



t 12:01 a.m. on Jan. 1, 1946, the birth of Kathleen Casey Wilkens, in Pennsylvania, would herald a generation known as the "Baby Boom." Following the end of World War II, more than 76 million people were born in the U.S. from 1946 to 1964. This surge in population and the demands it created helped to shape the way communities were developed throughout the country. This generation accounts for roughly 20% of the U.S. population and—depending on your age—are our parents, grandparents, siblings, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and maybe you.

A man revealed

uring his lifetime he was arrested roughly 20 times. His work provoked violent reactions, including the bombing of the home he shared with his wife and family, as well as numerous physical assaults. Ultimately, his life would end in tragedy resulting from a sniper's bullet.

Though parts of his bio may sound like a description of a public enemy, Martin Luther King Jr. was the exact opposite. A tireless crusader against injustice and inequality, King championed nonviolence as a way to combat hatred and oppression. He held a B.A. from Morehouse University, a B.D. from Crozer Theological Seminary, and a doctorate from Boston University. Four years before his death he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his work during the civil rights movement.

Had he survived, Jan. 15 would have been his 91st birthday. Because he is no longer with us, the third Monday of January is held in observance of King's life and work.

I believe that unarmed truth and unconditional love will have the final word in reality. This is why right, temporarily defeated, is stronger than evil triumphant.



Online privacy threat a crisis, many say

Te're more worried than ever about the threat to our privacy online, the Axios website reports. A survey of adults 18 and older found that 59% don't feel confident that their personal information is adequately protected by the companies and organizations they do business with online, and 58% consider the threat to online privacy a crisis. Just 38% believe that online services are essential to modern life, and "we all have to accept some risk to personal data."

Companies' asking for personal information has become increasingly common these days so they can offer more personalized products and services, but 43% of people in the survey said they feel this is inappropriate. Twenty-six percent are fine with it, and the other 26% are neutral.

Simple tips for a healthier heart

lose to 2,200 people die each day in the United States because of cardiovascular problems. That's one every 40 seconds.

Here's some advice from the WMC Action News website on how to keep your heart healthy:



- Laugh a lot. Laughter dilates your blood vessels, increases blood flow, and lowers your blood pressure.
- Snuggle. Hugging releases oxytocin, a hormone that relieves stress and can reduce blood pressure.
- Get a pet. A University of Maryland study found that survivors of a heart attack who had a dog were eight times more likely to be alive a year after their attack.
- Get the right amount of sleep. Both oversleeping and getting less than six hours of sleep a night raises your heart attack risk. Aim for about eight hours every night.
- Drink coffee. Studies suggest that caffeine can stabilize your heart rhythm if you have an abnormal heart rate. Check with your doctor.
- Move around. Standing and moving around one hour per day can reduce cardiovascular disease risk in women by 25%, according to a University of California, San Diego, study.





Say yes, then weigh your options

hould you buy a new car? Move into a bigger apartment? Or plan a dream vacation abroad? If you've been grappling with an important decision, don't put it off another day. There's no better time than the present to get to the heart of the matter and afford yourself a bit of clarity. Here are six steps to help shape your decision-making process:





- **2. Consider your feelings**. Look over both lists. Take note of your initial reaction to each one. Are you drawn to one more than the other? Does either list inspire positive or negative feelings? These feelings may be an indication of the outcome you're leaning toward.
- **3. Delete any false statements.** Are there certain items on your list that are pure fiction? Statements influenced by fear that might exaggerate a more negative outcome? Cross statements like that off your list. Don't let fear rule your process.

Hopefully, the number of results on one list are longer than the other, suggesting a clear indication of the choice you should make. In the event of a tie, give more weight to the list that feels most authentic to your values.

Trust in media ebbs

merican's trust in the news media is on the decline, according to a Gallup poll. Just 41% say they have "a great deal" or "a fair amount" of trust in newspapers, television, and radio to report the news "fully, accurately and fairly." That's down by 4% from last year.

