At the January meeting Members wishing to nominate another member as a candidate for election to the Board may do so. Members may contact the Secretary and nominate themselves by February 12th. Deadline is 15 days prior to the Annual meeting allowing ballots to be mailed to Member park lots. The election of Directors will occur at the Annual Meeting on February 18th. As a reminder, in corporate elections, Members vote on Directors and the Directors elect the Officers. Different then social or other types of associations.

The January, February and March Member meetings are required by the LHOA by-laws. Members are strongly encouraged to attend. Come a bit early as Member sign-in is required.

LHOA has a total of 7 Director positions of which there is a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary. The current LHOA BOD has 4 Directors and thus 3 less than desired. The following is a narrative on the importance of having a full Board representing the Membership. The Board can accommodate both full time residents and seasonal. Email unlimited calling has made this possible!

A board of directors is a requirement for a homeowners association to function properly. Whether that HOA is a "Tenet" like Lincolnshire or where the Board actually manages the property like homes, condos and resident owned mobile homes parks. These elected volunteer officials are responsible for being in compliance with their by-laws, state statues (ours is FL 723.) Board training is a requirement and class cost is reimbursed. Without a capable board, their mission can quickly decline. The bylaws of an association give all the information regarding a board of directors, election procedures, the number of Directors, officer positions, and terms will all vary from association to association.

The board is elected from and by the Members at the annual meeting. The bylaws and statutes list how the election should be conducted. LHOA has staggered Director re-election to 3 and 4.

Once a board is elected by their peers, the board members will convene to elect the officers, usually during the first board meeting following the annual meeting. Associations are required to have a president, secretary, and treasurer and all officers' terms are limited to one year. Meaning, if a board member was elected to a two year term, they could be elected to secretary for the first year, and following the next annual meeting be elected to president for the second year of their term. Some bylaws and statutes allow the positions of secretary and treasurer to be held by the same person. In cases where there are fewer officer positions than board members, it is Continued on page 31

A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #18

ast month I went over how we as humans were designed to live successfully on Earth thousands of years ago. Just like when we buy flowers the sticker tells us how much sun is best. Our sticker said "best lived on Earth."

This month is about how we get everything from what we swallow (or should swallow) for energy. Energy is the goal for every one of our cells including fat so they can do their job, whatever it is. Nerve cells to conduct information, muscle cells to flex and contract, skin cells to mature and replace what just fell off us and the list goes on.

99% of everything we swallow turns to sugar! The better question is how fast. Almost pure sugar like candy, cookies, pies (you get the drift here) are broken down in the stomach and small intestine. Then absorbed into our blood in less than 10 minutes or even seconds. Yikes! Fruits especially grapes, oranges are just like pure sugar. Starches like pasta, white bread, potatoes take just a bit longer like 20 minutes. Whole grains in some breads and cereals take about 40 minutes. Vegetables (greens) take up to 45 minutes to get into our blood. Meat (animal, fish, and poultry) are very dense food and take from 45-60 minutes to get broken down into sugar and absorbed. When we eat combination foods like a casserole each food will take its own time to be converted to sugar. The term "balanced meal" essentially means a meal that has all the food groups and in total takes almost an hour to be completely broken down in to sugar and absorbed in the blood. Hence the term "blood sugar."

Sugars are absorbed starting in our stomach and all the way down our small intestine. We start preparing the food for conversion in to sugar in our mouths by chewing and saliva production. Chewing our food is a big deal! We are a human blender.

Our stomach further treats our food and the small intestine completes the job of breaking almost all we eat into sugar. Sugar from our food races (I mean races) through the lining of our gut into many small blood vessels. The sugar attaches to red blood cells and floats freely in the blood circulating to every, and I mean every cell in our body. I will talk about what happens when our cells don't get "fresh sugar" every 3-4 hours next month.

So how does the sugar get from the blood into the cell to make energy? Insulin (a hormone and another big deal!) Insulin propels the sugar into each living cell 24/7/365 days. More on insulin next month too.



Veterans Targeted in Benefits Scams

T.S. veterans who receive calls or recorded messages claiming

to be from "veteran's services" should have their guard up.

According to reports by the Leader-Herald Opens in New Window in Saratoga Springs, NY, and KARE11 Opens in New Window, an NBC station in Minneapolis, scam callers are attempting to elicit financial and other personal information from veterans. Callers may tell vets there is a new type of veteran's benefit related to home loans. The reports say the scammers use caller ID spoofing to deceive their intended victims. The scammers often leave voice messages, following a script that goes something like this: Your VA profile was flagged for two potential benefits to the changes in the VA program. These are time sensitive entitlements. Please call us back at your earliest convenience. The voicemail includes a fraudulent call-back number for "veterans services." Potential victims who call the number are offered "benefits," such as loan modifications to their mortgages, then asked for personal information, including social security numbers, dates of birth and bank account numbers. Scammers who gain access to such information can use it to steal money from bank accounts or credit cards, or sell the information to other bad actors for use in identity theft fraud. Other recurring phone scams preying on veterans include the "Update Your Military File" scam, the "Veteran Charity" scam and the "Veterans Choice Program" scam, according to an article in Forbes Opens in New Window. An AARP article about veterans scams Opens in New Window reports nearly 80 percent of veterans they surveyed reported being targeted by scams related to their military service. If you get a call that offers any of the above "services," hang up immediately. If you get a voice message, write down the callback number and contact law enforcement to report the scam. Also, file a complaint with the FCC at consumercomplaints.fcc.gov. Any unexpected calls requesting personal or financial information should always raise a red flag. Learn more about how to recognize avoid caller ID spoofing, phone scams, and unwanted robocalls or robotexts.



Simple tips for a healthier heart

lose to 2,200 people die each day in the United States because of cardiovascular problems. That's one every 40 seconds.

Here's some advice from the WMC Action News website on how to keep your heart healthy:

- Laugh a lot. Laughter dilates your blood vessels, increases blood flow, and lowers your blood pressure.
- Snuggle. Hugging releases oxytocin, a hormone that relieves stress and can reduce blood pressure.
- Get a pet. A University of Maryland study found that survivors of a heart attack who had a dog were eight times more likely to be alive a year after their attack.
- Get the right amount of sleep. Both oversleeping and getting less than six hours of sleep a night raises your heart attack risk. Aim for about eight hours every night.
- Drink coffee. Studies suggest that caffeine can stabilize your heart rhythm if you have an abnormal heart rate. Check with your doctor.
- Move around. Standing and moving around one hour per day can reduce cardiovascular disease risk in women by 25%, according to a University of California, San Diego, study.


