EDITOR'S CORNER: Unity Matters

Perhaps – and hopefully – the following Editor's Corner will describe a situation that is behind us by the time the May LINK reaches your hands in late April or early May.

As of mid-April, we are - or should be - Staying Safer at Home.

That is what we are doing for ourselves and for each other. In doing this, we are helping to stop or at least slow the Coronavirus spread. Scientists estimate that one person infected with the new Coronavirus will infect another 3.3 people, on average. One report indicated that first contact could extrapolate to 59,000 people potentially infected or exposed. Models may not always be right, but they can be useful.

Social distancing can interrupt that chain of events, can stop the virus from jumping from one person to three, and then on and on. Our demographic at Palm Hill is considered to be the highest risk category for the most severe consequences of Coronavirus. Our demographic is always mentioned in reports about protecting the most vulnerable groups in our society. We are in a better position than some communities because many of us are retired and don't have to interact with the public on a daily basis. That reduces our exposure and risk.

This distancing behavior has been documented to work in some states that showed the virus spread weeks before Florida, and in other countries that have slowed the rate of Coronavirus, a virus that is more transmissible and more fatal than the flu. How well social distancing works is documented in data about how the flu epidemic in 1918 decimated different cities according to data about which cities did not close events and enforce social distancing – Philadelphia vs. St. Louis is an example. How well it works is also shown through the numbers of deaths in nursing homes and aboard cruise ships, where distancing was not always possible early on.

We are slowing the virus through social isolation and keeping our six-foot distance from others while out on an essential trip, which is defined in the Pinellas County Stay Safer at Home order. In doing this, we are doing our part in staying healthy to avoid using health care resources. We are thus preserving the health system's resources – including the front-line medical workers – to help those in dire need.

In slowing the virus, we are giving more time to the efforts around the world to tackle the current pandemic, and to analyze data, and test and develop new diagnostic tools, treatments, and perhaps a vaccine.

The research shared in pursuit of this common goal will improve the world's response continued on page 5

- Insert this document in an envelope marked with large bold letters: "EMERGENCY MEDICAL INFO/RX LIST".
- Consider putting it in a conspicuous place, perhaps taped to your refrigerator door, which will make a handy grab if you have to leave your home for medical care or are ordered to evacuate your home in an emergency.
- Email the document as an attachment to your own email so you always have accessible in your cell-phone.
- (Hurricane plans would include quick access to critical documents/information that you may need for any extended relocation.)



Listen to and follow the directions of your STATE AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

IF SOMEONE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD HAS TESTED POSITIVE for the coronavirus, keep the entire household at home. Do not go to work. Do not go to school. Contact your medical provider.

IF YOU ARE AN OLDER PERSON, stay home and away from other people.

IF YOU ARE A PERSON WITH A SERIOUS UNDERLYING HEALTH CONDITION that can put you at increased risk (for example, a condition that impairs your lung or heart function or weakens your immune system), stay home and away from other people.

- Jane and Al Garner spent time doing crossword puzzles together, called old friends just to say hello and check on them, sat in a friend's driveway (six feet apart) and had a drink and conversation, had groceries delivered and a meal once in a while. "Staying Happy and Healthy!"
- Deane Fink refreshed her Spanish language skills by texting with a friend in Puerto Rico. She experimented with menus using food on hand, learned new chords and tunes on her ukulele, reviewed and memorized Luther's Catechism, researched family history and shared with cousins, organized drawers, spices and telephone book, caught up with On Demand movies, continued her fitness routine to maintain health and contacted longtime friends to check on their welfare. "These are a few things I have been doing; looks like a month won't be enough time! Stay Safe."
- Linda Grommoll made quilts to donate to a shelter for abused women and nursing homes and made hats to send north.
- Nicole and Yves Theriault drove back to New Brunswick, Canada on March 22, then spent



14 days inside without going out for essentials. "We had all that we needed and more without having to buy excess. What a shock leaving Florida with gorgeous hot weather and hot sunshine and feet in the sand to come home to snow. We had a big bank of snow about seven feet high. Had to clean the driveway (see photo) to get to the garage.

