

As of this writing, we do not know the results of the proposed changes to the By-Laws or

I have found that avoidance is most effective when I avert my eyes from both the dog as well as the owner. I keep my eyes forward, and keep walking at a natural pace. This way my dog learns that when we see other dogs, we avoid rather then confront.

Don't crowd the dog while walking. If he feels trapped between us and the other dog, she may think there is no choice but to react aggressively. Don't stand still while trying to tug your dog away. Move away and she will come along with you. When meeting another dog, interrupt her every so often and get her to refocus on you. If your dog gets too obsessed to move away,

then try to block their view of the other dog.

Finally, don't expect too much too quickly. Make sure to treat and praise her very well, if she voluntarily engages in avoidance maneuvers around other dogs. This includes looking away from the direction of the other dog, smelling and exploring the environment or looking at us.

Treat and praise even for only a second. If our dog will not accept treats from us, then she is too far gone and it's best to move away. Treats only work when the dog is still thinking, and not operating on instinct.

1. HOHENFELS TRAINING AREA, Germany, Jan. 30, 2018 combat environment, the knowledge of where a threat is could mean the difference between life and death. The Army gains the upper hand in identifying where threats are with the use of a lightweight small unmanned aerial system, sUAS, called the RQ-11 Raven. Military policemen with the 287th Military Police Company, 97th Military Police Battalion, 89th Military Police Brigade based at Fort Riley, Kansas, are putting the Raven to use during the Allied Spirit

VIII exercise held here from Jan. 15-Feb. 5 and enhancing their skills from prior training. The Raven system provides soldiers the ability to view opposing forces, OPFOR, in their areas of operation. OPFOR are soldiers who play the role of the enemy for units conducting training at Hohenfels Training Area. The OPFOR provide units an experience as close to real combat as possible. "Having the ability to assess the terrain and situation before exposing troops to hazards is essential," said Army Sgt. 1st Class Joseph Rombold, a mentor for troops going through the training. "With the Raven system, you are able to locate and follow high-value targets from a distance without exposing yourself, giving you an advantage and the element of surprise." The Raven system is designed for rapid deployment and high mobility.. The sUAS has a range up to 10 kilometers from its launch point. "Once I launch the Raven into the air, it takes off," Ritter said. "I am able to control it and see where it's going through a remote control with a screen on it, showing me everything the Raven sees. No matter if its day or night -- if there's a threat, I'll be able to see it."

2. The Army's new handgun meets "all safety and operational requirements," officials said Wednesday, after a recently published report revealed several issues with the Sig Sauer-made weapon. Early evaluations of the Army's new handgun, the M17, last year showed test failures when the pistol was fired with the standard ball ammunition, stoppages, and double ejections. Those findings were revealed in a recently published report by the Defense Department's Office of the Director, Operational Test and Evaluation. The office reviews major programs across the Defense Department. The problems noted by the office had not been previously disclosed by

the Army or other entities involved in the Modular Handgun System's development. Though the report was compiled from April through September of last year, it was not sent to Congress nor publicly released until January. The Army selected the Sig Sauer handgun as its first new service-wide sidearm since the mid-1980s, replacingthe Beretta M9. The report notes that the Army intends to purchase 238,000 pistols, while the other three services may buy as many as 224,000 pistols under the same contract.

3. All Tricare users except active duty troops will soon see higher fees for prescription drugs received by mail or at off-base retail pharmacies. Prescriptions filled on-base will continue to be free. The changes impact all non-active duty Tricare pharmacy users who receive drugs from any off-base pharmacy or who use the mail-order system. The price increases were ordered by Congress as part of the 2018 National Defense Authorization act. Effective Feb. 1, a 90-day supply of generic drugs received through the system's Express Scripts mail-order pharmacy will be \$7, currently, those medications are free. Co-pays on brand name drugs received through the mail will go from \$20 to \$24 for brand name drugs and \$49 to \$53 for non-formulary ones. For prescriptions filled at retail pharmacies a 30-day supply for generic drugs will increase from \$10 to \$11, brand names will go from \$24 to \$28, and non-formulary ones will go from \$49 to \$53. Out of network pharmacy costs are also increasing. Users who buy drugs at those pharmacies or overseas must first meet their annual deductible, which vary by Tricare plan. Tricare Prime users pay a 50 percent cost share for the drug after their point of service fee. All other users except active duty troops will pay 20 percent of the total cost or \$24, whichever is more, for drugs on the formulary, and 20 percent of the cost or \$53, whichever is more, for off-formulary drugs. Active duty troops will be reimbursed for any out-of-network pharmacy fees.
