
Health and Wellness

"Happy Birthday George Jones!"

George was born and raised in Amistad, New Mexico. George always wanted to be a pilot, so he started as an Army National Guard in Clayton, NM. He joined the Air Force in March of 1955 at the age of 18, when The United States involvement in the Vietnam Conflict or Second Indochina War officially began in November and the price of gas was 23 cents per gallon and the first Polio vaccine was introduced in April.

Even though he felt a little homesick, he was looking forward to getting experience in something and serving his country. He didn't count on KP duty, and he didn't appreciate standing in line at the mess hall at attention for every step!

After boot camp George was transferred to Lowry AFB in Denver, CO for nine months of training on electrical and trained for radar technology on gunnery systems of a B36. This is where he met his future wife Sharol.

George was stationed at Carswell AFB in Ft. Worth, TX and Ramey AFB in Puerto Rico where they had to stay with a Puerto Rico family because they didn't have any openings for base housing. He stated that he didn't like staying there as the mosquitoes were relentless and opening the refrigerator meant staring at live lobsters!

Carswell AFB was his favorite post because he lived off base in a tiny house, where their first baby Kelly was born. George was happiest when he was around airplanes and working on them and being part of a group of people who had the same objectives.

After the service, George took time to pass airframe and power plant mechanic school. While working as a mechanic, he got his pilot license. He flew many military charters, including Saigon and Sydney to Honolulu. When he was with Pan Am, during Desert Storm, he flew the troops to Saudi Arabia and also back home from deployment, which held a very special meaning in George's heart.

George and Sharol moved to our park in 2007.


