

#### **EDITOR'S CORNER:**

An essay on the Bill of Rights as 2020 Draws to a Close By Susan Kerr, Editor



This month in history, on December 15, 1791, the new United States of America ratified the Bill of Rights, the first 10 amendments to the U.S. Constitution. Written by James Madison, the fourth president of the United States, these amendments defined the core rights of citizens to prevent federal government abuse of power over citizens.

In December 2020, reading the 10 Amendments is more than a lesson in history.

The survival of our rights is questioned in our daily headlines, as history is racing past us in 2020.

2020 brought us a year of great advances, achievements and breakthroughs, such as Elon Musk's Space X company's successful launch and return to earth of a manned space rocket, the first time since 2011 of such a launch from U.S. soil. On November 15, NASA and its commercial partner Space X sent five astronauts to the International Space Station, the launch of the Commercial Crew Program. 2020 saw progress toward peace in the Middle East. 2020 showed us a worldwide cooperative search to find treatments and a vaccine for the Coronavirus, research that will likely advance the treatment of many other human illnesses.

With the Coronavirus, 2020 also brought us despair and loss. In 2020, political polarization and division has fostered a growing intolerance that threatens our freedom of speech and right to assemble peaceably. Friends and family members sometimes chose silence or avoidance of discussion on the issues of the day to keep the peace. 2020 saw the use of violence to intimidate public discourse, create fear of assembly, and suppress the expression of individual belief and opinion. At the LINK deadline, the country pondered a possible Supreme Court path to a decision on the outcome of the 2020 presidential election.

In this environment, we would benefit from re-reading the Bill of Rights, the context of its creation, and its meaning today, as we watch, listen to and read the news and commentary; as we try to decipher truth to form our own beliefs about what is happening in the United States and the world today, where we have been, and where we are going.

#### FREEDOMS AT RISK

The First Amendment guarantees freedom of religion, speech, and the press, and the rights of peaceful assembly and petition. Other amendments guarantee the rights of the people to form a "well-regulated militia," to keep and bear arms, the rights to private property, fair treatment for accused criminals, protection from unreasonable search and seizure, freedom from self-incrimination, a speedy and impartial jury trial, and representation by counsel.



We cannot rely on the media for unbiased reporting. It is crucial to read and watch several different sources of information to keep abreast of what is happening. And now we find ourselves questioning our system of voting. We must demand fair and accurate methods to cast votes and count ballots, uniformly across states. When the polls close, the voting should be over, for everyone.

This is a deep and complex problem.

We need to prevent a situation when people give up and do not make the effort to vote.

It is during political crisis and civil strife that our fundamental rights as citizens are most at risk as political leaders offer "solutions" to calm the storm. Vigilance from an engaged

citizenry is required, just as it was in 1791 and several times since.



Given the complexities we faced in 2020, public discussion has led some to question whether our democratic republic is threatened. Our rights are at stake – not just in the voting arena, but in freedom of assembly and freedom of speech, and freedom to practice our religion

without persecution by others in the public arena. Our freedom to travel freely and assemble in large groups is restricted. Weddings, funerals and family holiday gatherings are now subject to government guidance, and in some places, government mandate. In some places, arrest and fines ensued for violating travel restrictions.

This is a slippery slope. We no longer can rely on our previous assumptions about the common acceptance of what makes a civil society. There is no going back to "normal". We are creating the future now and as we go. 2020 was a tough year, but we cannot submit to crisis fatigue.

Now is the time to stay engaged and informed.

We can stay safe from a pandemic AND protect our rights.

As 2020 draws to a close, we cannot forget what we have to lose, how quickly our government can dictate where we can go, and with whom and where we can meet – rights guaranteed to citizens in the 10 amendments to the Constitution – the Bill of Rights.



#### **COOL DESTINATIONS: PALM HILL**

How to Help Yourself As You Age - "Empowering Seniors" event comes to Palm Hill By Susan Kerr

Palm Hill was the Cool Destination to be on Saturday, November 14 when the Largo Police, Feeding Tampa Bay and several other health care companies and organizations that offer senior services conducted an information day and food distribution. By golf cart and automobile, more than 200 Palm Hillers drove through the South Recreation Hall parking area and chatted with representatives from the various agencies.

Residents received bags from each agency, which altogether included hand sanitizer, back scratchers, notebooks, pens and

informational materials about Medicare plans, how to avoid being the victim of fraud and scams, how to self-analyze driver skills and safety from the Largo Police, free services through the Area Agency on Aging, a chicken sandwich from Chick Fil A and boxes of food that contained milk, yogurt, apple sauce, canned vegetables and other food.

