The first month or so of a new year is a good time for reflection.

So in the second month of 2019, one of the things that Palm Hill residents might want to reflect on is how many truly generous and caring people there are among us.

Much of the generosity and care is expressed in formal organizations such as Helping Hands, RCS and MESCO.

Consider a few statistics:

At Helping Hands, sixteen year-round residents and 10 snowbirds volunteer, transporting fellow residents to and from doctors' offices, hospitals, physical therapy sessions, eye care appointments and other destinations to which the residents are unable to drive themselves. Last year, Helping Hands volunteers provided 57 such transports, an increase of 33 percent from the previous year.

RCS, which collects food for the needy, received a record 3,508 pounds of donations, most of it placed in the collection barrels at the community's two clubhouses. Several Palm Hill organizations donated money raised at social events. And the annual RCS door-to-door collection was so successful last March that it will take place again next month.

MESCO, which provides medical equipment for residents who need it, keeps no statistics, but its service is clearly in steady demand. That was evidenced by its running out of wheelchairs in the closing months of 2018, and when it appealed to Palm Hill residents for help, there was an immediate response of donated equipment.

In addition to the formal organizations, think about the many residents who volunteer for particular events.

Among the most-attended events are the Monday and Wednesday coffee gatherings. Did you know that in 2018, a total of 16,025 cups of coffee were served at them? And that 5,147 donuts, bagles and apple fritters were consumed? In order to do the preparing and serving, numerous volunteers were necessary. How many? A lot!

These are only random examples. Generous and caring actions and activities go on throughout the year, most of them carried out quietly and often anonymously.

All of which leads to a thought worth considering:



ANNUAL SHAREHOLDERS MEETING

new Board of Directors is in place after an election last month during the annual meeting of the Shareholders of Palm Hill, Inc.

Gregg Hanke was elected as a new member of the nine-member Board.

Two Board members were re-elected: Bob Newport and Dick Lawler.

The vote totals were 327 for Newport, 299 for Lawler and 262 for Hanke.

A fourth candidate, Nancy K. Olinger, received 241 votes.

Ballots were cast by 430 of the 1,096 Shareholders eligible to participate in the election,. Eight ballots were invalid.

That ballot count shows a participation rate of slightly less than 39 per cent of eligible voters. Last year the participation rate was about 45 per cent.

At an organizational meeting of the Board the day after the election, Newport was reelected President, Frank Novara was elected Vice-President, Carolyn Story was re-elected Secretary and Dan Avery was re-elected Treasurer.

In addition to the election of Board members at the annual meeting, Shareholders approved a proposal authorizing the use of money from the budget's Reserve Fund during a disaster, such as a hurricane.

The vote on the Reserve Fund issue was 315 in favor, 57 opposed.

PALM HILL PIONEERS

Another in a series featuring some of those who have resided in Palm Hill the longest

If it hadn't been for the Indianapolis 500 race, Juanita Seeman might not have become a Palm Hill resident.

"My husband had a cousin who lived in Palm Hill who wanted to see the race," Juanita recalls, "and he suggested we come down to Florida and stay in his house while he went up to Indianapolis and stayed in ours."

Juanita's husband, Bob, agreed, and they swapped houses for a month.

"We liked what we saw in Palm Hill, so we started looking for a house to buy."

They found 93 Royal to their liking, and in August of 1985 moved in, 34 years ago next summer.

Bob passed away in 2003, having been active in various ways in Palm Hill, including service on the Board of Directors.

Among the things that attracted them particularly to Palm Hill was the golf course and the weather.

"The weather in Indianapolis isn't terrible," she says. "But we loved sunny, warm Florida."

Juanita has had to give up golf -- one of the things that attracted her to Palm Hill -- along with bowling and shuffleboard. One of her big activities now is euchre, which she plays both in Palm Hill and elsewhere.

Describing her euchre activities, she says she plays on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Why not Wednesdays? "I need a break," she says with a chuckle.

What she likes most about Palm Hill is the feeling of security.

"I've seen a lot of changes over the years," she says. "Palm Hill is in much better condition now. There have been many improvements. New homes are going in. Our management does a good job."

She feels like there is less participation in activities than there used to be, and she laments that.

"New residents are missing out on one of the best reasons for moving to Palm Hill if they don't take part in the activities offered, because there are so many of them."



A MESSAGE FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

Palm Hill embarked upon our recycling program in 2011. In 2018, our recycling program saved Palm Hill nearly \$20,000 in costs of keeping recycled materials out of a landfill. In addition, about 46 tons of steel and miscellaneous metals were sold, providing about \$7,000 in income. All of this effort helps to keep our Maintenance Fee lower, and it is the right thing to do.



But we can do more, and we should be doing more. Recycling should be a priority in every household.

A reminder:

What can we recycle?

Any plastic container with a recycling symbol

Mixed paper Aluminum cans Aluminum foil and trays Tin or steel food cans Glass (clear, green or brown) Cardboard/boxes Milk and juice paper cartons

What can't we recycle?

Any Styrofoam packaging or take-out boxes

Plastic bags and plastic wrap

Yard waste

Construction materials

Hazardous materials

Table scraps

Soiled paper towels and toilet paper

Dryer sheets and dryer lint Clothing (including shoes)

Latex gloves

Bags of dog droppings

Feminine hygiene products

Many homes are recycling and recycling correctly. Some are not recycling at all and some are not recycling correctly.

And, some are putting out recycle and trash on the wrong days. Trash pickup is Monday and Tuesday; recycle pickup is Thursday and Friday.

Every recycling bag that goes to the Sanitation Area is inspected to ensure there is no contaminating material in the recycling bags. The staff regularly finds Styrofoam and plastic bags, which must be removed and placed in the trash compactor. Sometimes trash bags are inside the recycling bags and have to be separated. Even soiled adult diapers have been found in the recycle bags. We can do better!

Please do your part, and let's take our recycling program to the next level. Encourage your neighbors to do the same. Pick up a "We recycle" sticker at the office and put it in your front window. We should be proud to be environmentally responsible. Our program has been successful since its inception. We still have more room to grow, Palm Hill. Let's do it! It is the right thing to do!
