NO BAKE ENERGY BITES

Recipe by gimmesomeoven.com

These No-Bake Energy Bites are easy to make, full of feel-good ingredients, and irresistibly delicious!

Ingredients

- 1 cup old fashioned oats
- 2/3 cup toasted shredded coconut
- ½ cup Creamy peanut butter
- ½ cup Ground flaxseed
- ½ cup chocolate chips
- 1/3 cup honey
- 1 tablespoon chia seeds
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions

- 1. Stir all ingredients together in a large mixing bowl until thoroughly combined.
- 2. Cover the mixing bowl and chill in the refrigerator for 1-2 hours, or until the mixture is chilled. (This will help the mixture stick together more easily.)
- 3. Roll mixture into 1-inch balls.
- 4. Enjoy immediately! Or refrigerate in a sealed container for up to 1 week or freeze for up to 3 months.

POOR MAN'S BURRITO BOWLS

These easy, no-frills burrito bowls are super-fast and affordable.

Ingredients

- 2 cups uncooked rice
- 2 cans of black beans
- 1 can Mexicorn (or regular corn)
- ½ tsp cumin
- ½ tsp garlic powder
- 1 16 oz. jar salsa
- 6 oz. Velveeta Cheese (or fresh shredded cheese if available)



- 1. Cook rice according to package directions.
- 2. While the rice is cooking, make the beans. Add both cans of black beans (undrained) to a small sauce pot, along with the cumin and garlic powder. Heat over medium heat, stirring often, until heated through.
- 3. Once the rice is cooked, build the bowls. Add one cup of cooked rice, ½ cup warm black beans, ½ cup corn, 1/3 cup of salsa, and ad 1 oz. sliced Velveeta or shredded cheese (about ½ cup) to each bowl.

Test Out Your Green Thumb

You can check plant tags to find out how to care for your plants. Tip: If you're creating a container to add curb-appeal or a little extra pizzazz to your home, think "Thriller, Filler and Spiller". Select a tall plant to add height to your arrangement (thriller), select a medium size plant to add fullness to the container (filler), and pick a plant that will eventually trail over the edge of the container (spiller).





A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #23

ast month we brought this series on diabetes up to current treatments including medications for diabetes. Some people do suffer from low sugar or hypoglycemia. I can discuss that in another article.

Diabetes is a bit like having a toddler living with you. You can't let the child run the house. I will admit to you all that the biggest obstacle to getting and keeping blood sugar levels where our body was designed cannot be done solely by relying on medications alone. Best analogy I can think of is trying to push a car when it is in reverse. Remember we can eat most anything if good healthy food. The real questions is how much and what am I going to do when the sugar has been absorbed in the blood and circulating to every cell. All diabetic medications need us to help. The results can be phenomenal when we and our medications are working together.

Ok, let's cover the medications. The first and most basic medication helps the pancreas excrete more insulin. Remember insulin kicks the sugar found in the blood in to each and every cell, 24/7. Metformin is the most common. Our pancreas ages and just simply gets tired even without the constant stress of too much sugar. Upside to these medications is more sugar gets to where it belongs and blood sugar drops. There are two downsides, one is we are asking the pancreas who is already tired to work harder and for at least 14 days we feel lousy. Why do we feel lousy? Our blood sugar hasn't been more normal for a long time, maybe years? Our body is simply saying I don't like this even if it is better. Many people stop taking the medication and don't even tell their doctor. Sad but true. I would tell my diabetic patients who just started on oral meds to call me if they initially feel lousy.

The second most common medications not only help the pancreas make more insulin but also help the sugar get into each body cell easier. Many diabetics over several years begin to have problems just getting more sugar from the blood in to each cell. Sort of like becoming insensitive or ignoring the needed sugar. Again many people feel lousy and stop. Sad again.

There are newer medications that slow down the absorption of sugar in the small intestine (remember that is where almost all the sugar in foods we eat gets broken down and absorbed.)

When oral medications along with doing the hard work of what to eat, when to eat and movement to use the sugar seem to fail and the blood sugar remains high, the physician will then use injectable and still the only way to get real insulin. Supplemental insulin either once a day or more often work with oral medications to get the blood sugar down to prevent further damage to our now fragile arteries.

These are, according to the American Diabetic Association the absolute best "Cut Down's": <u>Cut down</u> on sugar; <u>Cut down</u> on processed meat especially salted varieties; <u>Cut down</u> on energy dense, processed food - such as crisps, cakes, biscuits and pastries and finally <u>Cut down</u> on alcohol. Chew well my friends!

VETERAN'S CORNER

Thope this finds you all in good health, for those of you who have access to MacDill AFB per order of the Pentagon you will be required to wear a mask while on base. Plus, you must use the social distancing guidelines.

The Military has just sent about 1,100 Military doctors, nurses and medical aides to New York City hospitals. Many of them will help out in overburdened hospitals where the staffs are



exhausted from fighting the daily battle against the coronavirus. But the bulk of them will help out at the Javits Center which has been converted by the Army Corps of Engineers into a makeshift hospital for 2,900 non-COVID 19 patients. But before any of those patients arrived, the decision was made to convert Javits to take in coronavirus-positive patients in light of the escalating crisis. So, in essence the United States military will be running the largest hospital in the United States.

Furthermore, on Friday, Governor Cuomo of NY signed an executive order to have the National Guard go to hospitals and health centers around the state and take any unused ventilators and other needed medical supplies so they can be utilized by other hospitals in dire need. He says he cannot simply cannot allow them to sit there when they could be saving lives.

On a sad note the Defense Department has confirmed that they have been asked to provide up to 100,000 body bags and have them readied for shipment in response to a grim request to help states with burials as the numbers of deaths from the coronavirus continues to escalate. The bags are typically 94-by-38-inch body bags and are usually sent to war zones for combat casualties. The need for burial assistance is becoming more and more evident in New York where the death toll is rising higher every day. Right now, the bodies are being stored in refrigerated trucks, but the pentagon is considering utilizing the National Guards Fatality Support and Recovery Teams to assist with burials, possibly to prevent spread of the virus if requested by the States to do so.

Not sure if you received a request for callback to the Military? Unfortunately, they are looking for more recently retired veterans with any type of Medical MOS background. It's not clear how many they will be calling back but they were overwhelmed by the response. They have already received a response from about 20,000 after just a couple of days of reaching out. Now HRO will have to validate all the applications and make your that they are still valid for bringing them on and placing them in medical units.

Veterans who are concerned they may have symptoms of COVID-19 (Coronavirus), flu or cold are encouraged to contact the VISN 8 Clinical Contact Center at 1-877-741-3400 (toll Free). Clinical staff provide 24/7 virtual care and support, including nurse advice and triage.