The organizers received a \$10,000 grant for this event, and chose four senior communities. Palm Hill was one of those chosen for the event. The event was sponsored by the Largo Police.

Volunteers from the BayCare Memory Disorders Center loaded food boxes from Feeding Tampa Bay into residents' vehicles.

Largo Traffic Safety police officers Steve Calderone and Ken Hastings spoke with residents and handed out "Safe Mobility for Life", a book about seniors, driving and mobility during the aging process. Community Police Officer Vu Tran also met with Palm Hill seniors in the drive-by line.

#### Medicare Open Enrollment Under Way until December 7

Representatives from Devoted Health Care and WellCare Medicare plans were on hand to distribute information about their Medicare plans available locally.

Now until December 7 is open enrollment for Medicare plans. During this time, seniors can switch Medicare plans with coverage that begins January 1, 2021. Seniors are now getting mailings or emails from their Medicare plans about any changes being made to their current plans. These annual change notices are required by Medicare. Some plans expand services and some restrict or change what they offer. Open enrollment is an important time for seniors to review any changes that may be coming in their plans, and find the plan that will meet their needs in 2021.

Stacie Bolen, director of outreach for the Area Agency on Aging of Pasco-Pinellas was on hand to spread the word about her agency, part of a network of federally funded agencies that provides services at no charge to seniors, including referrals and programs for seniors over 60. "We are all about helping seniors to live independently at home as long as possible," Bolen said.

Karyn Rizzo, an event organizer, said the "Empowering Seniors" event has been held the last five years at St. Paul's Methodist Church, with seniors invited to attend. This year, because of the Coronavirus, the event was changed into an outdoor drive-by format and moved to local senior communities. Rizzo is the author of "Aging in America" and said she has worked for two decades in hospital administration and assisted living and skilled nursing facilities. She said several local agencies offer many programs to help seniors navigate the health care system and help them make decisions to maintain the quality of their lives. "The key is to keep aging in your home. As you age, you can have a private room in your own home, or a private room in an institution. Which do you want?"

#### PROTECTING DIGITAL INFORMATION AND PRIVACY

ne of the handouts at the November 14 drive-by event at Palm Hill advised seniors how to be aware of fraud and scams, and avoid identity theft by protecting their private information.

• A recent message on the Palm Hill Message Board reported a hack of a friend's Facebook account. Some residents reported getting fake emails asking for gift cards.

• A major health insurance company was just fined \$40 million for a 2015 hack that the FBI traced to China that exposed the personal information of 80,000 customers, including its own employees.

• In 2015, Experian, one of the world's largest credit reporting agencies, experienced a hack that exposed information on 15 million people.

• Barnes and Noble announced October 15 the company discovered a hack on October 10 that exposed customer information including emails, phone numbers, home addresses, mailing addresses and billing addresses, as well as purchase history.

A Palm Hill resident received an email from Barnes and Noble on October 15 about the hack, and within days began receiving an excessive amount of emails from unknown addresses, strangers and businesses, and experienced an increased number of phone calls from unknown numbers. Barnes and Noble warned that might happen. The resident recently received two email notices that she ordered and paid for a computer that was being delivered to someone named Dave R. in Cape Coral, Fl. The email appeared to be from Amazon, but she does not have an Amazon account and does not know anyone named Dave R. in Cape Coral, Fl. The Amazon email appeared legitimate, using Amazon's logo.

Spammers and hackers are getting more sophisticated in the appearance of these "phishing" scams that try to get the recipient to click on a link or provide personal information.

Getting an email from yourself to yourself – with your own email address – is evidence of a hack somewhere where your email is on file, or that is has been acquired by spammers or sellers of private information gleaned from a hack. Someone is using or "spoofing" your email address to send out emails that appear as though they are coming from your email address.

In Palm Hill, residents' email addresses are being used in large distribution emails about Park business. The Board of Directors has advised the person sending the emails, a Palm Hill resident, that some residents have complained at the exposure of their email addresses on multi-address group mailings and do not want to receive the emails. Some residents are now opting to hide or delete their emails in the website Member Directory.

#### PROTECT EMAILS and PRIVATE INFORMATION

Protecting emails, changing passwords for accounts periodically and monitoring financial and purchasing accounts are techniques cyber security experts advise in this era of cyber hacking. In some instances of hacked information, experts advise putting an alert on one's information with the three credit agencies and notifying banks and other financial institutions.

Some computer programs and email servers allow the blocking of unwanted phone numbers. Some email programs allow the blocking of a sender's email address or will recognize the

spam email address and send it directly to the junk file. The methods vary according to the email service. Instructions on how to block emails, and unsubscribe from group marketing or spam email lists can be found through research online and at your mail service's website.
