





## **Invention of the Safety Pin**

merican mechanic Walter Hunt is regarded as the inventor of the safety pin that bears resemblance to those used today. The safety pin included a clasp that covered the point and kept it from opening, and a circular twist at the bend to act as a spring and hold it in place. Charles Rowley (Birmingham, England) independently patented a similar safety pin in October 1849, although the company no longer makes these.

Hunt made the invention in order to pay off a \$15 debt to a friend. He used a piece of brass wire that was about 8 inches long and made a coil in the center of the wire so it would open up when released. The clasp at one end was devised in order to shield the sharp edge from the user.

After being issued U.S. patent #6,281 on April 10, 1849, Hunt sold the patent to W. R. Grace and Company for \$400 (roughly \$10,000 in 2008 dollars). Using that money, Hunt then paid the \$15 owed to a friend and kept the remaining amount of \$385 for himself. What Hunt failed to realize is that in the years to follow. W. R. Grace and Company would make millions of dollars in profits from his invention.

## Who Invented Play-Doh?

he invention of play dough was actually a fortunate accident. In the 1930s, Noah McVicker created a substance that looked like putty out of flour, water, salt, boric acid and mineral oil. His family's soap company - Kutol Products - in Cincinnati, Ohio, marketed his creation as wallpaper cleaner!

McVicker's special putty-like substance was an excellent wallpaper cleaner, because it didn't contain any toxic chemicals, could be reused and would not stain the wallpaper. Eventually, teachers learned that the wallpaper cleaner could be used as a modeling compound to make art and craft projects as school.





It wasn't until after World War II that Noah McVicker's nephew, Joseph McVicker, joined the company and learned that their wallpaper cleaner was being used for arts and crafts in schools, Joseph thought it would be a good idea to give the product a new name - Play-Doh® - and market it to schools, teachers and department stores.

The new product was an immediate success. In 1956, the McVickers started the Rainbow Crafts Company to make and sell Play-Doh®. Macy's in New York and Marshall Field's in Chicago began selling the product. The new company also began to advertise the product on popular children's television shows, such as Captain Kangaroo. Within one year, its sales had already reached almost \$3 million!

Over time, the exact ingredients in Play-Doh® has changed. As technology has improved, so has Play-Doh®. Although the exact receipt is a secret, Play-Doh® remains a popular modeling compound for art and craft projects, because it is still nontoxic, easy to use and simple to clean up.

Today, Play-Doh® is owned by Hasbro. They continue to make and sell the product through its Playskool line. In 2003, the Toy Industry Association added Play-Doh® to its "Century of Toys List, which contains the 100 most memorable and creative toys of the last 100 years.

Play-Doh® comes in a variety of bright and bold colors. There are also a series of related products and toys that make use of Play-Doh®. Since its "invention," over 700 million pounds of Play-Doh® have been sold around the world!

## 11 Adorable Facts You Never Knew About Teddy Bears

Spoiler alert: The Teddy Roosevelt story isn't as heartwarming as you thought. Their original story doesn't have a happy ending

You know the tale: During a 1902 hunting trip, one of Theodore Roosevelt's companions managed to capture a bear and tie it to a tree so the president, who hadn't managed to make a kill so far, could do the honors of shooting it. But when Roosevelt saw the cub, he walked away, stating it would be unsportsmanlike to kill the poor creature. Inspired by a cartoon about the story, a Brooklyn shop owner got permission from the president to call his stuffed animals "Teddy's Bears." But the whole story of the hunt isn't totally warm and fuzzy. Roosevelt told his companion to "Put it out of its misery," so the man killed the bear with a knife after the president left.

#### Stuffed bears would still exist without Theodore Roosevelt

German toy maker Margarete Steiff made a stuffed bear after a tip to the zoo sparked her nephew to design a stuffed bear he asked her to make in 1903. She was afraid bears would be too scary for kids, so she designed them with button eyes, stitched mouths and noses, and movable arms and legs - very similar to the design of the American bears that became so popular.

#### **Teddy bears mourned the Titanic**

After the Titanic sank in 1912, German toy company Steiff created 500 teddy bears to honor

the victims. The "mourning bears" were black with red-rimmed eyes to show their sympathy. They now sell for \$20,000 or more in auctions.

