BAZAAR NEWS

The South Bazaar has been opened to receive items for sale and to sell items placed in the South Laundry room with the following guidelines:

Open to residents only.

1. Items will be sanitized prior to being placed out for sale.

- 2. Masks are to be worn when in any part of the South Clubhouse. Social distancing of six feet is mandatory.
- 3. All residents are to sign in.
- 4. Only small items to be placed for sale on the tables and bookcases.
- 5. No items to be placed on the folding tables.
- 6. No furniture is to be displayed.
- 7. Use of hand sanitizer is recommended and available in the laundry area.

- PLEASE DO YOUR PART TO FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES LISTED BELOW FOR EACH AMENITY IN PALM HILL.
- HAND SANITIZER, WIPES, WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE LAUNDRIES, SOUTH BILLIARD ROOM AND POOL AREAS.

- GUEST BADGES: must have and display their guest badges when using any amenity.

HOURS FOR RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS AND FAMILY MEMBERS: <u>11:00 AM to 2:00 PM.</u>



Number of people allowed in pool areas is limited – check signs at each pool and numbers of people present before using facility (and see number limits below). Residents have priority use if the pool numbers hit maximum. Sign-in required. Bring your own chairs; the number of Park chairs will be limited.

A limited number of chairs and loungers will be

available and spaced to comply with the social distancing requirement of six (6) feet. Chairs and loungers should not be moved. Residents and guests should bring a towel to sit on and should sanitize any common use furniture before and after use.

CAPACITY FOR THE POOLS

NORTH POOLS – 26; NORTH SPA – 3 (Total 29) SOUTH POOL – 26; SOUTH SPA – 10 (Total 36)

The spa numbers are for people actually in the spa.

The total numbers of 29 for the north and 36 for the south are the total number of people inside the fenced area.

Daily sign-in sheets are required to be filled out.

Residents enjoy priority of use as compared to a visiting family members and/or guests in the event pool capacities are being filled.

GOLF COURSE AND PRO-SHOP

The playing surface of the golf course will remain open and play will be conducted as posted on April 25, 2020. the rules have not changed with this update. The pro-shop is not open. no common use furniture will be located on the pro-shop porch. daily sign in sheets on the table on the porch will continue to be used.

• Course open only for golfing with distancing restrictions between golfers and behind the players in front of you. Wait for players to leave the greens before teeing off. Do not use water fountains. One person to a cart unless household member. (Closed to walkers, bicyclists.)

TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL

Pickleball/Tennis courts: 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., times as agreed among pickleball and tennis players, with specific restrictions to enforce social and physical distancing. (Singles, rather than doubles play recommended; use own equipment.) Only eight players allowed on courts at any time. Others abould wait out ide the fonce six feet apart for

courts at any time. Others should wait outside the fence six feet apart from each other.

NORTH AND SOUTH LAUNDRY

The North laundry will be accessible between the hours of 8:00 am to 8:00 pm daily. The South laundry will be accessible between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. Access is by key fob. Sign-in sheets will be used and residents are required to sanitize folding table surfaces before and after use. <u>Note:</u> The north laundry may be closed for repairs and remodeling at some time in the near future.

SANITATION FIELD

The sanitation field will be open according to the below schedule. Residents must adhere to strict social distancing guidelines as it applies to themselves when at the sanitation field and to Bob who manages the sanitation field. Stay six feet away from Bob when speaking to him.

If you must speak to Bob you will need to wear a mask. Socializing is not permitted. drop off your recyclables/trash and leave the area.

ommon areas to include but not limited to patios, streets, buildings, clubhouses, parking lots, green spaces and the 16th street corridor including the dog park and garden area are not to be used for any event, function or activity unless approved by the park manager. Any request to utilize these areas must be submitted to the park manager in writing.

- Insert this document in an envelope marked with large bold letters: "EMERGENCY MEDICAL INFO/RX LIST".
- Consider putting it in a conspicuous place, perhaps taped to your refrigerator door, which will make a handy grab if you have to leave your home for medical care or are ordered to evacuate your home in an emergency.
- Email the document as an attachment to your own email so you always have accessible in your cell-phone.
- (Hurricane plans would include quick access to critical documents/information that you may need for any extended relocation.)





Largo Police Department Crime Prevention Officer Vu Tran said there were several other communities near Palm Hill that had incidents around the same time period in April that Palm Hill had crime incidents. He said one community had 3x more "crimes of opportunity" in two weeks.

A crime of opportunity is a crime that is committed because the perpetrator sees they have the chance to commit a crime, such as: dark surroundings, unlocked cars, carts, bikes, homes. Largo Police Department advises all residents to be vigilant.

Leave outdoor lights on at night, use a light timer overnight inside your home, keep doors and cars locked at all times and always be alert.

(A discussion on the Message Board on the Palm Hill website provides examples of how residents' use of driveway cameras can provide video evidence for police.)




