### Possum

enerally known as a possum, the Virginia Opossum is a living fossil in that its ancestors have been found to have existed 20 million years ago! Its name comes from the Powhatan language



when the English established the Jamestown colony in Virginia in the early 1600's. As our only native marsupial, opossum babies, after birth, grow in the female's belly pouch, like a kangaroo. It has a widely varied diet, and eats just about anything, including seeds, birds, fruits, reptiles, an array of insects, including ticks, and even dead animals (carrion). Possums also possess a prehensile tail, which means they can use their tail as a hand and are thus able to hang upside down on a branch. Mother possum carries young ones on her back. They have short life spans, living only a couple of years.

Possums are highly adaptable and may be seen in urban as well as rural areas. Some older individuals are immune to the bites of venomous snakes and may even eat the attacker. They have an interesting method to ward off predators such as owls: they play dead. When "playing possum," these animals will fall to the ground, lay still and bare their teeth. They even secrete a very bad smell to make it seem they are too nasty to consume.

### **INVASIVE PLANTS**

Invasive exotic plants are a major problem in Florida. These unwelcome species might be attractive, but they can rapidly run wild, threatening many natural areas by overgrowing native plants. We can take steps in our own gardens, yards and neighborhoods to prevent the spread of some of these invaders.

Nandina: escaped its intended garden boundaries and invaded natural areas in North and Central Florida. It forms dense thickets and displaces the native vegetation our native wildlife depends on. Some beneficial alternatives are native firebush (Hamelia patens) and Virginia sweetspire (Itea virginica). Coral ardisia (Ardisia crenata), also known as Christmas berry or Australian holly is another troublemaker. This native of Southeast Asia is a designated invasive species and illegal to propagate or sell without a license. Like nandina, it has dark green leaves and bright red berries and grows vigorously. The seeds are consumed and easily spread by wildlife, especially birds. Good alternatives to ardisia are wild coffee (Psychotria nervosa), and dwarf cultivars of our native hollies (Ilex spp.). Lantana camera is another invasive exotic plant that is often found in Florida yards and landscapes. It has spread widely to forests, citrus groves, creek banks and roadsides, crowding out native species. The exotic lantana has been able to hybridize with our native Florida lantana (Lantana depressa) which is now considered endangered. We can remove this invasive plant from our yards, ask our local nurseries not to sell it, and request an alternative like the beautiful red salvia, or Tropical sage (Salvia (Salvia coccinea). ### **VETERAN'S CORNER**

The military is ditching flimsy laminated paper-based ID cards for military retirees and dependents for an all-new card system: The Next Generation Uniform Services Identification Card.

According to a Defense Department announcement published Monday, the cards, which represent the first ID update for these military communities since 1993, will be more durable and more closely resemble the Common Access Cards, or CACs, used by active-duty troops and DoD civilians.



The new IDs are already in circulation: the military quietly began issuing them to retirees, reservists and dependent military family members July 31 at a few ID card facilities, according to the DoD release.

The new USID cards are enhanced with an updated design and security features to deter counterfeiting and fraud, Michael Sorrento, director of the Defense Manpower Data Center, said in a statement. To date, only about 20 Real-Time Automated Personnel Identification Card System (RAPIDS) sites now offer the new cards; other sites await equipment upgrades in order to make them. All DoD USID card facilities are set to offer the IDs by December 2020, according to the release. The complete transition to new USID cards is targeted for January 2026.

This transition doesn't affect current card expiration dates and doesn't change the populations who are eligible to get the current USID cards.

In addition to dependents of active-duty troops and reservists and retirees and their dependents, those eligible for these DoD-recognized IDs include Medal of Honor recipients and their dependents and 100% disabled veterans and their dependents, among others. The cards facilitate access to military bases and to other exclusive facilities, such as commissaries and exchanges.

The COVID-19 pandemic has complicated the rollout of the new cards.

Sorrento advised that it would be better to wait to get the new card until next summer unless the holder's current one is expired. Applicants should call ahead for appointments to get the new USID cards.

In April, Pentagon officials announced that dependent and retiree cards set to expire in 2020 would be automatically extended through September in light of the pandemic, and changed policy to allow some ID updates and new enrollments to be done by mail.

DoD is further developing the ID card process, Sorrento said in the release, and eyeing changes such as a mail-in ID process with online vetting, eliminating the requirement to apply in person at a RAPIDS site.