First priority was to shovel the snow to the driveway so we could get the snow removed. In the 14 days inside, we

Several mentioned they had never even seen our beautiful golf course before and of course are very impressed."





• Cathy Caputo knitted a blanket for a new baby relative and participated in Zoom conversations with relatives. She and husband John got busy on home repairs: installing new windows ("nothing was square!"), painting the ceiling in the lanai and completing other home projects.





- Carolyn Story, Thatch Palm West, didn't have a mask and so assembled her own shopping ensemble. "This was my "Go-to-Publix" outfit. As I entered the store, an employee said I was the most stylish shopper he had seen all day!"
- Dan Hannafin emerged from his Jiggles the Clown retirement for a remote video with three grandchildren in northern Maine. Since he had already donned the costume, wife Judi drove Jiggles around Palm Hill, honking, waving and cheering neighbors on Easter Sunday.





- Tom and Cecilia Schermaul: Cecilia said she got antsy just sitting around the first week. "But there was a little voice, (loud really), telling me well, you wanted to paint the bedroom... NEWS AS CLOSE AS NEXTDOOR

P alm Hill has a private social network app called Nextdoor that is very easy to use. We have had it in use for more than two years and more than 465 people have signed up to use it.

Here are some useful applications:

- 1. Secure. You can set it up so your newsfeed only contains inside the fence of Palm Hill and Nextdoor does not share any of your info.
- 2. Everyone likes to message different people but with so many choices of apps it is difficult to find people. With Nextdoor you can easily find anybody by first or last name.
- 3. If you have just two or 10 people in a common group you can create a group to send notes to without having to email two, text three and messenger the rest. It is a safe way to converse.

Some users search for anybody that has a like interest, like woodworking or scrapbooking. One user said she used it like an instant message to alert people to a suspicious person in the neighborhood, and another was alerted to coyotes running on their street.

SPREAD YOUR NEWS: TV ANNOUNCEMENTS

o get the latest Palm Hill announcements, tune your TV to Channel 732 (must be keyed in; not listed in the channel guide).

To submit information for posting, e-mail it to PHCCTVCOMMUNICATIONS@ GMAIL.COM.

If you are unable to e-mail your notice, hand deliver it to the person responsible for updating the channel. That person varies from time to time, but the current name always appears on the channel.

ENSURING YOU GET ALL PALM HILL COMMUNICATIONS

ince the closure of the Clubhouses and cancelling of events and activities, almost 60 people have contacted the webmaster to request website access so they can get the email blasts and keep abreast of what is happening in the Park.

For those who are not getting the email blasts, website administrator Jean Stjernstrom offers the following.

- Verify your email address is correct in our website member directory (palmhillcountryclub.net). If it is not correct, email the Palm Hill web administrator at palmhillcol@gmail.com or the webmaster at palmhill.webmaster@gmail.com for assistance.
- Check your junk or spam mail and if there, mark the email blast as "not iunk"
- If everything is correct on the Palm Hill website most likely the shareholder's email provider is blocking Palm Hill blasts.
- The Palm Hill website uses four servers to send email blasts:
- palmhillcountryclub.net, mailgun.org, onnetserver.com, onnetserver3.com. To ensure your email provider will not block incoming email blasts, each of these servers will need to be added per instructions below.
- If all fails, the shareholder should provide a different email address in their profile on the website.

Instructions, according to your provider:

Gmail

Add to your Gmail Contacts List:

Click "Contacts" on the left side of any Gmail page.

Then Click "Create Contact".

Copy and paste palmhillcountryclub.net into the primary email address dialog box.

Click "Save". Repeat for each server.

Set up a filter to our email address in your inbox:

Open your mailbox and click on "Mail Options" (upper right-hand corner).

Select "Filters" under the Management column. Click on the "Add" button.

In the "From header:" row, pick "contains" in the drop-down, and enter the email address palmhillcountryclub.net in the box.

At the bottom of the page Click the "Choose Folder" and select "Inbox".






