

FROM THE DESK of the PRESIDENT

Te are hoping that everyone is still safe and not going crazy from all the pandemic scares, notifications and new rules. As most of you have figured out, with all the lock downs, and new rules that will be in effect for an unknown time in the future, things here in Lincolnshire will not be the same as in the past. With the phased in openings in Florida, this past week has seen over 1,000 new cases daily for the past 7 days, including new cases just down the street from us in the county jail. (hope none of our people end up there anyway. LOL)

The pool is open as of this writing at 100% capacity,but no organized activities yet. The clubhouse and fitness center are still closed. We have no information about rules that will be in effect regarding the re-opening of the fitness center. As for the clubhouse, we have no timeline, but we do have some idea of what will be required for opening. We will still be allowed only 50 people in any activity, and groups of 10 are max for any areas as required by the CDC. "social distancing" will be in effect, and with that, we will not be able to keep our long rows of tables. If the rule of 50 changes to 50% capacity, remember in the case of the clubhouse that would be "Seating" capacity, not Fire Dept. capacity, so our numbers would still be required to be less than usual. Buffets will no longer be allowed, masks are probably going to be required, and maybe even temperature checks. With all this in mind, please remain patient as we try to reorganize events for the season. Summer events will remain cancelled at least through mid-July, as we will need time to make purchases, sell tickets & re-establish entertainment. We hope that dances will be able to resume in the winter, but that is also still in question due to distancing requirements. The social committee will be working hard to figure out what they will need to do to keep Lincolnshire the active park that it has always been. Watch for their notices and posts.

Lots of things will be changing, but Lincolnshire is a great community & I know that everyone here will do whatever is necessary to keep it a fun place to live. We will find a way to get through all this and be back in full force as soon as possible. Things may take a little longer to get going in the fall, as rumors say that the northern borders will remain closed until the end of the year. Hopefully that will change, and our snowbirds will return as soon as possible in the fall. Please remember also that if you are in the park now, guests should be registered in the office as has always been in the park rules, but it is <u>now</u> even more important and visitors from national "hot spots" still are required to self-isolate for 14 days upon arrival.



YOU NEED TO KNOW!

s a reminder LHOA is a tenet association and doesn't own or manage the park. However, we take our Florida statutes seriously. In the event the park is put up for sale for a different purpose LHOA is obligated to begin immediately in securing arrangements for purchasing within 90 days. Membership will be closed and only Members can vote to purchase or not. Secondly, we have the right and do request a meeting with the park owner on rent increases, property tax pass-on assessments and issues effecting a majority of Members. The park owner has by letter delayed this until a future time. LHOA Directors receive mandatory training when elected or appointed to the Board. Though not a state mandate the Directors are an excellent source of assistance and information to the benefit of Members. Our telephone numbers are in the inside cover of the Voice and also on the resident's bulletin board on the left



side in the laundry room.

LHOA is incorporated and each year we submit and pay for continued corporate status with the state. Most rental HOA's are not incorporated. The value of LHOA incorporation can't be underestimated. This incorporation resulted from very hard work by a few of very forward thinking residents of Lincolnshire 26 years ago.

The Directors and Officers not only ensure our corporate compliance they also ensure we submit our yearly taxes to the State. Maintaining our yearly membership in the FMO (our lobbyist in Tallahassee) is critical in supporting efforts to ensure our voices are heard at the state level.

Obviously LHOA cannot maintain its mandates without membership. Ensuring LHOA has the reserves to begin the process of park purchase if every necessary must be kept at the ready along with the simple expenses of administration.

Keeping guard on our rights along with responsibilities as homeowners is not often visible but always present. Directors/Officers must have the support of homeowners. Join if not a member or forgot to renew (not part of just living here or owning a home.) \$15 a year is a very valuable insurance premium.

LHOA does have an opening for a Director. Excellent way to serve your community. Call our President if interested.

LHOA has been in existence for 25 years! Board meetings are generally monthly and Member meetings are monthly from December to March. Members are strongly encouraged to attend.

A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #25

his month's dose of nursing starts with what the heck happened to my 5 star skin that I had just a few years ago. I know I brought my skin in its entirety down from Vermont when I moved here 6 years ago. I don't mind the extra hairs and whiskers that emerge from places on my face and ears I never noticed before. The answer to that is I was working and just didn't have time to notice them. Hmmm.

Ok, back to skin. This will take 2 issues as important. Let's face the issue here, our skin

changes with age. It becomes thinner, loses fat, and no longer looks as plump and smooth as it once did. Our veins and bones can be seen more easily. Scratches, cuts, or bumps can take longer to heal. Years of sun tanning or being out in the sunlight for a long time may lead to wrinkles, dryness, age spots, and even cancer. But, there are things we can do to protect our skin and to make it feel and look better.

Dry Skin and Itching is number one of our complaints. Where and why? Often on our lower legs, elbows, and lower arms. Dry skin patches feel rough and scaly. Some reasons for dry skin: Not drinking enough liquids, spending too much time in the sun, being in very dry air conditioned

air, smoking, stress, and we do lose sweat and oil glands, which is common with our age.

Dry skin also can be caused by health problems, such as diabetes or kidney disease. Using too much soap, antiperspirant, or perfume and taking hot baths can make dry skin worse.

Some medicines can make skin itchy. Because older people have thinner skin, scratching can cause bleeding that may lead to infection.

Here are some easy ways to help dry, itchy skin: Use moisturizers, like lotions, creams, or ointments, every day. Take fewer baths or showers and use milder soap. Warm water is less drying than hot water. Don't add bath oil to your water. It can make the tub too slippery. Falls are a common occurrence for us. And try using a humidifier, an appliance that adds moisture to a room.

Bruising happens more easily than younger people. It can take longer for these bruises to heal. Some medicines or illnesses may also cause bruising. In Florida we often don't wear full cloth covering. Talk to your doctor if you see bruises and don't know how you got them, especially on parts of your body usually covered by clothing.

Over time, skin begins to wrinkle. Things in the environment, like ultraviolet (UV) light from the sun, can make the skin less elastic. Gravity can cause skin to sag and wrinkle. Certain habits, like smoking, also can wrinkle the skin. A lot of claims are made about how to make wrinkles go away. Most of them don't seem to work and a big waste of our money. Some methods can be painful or even dangerous, and many must be done by a doctor. Talk with a doctor specially trained in skin problems, called a dermatologist.

Age spots, once called "liver spots," are flat, brown spots often caused by years in the sun. They are bigger than freckles and commonly show up on areas like the face, hands, arms, back, and feet. Using a broad-spectrum sunscreen that helps protect against two types of the sun's rays (UVA and UVB) may prevent more age spots. Of importance is to consider using sunscreen even in our homes as sun simply gets in! Many Medicare Advantage plans over the counter benefits have no cost sunscreen. Order it and use it.

Skin tags are small, usually flesh-colored growths of skin that have a raised surface. They become common as people age, especially for women. I have several. They are most often found on the eyelids, neck, and body folds such as the armpit, chest, and groin. Age spots and skin tags are harmless, although sometimes skin tags can become irritated. If your age spots or skin tags bother you, talk to your doctor about having them removed. Easily removed without any anesthesia.

Skin cancer is a very common type of cancer in the United States. We will focus on this next month. Put the sunscreen on the bathroom counter as step.







- Plastic sheeting and duct tape










- Moist towelettes, disinfecting wipes and garbage bags