#### Winnie the Pooh was based on a real bear

A Canadian soldier bought a black bear cut from a hunter during World War I, and the animal became a pet and mascot for his troop. The bear, named Winnipeg, later was given to the London Zoological Gardens, where Christopher Robin Milne, Winnie-the-Pooh author A.A. Milne's son, took such a liking to her that he named his teddy bear after her.

#### They've become easier to clean

The stuffing was unhygienic until husband-and-wife toymakers Wendy Boston and Ken Williams invented washable teddy bears in 1954. The Wales-made toys used nylon instead of mohair, wood, wool, kapok, and other hard-to-clean materials.

### **Teddies can be teensy**

The smallest commercially available stitched teddy bear is a mere 0.29 inches tall, made by South African 'microbear' maker Cheryl Moss, whose largest creations are just taller than half an inch.

## But the largest towers way, way above them

The world's largest stitched teddy bear was made in 2008 in America, where bigger is better. The 55-foot-4 creation is named C.T. Dreams, which stands for Connect the Dreams, and you can visit it at the Exploration Place in Wichita, Kansas - a state literally flatter than a pancake.

## Winning one (or two or 3,000) from an arcade is possible

Gamer Yuka Nakajima is the undisputed world champion of claw machines which are called UFO catchers in Japan, where she's from. She managed to snag more than 3,500 teddy bears from the arcade games.

#### They're the best-traveled toys

Between 2000 and 2010, British company ISPY sent teddy bear Raymondo on a trip that gave him the status of the world's most traveled toy mascot. In less than a year, he traveled 395,000 miles, hitting six continents and 35 countries with airline crew members and sponsors.

#### In fact, they don't stop at world travel

Magellan T. Bear became the first teddy bear in space when he boarded Space Shuttle Discovery in 1995. But he wasn't just a bear on holiday - he was the "education specialist" on the mission, having been a project for a Colorado elementary school. The teddy bear later flew around the world, visited the South Pole, and more.

#### Your teddy collection doesn't stand a chance

Jackie Miley, from Hilly City, South Dakota, has the world's biggest teddy bear collection. As of 2012, she owned 8,026 cuddly bears.

## **Uncle Sam**

The Sam is the cartoon embodiment of the government of the United States of America, a character who appeared in newspapers and magazines beginning in the first part of the 19th century. The commonly accepted version of his origin, or at least the best explanation anyone's been able to supply, is that he was modelled after Samuel Wilson, a meat purveyor to the united States army during the War of 1812. Known as "Uncle Same," Wilson put his initials on his goods. The initials U.S. were also taken to stand for United States. Over the years Uncle Sam evolved into a tall, white-haired man with beard, sporting patriotic colors and a top hat. The most common modern image can be traced to his depiction by James Montgomery Flagg from 1916, for a military recruitment poster calling "I Want YOU For the U.S. Army."

## **Band-Aid**

### "I am stuck on Band-Aid (brand) 'cause Band-Aid's stuck on me!"

and-Aid is a brand name of American pharmaceutical and medical devices giant Johnson & Johnson's line of adhesive bandages.

History

The Band-Aid was invented in 1920 by Thomas Anderson and Johnson & Johnson employee Earle Dickson for his wife Josephine, who frequently cut and burned herself while cooking. The prototype allowed her to dress her wounds without assistance. Dickson passed the idea on to his employer, which went on to produce and market the product as the Band-Aid. Dickson had a successful career at Johnson & Johnson, rising to vice president before his retirement in 1957.

The original Band-Aids were handmade and no very popular. By 1924, Johnson & Johnson introduced a machine that produced sterilized Band-Aids.

In 1951, the first decorative Band-Aids were introduced. They continue to be a commercial success, with such themes as Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck, Oliver & Jenny, Superman, Spider-Man, Hello Kitty, Rocket Power, Rugrats, smiley faces, Barbie, Dora the Explorer, Batman and Duck Dynasty. In addition to white toned and brown toned adhesive bandages, Band-Aid sells sheer strips for any color skin tone that can be purchased in stores or online.

In World War II, millions were shipped overseas, helping popularize the product. Since then, Johnson & Johnson currently has estimated a sale of over 100 billion Band-Aids worldwide.

Johnson & Johnson continues to defend the Band-Aid trademark against it being generaricized.

