BULK TRASH PICKUP

By Lincolnshire office management

We are happy to announce that the City of Largo has agreed once again to return the bulk bin for pickup twice each month. It will be here on the <u>1ST AND 3RD TUESDAY</u> <u>ONLY of the month, and will be available for your bulk trash for <u>1 DAY ON</u> <u>EACH</u> of those weeks before pickup. Limiting the time in the park will cut down on any possible abuse by non-residents. While this abuse has not been proven it has been suspected in the past.</u>

Please adhere to the requirements as to what the city will allow to be placed in the bulk trash dumpster. If we have violations again, the **CITY WILL pull it out**, and **NOT** allow it to return, which will result in all bulk items needing to be hauled by the resident to the city's drop off station.

The bin can be used for discarding furniture, bulk landscape trimmings, construction waste, and similar items. **DO NOT place household trash, TV's computers & other electronics, paint & chemicals, tires or other automobile scrap in the bin.** These will result in fines and the discontinuance of the bulk bin.

If you see someone dumping unacceptable items, **<u>please</u>** let them know not to do so, and or report the abuse to the office. Again, if you see something, say something.

The "snowbird" season will soon be here. The pool, exercise room and clubhouse will begin to become very active. Your homeowners association has remained here and readying for the season too. Starting in the fall, both Board and Membership meetings will be posted on the calendar in the "Voice" and in the laundry room bulletin board along with the agendas. Information on when 2019 dues will start to be collected will be posted also. Association dues must be paid by December 31st 2018 for the 2019 year.

The Board also has an opening for a Director. You do not have to be a full time resident as the Board does not currently have a seasonal voice. Please consider and speak to Guy Webert, President, if interested in considering assisting the Board.

Association Membership and Board of Director Meetings

Florida Statute 723.078, provides that Homeowners' Associations are required to have two types of meetings: (1) Board of Directors meetings and (2) Membership Meetings.

"Board of Director Meetings" are defined in F.S. 723.078(2)(c) and states "Meetings of the Board of Directors and meetings of its committees at which a quorum is present shall be open to all members. Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be posted in a conspicuous place upon the park property at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance, except in an emergency. Notice of any meet¬ing in which assessments against members are to be made for any reason shall specifically contain a statement that assessments will be considered and the nature of such assessments.

"Membership Meetings" are defined in F.S. 723.078(2) (d) and states "Members shall meet at least once per each calendar year and the meeting shall be the annual meeting and all members of the Board shall be elected at the annual meeting unless the By-Laws provide for staggered terms"

723.078(2) (c)(4) provides Association Members the right to attend meetings of the Board of Directors and its committees and includes the right to speak at such meetings with reference to all designated agenda items. The Association's Board of Directors may adopt reasonable written rules governing the frequency, duration and manner of member statements.



VETERAN'S CORNER Robert Behm, Retired Army (Lot775)

Veterans of Foreign Wars Article on VA Mission Act of 2018



1. President Donald Trump on June 6 signed into law the VA MISSION Act of 2018(H.R. 5674). It gives veterans more access to health care and improves services throughout VA's s

access to health care and improves services throughout VA's system. It also includes a provision that has been a major VFW objective for years now: extending benefits to those who care for veterans - of all wars.

2. VFW is a big supporter of a VA program - the Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers - that gives caregivers a monthly stipend, respite care, mental and medical health care, as well as necessary training and certifications. But before the President enacted the new law, these benefits were only available for the caregivers of veterans who served after Sept. 11, 2001. VFW believes that family members who care for severely disabled veterans - of all wars - are deserving of these benefits. And we pursued this as one of VFW's priority goals.



- 3. VFW's Washington Office staff helped convince lawmakers of the critical needs of caregivers and, more importantly, that these needs are universal, regardless of what war a veteran served in. Once that provision was included, VFW was quick to give the bill its support. This historic legislation also addresses how the private sector can supplement VA health care. It is the result of years of. negotiating exactly what that role will be.
- 4. The MISSION (Maintaining Internal Systems and Strengthening Integrated Outside Networks) Act terminates the Veterans Choice Program, which offered veterans the option of choosing private care paid for by VA if they could not get a timely appointment at a VA facility. It will be phased out over the next year. In its place will be the Veterans Community Care Program, which will furnish hospital care, medical services and extended care services through certain non-VA providers for vets enrolled in VA's system. VFW members have made it clear that VA's health care system must be improved, not dismantled. This new law improves access to VA doctors while at the same time leveraging the capabilities of the private sector when VA can't offer that access.

NO TRICARE INCREASE FY 2019

- 1. It was a heavy lift to ensure Congress did not raise TRICARE fees and the MOAA membership was utterly amazing. It was an all-hands-on-deck effort, and it paid off.
- 2. The House and Senate came out July 23 with combined FY 2019 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), which they negotiated during the last several weeks.
- 3. MOAA was hyper-focused on a Senate-backed provision to significantly raise TRICARE fees for retired beneficiaries under age 65. We were pleasantly surprised to see the provision to end grandfathering and raise TRICARE fees did not make it in the final bill.
- 4. Many in Congress also saw these increases as an erosion of military beneficiaries' earned benefits, which have been earned through careers of service and sacrifice. MOAA is grateful for the opportunities to meet with Congressional leaders to discuss the impact these fee increases would have had on millions of beneficiaries. Specifically, meetings with Senate Armed Services Committee Ranking Member, Senator Jack Reed (D-Rhode Island), Chair Mac Thornberry (R-Texas) of the House Armed Services Committee, Chair Mike Coffman (R-Colo.), and Ranking Member Jackie Speier (D-Calif.) from the Military Personnel Subcommittee, led to the support necessary to ensure these increases were not in the final bill.
- 5. The critical exclusion from the legislation is an enormous success, and largely is successful thanks to the many MOAA members who took the time to write their elected officials.

Congress' inboxes were flooded with over 17,000 MOAA-suggested messages explaining that yet another round of fee increase was unacceptable for TRICARE beneficiaries. This mass swell of grassroots support, combined with many thousands more messages from our partners in The Military Coalition, all culminated in shaping the conversation as the defense bill went to the conference committee.

6. While this victory may prove to be only a reprieve in the larger budget battles to come, it is indeed an important one. The mobilization of our MOAA members combined with a supportive Congress put the ball over the goal line.






