

#### **Hurricane Preparedness**

Hurricane season is once again upon us here in Florida. Lincolnshire is fortunate to have a lot of new residents living with us year round. Many however have not experienced a hurricane season. This article is just a reminder with some helpful hints for those who may need it. We have been enjoying a 10 year calm, but don't be fooled. While we have seen many quiet storm seasons and minor glancing blows, remember it is always a possibility here. 2004 started off slowly with the first storm not even named until July 31, but shortly after came 6 weeks of Charley, Frances, Ivan, and Jeanne. Let's stay prepared here.

Know your evacuation zone and shelter. Lincolnshire is not in an evacuation zone based on water, surge, however all mobile homes, regardless of their elevation above ground must be evacuated. This means evacuation at a category 1 storm. Remember it is illegal to stay in a home under a mandatory evacuation order. Therefor it is important for everyone to have an evacuation plan. If you plan to use a shelter, make sure you know where it is, and give yourself

time to be sure to get there. If you have a pet, only certain shelters are equipped to handle your needs. The closest to Lincolnshire is Oak Grove Elementary School on Belcher Road. You must register your pet in advance. This shelter is also equipped for the handicapped

In the event that evacuation is not necessary, and also after the storm has passed, electrical service and other service problems may arise due to the storm. Have a plan in place for your everyday needs during this time. Stay current with news & information using radio (cell towers may be out), be sure to have plenty of batteries, water, and non-perishable food supplies. You may not be able to travel around to purchase these things after the storm.



know how many of the residents here at Lincolnshire rely on us canine friends to help them stay in touch with others in the community. Here is a story I ran across that shows how some of the humans can help each other while also helping a canine friend gain a life-partner. I call it The Gift of Raising a Puppy

It started off just like any other day–Jeff LoParo sat down to breakfast and opened the paper, but Jeff didn't realize that reading the paper that morning in 2013 was going to change his life. "I think I'm one of the only people that still reads a printed paper!" laughs Jeff. "That is how I first heard about Canine Companions for Independence; I read a story in the paper about puppy raising."

Jeff had been around dogs all of his life. His family raised show dogs and his dad was an American Kennel Club judge. "I love training dogs in obedience and I liked the idea of having a buddy for my black lab, but didn't want a 14-year commitment," Jeff says. Raising a puppy for a year and a half appealed to him, so he applied online. Three months later he received Gordo. Gordo was the first puppy that Jeff raised for Canine Companions. Now in professional training, Gordo will be meeting several people with disabilities this spring to hopefully find his match and change their life forever.

Jeff, a former marine fighter pilot and self-described big guy, says "Even thinking about Gordo graduating makes me want to cry, because I'm so happy for him and what he'll go on to do." While raising Gordo, Jeff attended a few graduation ceremonies. "At the first graduation I went to, a mother with a son with autism was receiving a Canine Companions assistance dog. The mother explained to the audience that her son's autism was very severe. Doctors had told her that if they couldn't get her son to come out of his shell and connect. His behavior would likely worsen as he got older and he'd be in danger of self-injurious behavior. Now the boy has made a connection with his assistance dog. He has a buddy now. That dog potentially saved this kid's life. And as a puppy raiser we have the ability to make this possible."

Now Jeff is raising his second puppy, Waylon. "The time I spend with the dogs and the other puppy raisers...this process and these connections I have with these dogs is life-changing-the dogs do so much more for us than we do for the dogs," says Jeff. "And the impact is so far reaching. Not just one life, but many lives. It just makes you feel so good about what you are doing." Wickett



#### Ancient bones offer clues to evolution

S cientists may have discovered a new human ancestor to go along with "Lucy," the 3.2 million-year-old Australopithecus afarensis female from eastern Africa. Dubbed "Little Foot" because of his small bones, this specimen was unearthed in South Africa in the early 1990s. His skeleton was almost completely preserved after falling down a narrow cave shaft and dying there. Whether Little Foot was a relative of Lucy's or a different pre-human species has been a subject of debate among anthropologists, but a new dating process suggests that Little Foot lived and died some 3.67 million years ago, close to the same time as Lucy.

Although some scientists dispute the accuracy of the dating technique, if it holds up it suggests an evolutionary link between different species of Australopithecus in ancient Africa, as well as evidence of where in Africa modern humans began to develop.

### Birds do it, bees do it, and so do amorous mice

From time immemorial, men have wooed their lady loves with romantic (if sometimes off-key) music. Now scientists from Duke University believe that love songs aren't just for humans. Mice also sing to females they hope to attract, although they aren't likely using Barry White.



Instead, mice rely on high-pitched sounds outside the range of human hearing, using specific tunes when they smell a potential mate and different ones when they finally set eyes on her. The songs are louder and composed of more complex sounds when they smell a female scent, and get simpler—but longer—when they finally meet face to face. The complex songs seem to attract females, although what specifically draws them close is still uncertain.