## The Old Coot Steps Back in Time

There are magic places in Owego. Step into one and you enter a time warp. I discovered and wrote about the first one several years ago; it's on Parker Lane. The warp opens up on brisk, foggy mornings and takes you back about 150 years. You can hear horses snort in their stalls as you walk along the lane, the clang of workmen's metal lunch pails as they trudge off to the H.W. Camp foundry on Front Street and the cluck of chickens as they peck the ground in Judge Parker's back yard. The warp takes you back somewhere before 1867; that's the year a fire destroyed all the buildings from the bridge to Parker Lane, including the foundry the workmen were headed to.

I discovered a second time warp on an early morning stroll in the west end of the village. I felt its pull as I crossed Main Street by Price Chopper and entered Marvin Park. As I passed by the tennis courts, I could see several large pieces of construction equipment, shuttling back and forth between mountains of metal in the Ben Weitsman & Son scrap yard. They were moving, cutting, and sorting material as they dealt with the tons of scrap that blanket the landscape. Then, I stumbled into the time warp. A fog bank swirled through the area, obscuring both the park and the scrap yard. The diesel powered pickers, cutters and electromagnet devices disappeared. They were replaced by a family of T-Rex dinosaurs. I'd landed in the Cretaceous Period, 65 million years in the past.

The biggest T-Rex, a large, green adult male, looked at me and snorted. Then, he strained his neck and swung down to the carcass of an armor plated Triceratops. He took a huge bite, swung over toward his mate and dropped it. She lowered her flatiron shaped head and the morsel literally leapt up to her mouth. She leaned back and pulled it high into the air, scampered twenty feet and dropped it a the feet of a smaller dinosaur, a yellow youngster with a scissor shaped head. He immediately snatched the treasure, grunted, bit down hard and cut it in half. His sister shuttled over and gobbled up one of the halves. Then the "father' went over to the carcass of a duck billed Hadrosaur and ripped off a fresh hunk of meat, passed it on to mom and the feeding process repeated itself.

I stared in amazement as I made my way out of the park and onto the road by the old middle school. I stopped and watch from this, more distant vantage point. It was quite a scene, a dinosaur family out for dinner, 65 million years in the past. shuttling back and forth, feeding on helpless prey. Then, a gust of wind pushed the fog aside. The dinosaurs were replaced with construction equipment. I blinked twice and wondered if I had really been in a time warp, or just in another of my old coot stupors?



## Chocolate may be good for your heart

In case you're looking for an excuse to eat some chocolate, consider this: It may reduce your risk of irregular heartbeat.

An analysis of some 55,000 adults from Denmark found that eating 2-6 ounces of chocolate a week was associated with a 20 percent decreased risk of atrial fibrillation, or A-fib, otherwise known as an irregular heartbeat. A-fib can compromise blood flow in the upper chambers of the heart—the atria. People with A-fib are five times more likely to suffer a stroke, according to the American Heart Association, and have twice the risk of a heart-related death.

Moderate consumption of chocolate, especially dark chocolate, appears to reduce that risk, although binging on larger amounts can obviously lead to weight gain and associated problems.

## **Carbon monoxide safety tips for your home**

arbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless and nearly odorless gas that's created by the incomplete burning of solid, liquid, and gaseous fuels. Appliances that burn LP gas (liquefied petroleum), oil, coal, kerosene, coal or wood may produce carbon monoxide. Carbon monoxide is also poisonous to animals and people. Symptoms of its effects include:

- Headache
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea
- Dizziness

To prevent CO poisoning, take these precautions:



- Buy and install a CO alarm. Make sure it is listed with Underwriters Laboratories or that there is information on the package that indicates that it meets the requirements of IAS 6-96 standards. Follow the directions for placement and installation.
  - Install appliances properly. Most of them should be installed by a professional.
- Practice good maintenance. Have your heating system (furnaces, flues, and chimneys) inspected and serviced by a professional every year.
- Burn charcoal outdoors only. Never burn it in a tent, home, garage, vehicle, etc. Don't use portable fuel-burning camping equipment indoors or inside tents, etc.
- Make sure you turn off fuel-burning engine equipment when you are inside a garage or basement. Just having the doors open does not ensure your safety.
