Of course the board members always get blamed for this. When we start up our events again,





HOA has begun Board of Director meetings in September. Board meetings are centered on business though members are always welcome. Non-members can also join LHOA after the meeting. Members may and encouraged to speak to an agenda item or after the agenda has cleared. LHOA will have two Member meetings, January and February (annual) in 2021. Dates will be in the Voice for Board and Member meetings whenever possible and posted on the bulletin board in the laundry/post room as required by law. Attendees must adhere to the park's guidelines on mask use and distancing.

The 2021 LHOA membership enrollment will start on October 1st. The yearly assessment for membership is \$15. Small premium for established mandates your LHOA has and takes very seriously. Payment can be made to Dennis Hornsby, Membership Chairman, at Lot 112 or Allyn Webert at Lot 1438. Checks can be made out to LHOA. Cash is ok as a receipt will be given. New members will receive a membership card and current LHOA bylaws.

LHOA has an attorney, often called our legal representative or legal agent. This addition of legal expertise is a hallmark of LHOA. Many Florida 55+ rental mobile home parks do not have an attorney, incorporated as LHOA or include maintaining their services in the annual *Continued on page 19*

budget (if they even have one.)

When you attend the annual meeting you can see his services are a major expenditure compared to tax preparation, maintaining our corporate certification and administrative supplies. They are expensive so you might as well have the best. LHOA does.

The LHOA utilizes our attorney for legal assistance of our mandated activities. The attorney assists when we prepare for, when needed, and attend our yearly meeting with the park owner's representatives on rental increases, property tax pass-on charges or major issues with the owner. Also, ensuring our amendments to the LHOA by-laws meet stringent State guidelines is imperative for a corporation. LHOA is a non-profit corporation and does not own or operate the park. The park owner usually has his attorney present during any negotiations when they occur.

Secondly, the LHOA, its members and even nonmember homeowners, as a group, can be subject to complaints, or a lawsuit from a citizen or the city, county and federal government, either in conjunction with the park owner or solo. Having an ongoing relationship with our attorney means the LHOA seldom comes into a legal need cold and not aware. The HOA gets a quick response each and every time. Invaluable! As needed in the fall of 2019 with 2 federal complaints that stated LHOA owned and operated the park. Both defeated though expensive.

We live in a society that thinks nothing of seeking legal or government counsel without understanding or conducting the research needed to fully understand the legal issue at hand or the potential ramifications of poor decisions. The LHOA must always be prepared to respond to each and every occasion.

This month's dose is everyone's favorite subject. Immunizations! Yup the season is upon us. We can expect to be notified and strongly encouraged to get our flu shot by November. We shouldn't forget that each pharmacy, primary care clinic and local health services will vie to provide each of us with whatever immunization we need. Getting our flu shot is critical in view of the Covid virus spread.

Almost all of us whether from other countries have since being a young child received all the various immunizations along the way. Anyone who served in the military probably has a shot record as long as mine. We received all of these shots because they were required not voluntary as some are now. My point here is that as baby boomers we have a habit of getting immunized. So don't stop now just because they "aren't required."

And did you know that when we get vaccinated, we also help protect our families and close friends here at Lincolnshire. Because of community immunity, vaccines help keep diseases from spreading to our friends, family and grandchildren. How often have we asked where is so and so today and told "they got whatever is going around and are really sick." Well what is going around may be the flu and preventable. The Covid virus further complicates this year.

I've gotten all my childhood vaccines. Why do I need more? As older adults we need vaccines for several reasons. Some vaccines are recommended only for adults, who are more at risk for certain diseases like shingles and pneumonia. Protection from childhood vaccines wears off over time so you need additional doses of certain vaccines to stay protected. You may not have gotten some of the newer vaccines that are now available. Some viruses, like the virus that causes the flu, can change over time. You may be at increased risk for diseases based on were

How do I know which vaccinations I've had and which ones I need? Do the best you can and at the very least ensure your current doctor has as much of a record as possible especially the last 10-15 years. If you can't find your record, ask your doctor if you should get some vaccinations again (I'm sure you wanted to read that!)

We should get flu vaccine every year. Covered by Medicare, VA, Medicare Part D plans, employer health plans, local no-cost health services and National Health Services. *There are 2 types of the yearly flu vaccine, one is regular and the other is a Higher Efficacy Dose for those over 65. The most often question I am asked about the flu shot is "when should I get it, wait for the vaccine to be better? "All the other vaccinations don't seem to have this issue. It's best to get vaccinated before flu season begins spreading in our and your home community. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies (the elements of our immune system that tackle the infections) to develop and protect against flu. CDC recommends that people get a flu vaccine by the end of October. Tally Ho!

Be brave and roll up your sleeve. Immunizations are given with the smallest needle known to mankind and sharp. Unlike my razor. Last item before I release you back to other articles. Please don't wear a tight long sleeve garment when you are getting shots. That's why nurses always carry scissors. Hmmm.

yourself from others. From my experience, it's hard not to social distance as you could kick or wack someone when you're exercising!


Water Facts

The military is ditching flimsy laminated paper-based ID cards for military retirees and dependents for an all-new card system: The Next Generation Uniform Services Identification Card.

According to a Defense Department announcement published Monday, the cards, which represent the first ID update for these military communities since 1993, will be more durable and more closely resemble the Common Access Cards, or CACs, used by active-duty troops and DoD civilians.

The new IDs are already in circulation: the military quietly began issuing them to retirees, reservists and dependent military family members July 31 at a few ID card facilities, according

to the DoD release.

The new USID cards are enhanced with an updated design and security features to deter counterfeiting and fraud, Michael Sorrento, director of the Defense Manpower Data Center, said in a statement. To date, only about 20 Real-Time Automated Personnel Identification Card System (RAPIDS) sites now offer the new cards; other sites await equipment upgrades in order to make them. All DoD USID card facilities are set to offer the IDs by December 2020, according to the release. The complete transition to new USID cards is targeted for January 2026.

This transition doesn't affect current card expiration dates and doesn't change the populations who are eligible to get the current USID cards.

In addition to dependents of active-duty troops and reservists and retirees and their dependents, those eligible for these DoD-recognized IDs include Medal of Honor recipients and their dependents and 100% disabled veterans and their dependents, among others. The cards facilitate access to military bases and to other exclusive facilities, such as commissaries and exchanges.

The COVID-19 pandemic has complicated the rollout of the new cards.

Sorrento advised that it would be better to wait to get the new card until next summer unless the holder's current one is expired. Applicants should call ahead for appointments to get the new USID cards.

In April, Pentagon officials announced that dependent and retiree cards set to expire in 2020 would be automatically extended through September in light of the pandemic, and changed policy to allow some ID updates and new enrollments to be done by mail. DoD is further developing the ID card process, Sorrento said in the release, and eyeing changes such as a mail-in ID process with online vetting, eliminating the requirement to apply in person at a RAPIDS site. 


