

ZUCCHINI CARROT CUPCAKES

Ingredients

- 1 cup all-purpose flour

Ingredients

- 1(16 oz) jar(s) unsalted peanuts
- 1(16 oz.) jar(s) salted peanuts
- 1(12 oz.) bag(s) semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1(12 oz.) bag(s) milk chocolate chips
- 2(10 oz.) bag(s) peanut butter chips
- 2(1 lb) pkg. white almond bark or vanilla candy coating






