he holidays are approaching and it a very busy time of year for everyone. We are looking forward to another great winter season as many of our northern neighbors return to Florida.




We will NOT be bowling on Thanksgiving (Nov. 26) and Dec. 24 and 31. The season ends on April 14, 2016.

Along came "Becky"

If as we once knew it to be over. Have we reached a point in our lives where we have lost our desire for adventure, applying our creative skills, or simply learning something new to make life worth living? I'll bet that somewhere along the line it has happened to many of us.

Let me be the first to admit that the worthless feeling began to creep into my life without warning. Each day was being wasted because after all I had done professionally there was nothing more to strive for. It ate through my thought process like a cancer destroys the body. I was losing the battle.

Then one day, while attending Mass at my parish church, a young woman in a motorizedchair, accompanied by her guide dog, happened to come in and placed herself at the end of my pew. I couldn't help but wonder why she would get up so early in the morning to come to church knowing what she had to go through, especially having to rely on her family to get her there. Following the service, I approached the young woman to introduce myself and to compliment her for making such an effort to attend Mass so early in the morning. She, in turn, told me her name was Becky Blitch, and her companion's name was Sydney, a golden retriever. We exchanged pleasantries and left church together so she had to await the arrival of her transportation to return home.

As our friendship developed, Becky told me of her lifelong struggle with Spinal Muscular Atrophy, commonly known as Muscular Dystrophy. She was diagnosed as an infant and was given an <u>outside chance</u> of living to the age of five. As a young girl, Becky was the regional poster child for the MDA Foundation in the Tampa Bay region, being featured as one of Jerry Lewis' special children during a Labor Day weekend of fund raising. Do you remember the powerful impact Jerry's kids made?

Now, after two years, Becky and I have reached a point where we are in regular contact with each other. We still come together at church, but we exchange e-mails and share thoughts



and ideas on the phone and Face Book. I have come to realize she is a brilliant woman with two college degrees and professional traits that are staggering. Her positive attitude and drive to make the most of every day has astonished me. Becky is a role model in every sense of the term. In a word, she is remarkable.

Motorized-chair bound since childhood, and given an outside chance of living to the age of five, Becky has turned the depressing diagnosis into a "I'll show you" mindset. Recently, she celebrated her 35th birthday. She attributes her extended life to her spiritual strength and her innate motivation to live the most positive and successful life possible. Educationally, Becky holds a BA from Eckerd College, an MA from California Institute of Integral Studies, and successfully completed courses at the Institute of Life Coach Training. Despite her disability, Becky's owns "With These Hands," a company which creates wearable art in the form of necklaces and bracelets; she continues to act as a group facilitator for MDA-St. Petersburg; and holds coach training sessions via the telephone and the Internet. She does it all, she says, despite being exhausted all the time, living with excruciating pain, and being emotionally drained.

This piece is written with the hope that Becky's story will create a desire in each of us to be thankful for the gifts we possess, while rekindling the fire within us to become creative and productive in the game of life once again. Remember the words of the late and beloved, Yogi Berra, when he said, "The game's never over until it's over." Let's make every day count for something positive, and to be grateful.

Note: Becky's companion, "Sydney" died in the spring after a long illness. However, she has recently returned from Georgia, where she was presented with a new guide dog and companion, "Teriyaki," a Labrador Retriever. While the new relationship will take time to develop, Becky will find a way to make it work.

10 CRAFT SHOW CONVERSTION STARTERS

There is something about being behind that table at a craft show that can be a little intimidating, especially if you are a little shy, and that is conversing with complete strangers. If you say the wrong thing shoppers may think you are pushy and be turned off. If you say nothing they think you aren't helpful, or not interested, and they may walk away.

What's a creative business owner to do?

Questions. Questions not necessarily related to what you are selling. Try these conversation starters:

- 1. Hi, how are you?
- 2. I love your sweater, hair, jewelry etc. Be sincere, people can tell when you are making things up.
- 3. Is it handmade? (see ? number 2)
- 4. Talk to the kids, ask them what grade they are in etc. The adults will often answer or tell you other things about the child leaving you opportunities to talk to the adults as well.
- 5. Candy canes (or other candies that aren't choking hazards) in a basket or bowl on the table. People will ask if they can have one or you can simply offer them one. The trick here is to use a SMALL dish or bowl and only put out a couple of dozen at a time. It



keeps people from taking a handful and filling it back up gives you more opportunities for conversation.

- 6. What is the best thing you've seen at the show so far?
- 7. Is the sun shining yet? Or other appropriate weather related questions.
- 8. Where are you from? Did you drive a long way?
- 9. Do you buy handmade items often?
- 10. Did you come to the show looking for something in particular? And finally, be sure to end with "If you need anything, I'm here to help." BONUS: If appropriate wear some of your creations or display them in an unexpected way.
- This will lead to shoppers asking you questions.

Asking generic questions makes you appear interested, friendly and not at all pushy.

What are Some Good Items to Sell at a Craft Fair?

Weather can make a significant difference in sales. If it's going to be hot, it's not the best time to sell winter scarves. And, handmade chocolates or other foods are likely to melt or spoil. But if it's going to be cooler, scarves, hats, booties or even artisan hot chocolate mix could be hot ticket items. Since our fair is Fall/Winter below are some sample items.

Fall/Winter Scarves Hats Booties Indoor/Outdoor fall decor Candles and scented decor Year-Round Jewelry Aprons Baby clothes Toys Home decor

If a holiday is approaching, bring along a few seasonal items to draw traffic to your booth. Because most holidays have particular colors associated with them (black and orange for Halloween, or red and green for Christmas), the color combinations will stand out as people walk by, grabbing their attention.

A craft fair isn't the place to drag your biggest items. Craft booths are small and cramped. And, customers usually don't want to buy large items to carry around as they shop. Bring smaller, easy-to-transport items. If you sell larger items, bring a sample or create a photo display. Make it clear that you accept custom orders and arrange pickup or delivery. This can be an effective way to spread the word about bigger items, even if you can't bring them with you.

If you're a fabric crafter, sell <u>handmade shopping bags</u> to help buyers carry their purchases. Most craft fair vendors deal in cash. So make sure most of your items are a reasonable price for cash buyers. If you sell more expensive items, consider purchasing a mobile credit card reader

for your phone or tablet. Place a sign on your booth to indicate you accept credit cards.

When pricing items, James Dillehay, author of <u>How to Price Crafts</u> recommends adding the cost of your materials and the cost of your time -- if an item takes 2 hours to make and you pay yourself \$12/hour, the cost for time is \$24 -- for total unit cost. Then, compare similar items to determine how much to price your item over the total unit cost to earn a profit.



Stay healthy when you travel