Unsurprisingly, there's a partisan divide in America's view of the news media. Sixty-nine percent of Democrats say they have trust and confidence in the news, but only 15% of Republicans agree, along with 36% of independents.

Americans still back space travel

s space exploration still important? A majority of Americans think so, according to the Pew Research Center. In a survey, 72% said it's essential for the United States to remain a leader in space exploration, with 27% disagreeing. Eighty percent believe the International Space Station has been a good investment for the country, and 65% say that NASA's role is essential in exploring the skies; 33% believe that private companies can do the job even without NASA's involvement.

An expedition to Mars is less important to Americans than other missions. Only 18% see a voyage to the red planet as a top priority. They're more focused on monitoring Earth's climate (63%), watching for asteroids that might hit Earth (62%), and conducting basic scientific research to further our knowledge of space (47%).

A better way to say, 'Thank you for your service'

I recent of Americans say they've thanked a veteran for his or her service, but a recent survey suggests that the best way to thank veterans may not be to say, "Thank you for your service."


The survey was commissioned by the Cohen Veterans Network (CVN), a national non-profit network of mental health clinics for post-9/11 veterans and military families. The survey found that 49% of active and former military service members grow uneasy when told, "Thank you for your service."

What to do instead? The survey found that veterans and current service members prefer questions about when they served, where they were stationed, and what kinds of jobs they did.

Don't make these investment mistakes

good financial advisor is crucial to saving your money and investing it wisely. If you try to do everything yourself, you could wind up making these expensive mistakes, as noted by the Business Insider website:

- Acting impulsively. You get a tip on a stock or see coverage of an exciting new company on TV. Don't immediately tell your broker to start buying up stock. Take a deep breath, do your homework, and then make a reasoned decision.

Don't be rude about money

oney is a delicate subject. Too many people forget that, though, and ask impertinent questions or make rude mistakes with their friends. The Reader's Digest website points to these habits that can alienate others and make you look like a jerk:

- Making assumptions. Someone who sports an expensive wristwatch might not be rich; people who shop in secondhand stores aren't necessarily poor. Don't jump to conclusions about anyone's financial situation based on superficial appearances.
- Automatically splitting the bill. Four friends go to a restaurant. One orders multiple drinks and the most expensive meal on the menu, then suggests splitting the bill four equal ways. Don't be that person. Be sensitive to other people's preferences and financial situations, and be willing to pay your fair share.
- Asking for "friend discounts." If you hire a friend to do a professional service for you, don't ask for a break on the fee. This is how your friend makes a living. Be willing to pay full price or hire someone else to help you out.



Mammoth traps uncovered in Mexico

ncient humans dug pits to trap and kill giant mammoths some 15,000 years ago, according to an article on the Weather Channel website. Archeologists in Mexico have unearthed two large pits and discovered hundreds of bones from the giant beasts at the bottom.

The pits were discovered during at dig at Tultepec, a town north of Mexico City. They're five to six feet deep and 80 feet long, and archeologists have excavated more than 800 bones from 14 individual mammoths. The haul includes eight skulls, five jaws, and hundreds of other assorted remains.



Previously scientists believed that ancient humans chased mammoths off cliffs, or led them into swamps to get stuck and die. The find is the first evidence that humans that long ago directly hunted and attacked mammoths for food, fur, and other uses.

Long-missing tiny deer found again in Vietnam

small species of deer that was suspected to be extinct has been found again. The animal, a chevrotain, also known as the Vietnam mouse-deer, is the size of large house cat, with a silver stripe down its back. It lives in Vietnam, where it was first described in the early 20th century, but it hadn't been seen since 1990.

Researchers traveled through Vietnam talking to villagers and forest rangers, some of whom described an animal that resembled the chevrotain. They mounted motion-activated cameras on trees where the creatures had been sighted.

After five months they began searching through the photos—and found 270 images of chevrotains. After a second five-month surveillance, they gathered 1,881 more images.

It's unclear how many creatures they captured on camera or whether the species is endangered. The researchers hope to gather more images and data to determine whether the population is stable.
