EDITOR'S CORNER

The Link's new editors promised to try to keep residents informed about not just Palm Hill events, but also about Board actions, community projects and general news. So here's a brief rundown on current items:

A test is under way to determine whether Palm Hill's water and sewer bill can be reduced and save between an estimated \$5,000 and \$9,000 a month.

Board President Bob Newport has presented information about the test at recent gatherings.

The test involves placing devices on the valves through which water flows into our community and is measured for billing purposes. The flow of water often includes bubbles that get measured, too, according to the company conducting the test, The Watergate Valve, Inc. The company says its devices prevent the water meter from including the bubbles in its measurement, and therefore the billed amount should decrease.

If it's decided to keep the devices in place, the Board will execute a contract with the company that installed them agreeing to divide future savings equally with the company. If it's decided not to keep the devices, Palm Hill will pay nothing.

On another matter:

There will be a Board meeting at 2 p.m. Wednesday November 14 at the South Clubhouse to decide whether to install a gate at the Seminole entrance to Palm Hill and security cameras at the Seminole, Ridge and 8th Avenue entrances.

Information on the proposal and related costs was mailed to all shareholders in September.

On yet another matter:

Information will be mailed soon to all shareholders regarding an election for three positions on Palm Hill's nine-member Board of Directors.

Candidates will be asked to declare themselves by presenting a biographical information sheet to be distributed to all shareholders, and that will be followed by a presentation of candidates and an election.

And, to conclude:

<u>WATER LEAK FOREST</u> We had a major water leak (irrigation water) in the Forest, leak was located under the street which required digging up a 5' x 5' area locating the leak (which was caused by a large tree root), repairing the leak, and re-asphalting the affected area.

SPEEDING: The speed limit in Palm Hill is **<u>15 MPH</u>**, this is posted throughout the community, yet some residents consistently ignore the posted speed limits and in many cases fail to stop for the stop signs, This is widespread on Frangipani, King, Queen, Sabal, and Royal. This is a very dangerous situation waiting for a serious accident to happen. Please observe the posted speed limits.

OVERFLOW PARKING: Article X (H) PARKING RULES states in part that "residents shall park their vehicles on their own unit"..."In the event all parking spaces are occupied on one's Unit, then visitors, guests or residents are allowed to park in the guest parking area or clubhouse parking lot (providing there is space available) with an appropriate parking permit obtained from the office".

PALM HILL PIONEERS

Another in a series featuring some of those who have resided in Palm Hill the longest

t was the blizzard of '78 that brought Ruth Kievenaar to Palm Hill from her home in Massachusetts.

"My parents felt like they'd had enough cold weather, so they decided to move to Florida," she recalls. "I came with them."

They had stayed in previous years at an RV park where Home Depot now stands. And they had friends who lived in Palm Hill. So on Dec. 1, 1979, they moved into the house at 368 King Palm Street that has been Ruth's home ever since -- 39 years in December.

She was 31 and her fiancé had been killed in an automobile accident two months before their scheduled wedding. Her parents, Bill and Dot Kievenaar, died in 2007 three days apart, ending a 72-year marriage.

Now retired from her last job -- as a pre-school teacher -- Ruth says Palm Hill today is very different from the Palm Hill she moved to.

"People don't seem to get involved as much now as they used to," she says. "And there are a lot more golf carts."

She feels that attendance at the two weekly coffees is down, but at the same time notes that the number of planned activities is up.

She particularly likes what she sees as a current tendency to refer with greater frequency to "Palm Hill" rather than "the North" and "the South."

What she likes best about Palm Hill: "That most people are friendly."

What she likes the least: "That some people don't follow the rules."

One of her fondest memories of Palm Hill: "We used to decorate the streets at Christmas time with luminaries."

Among the changes she recalls are that, when she moved in, there was no Largo Mall nor Home Depot, and today's large post office on 8th Avenue didn't exist, but rather was in a small building on West Bay. Some streets in Palm Hill's southern section were still under development and -- as best she remembers -- the Forest didn't yet exist.

As a block captain, Ruth makes it a point to visit all new residents who move into her assigned territory and do all she can to make sure they feel welcome.




