

No loose trash will be picked up. You may also use the maintenance yard during the day. All bins are marked. Do not put kitchen trash in the 2 large roll offs by the gate. The sign posted states "No Kitchen Trash". Use the 4 dumpsters marked "Kitchen Trash Only".

If you are putting out kitchen trash and yard waste, please separate to make it easier for maintenance to identify.

Do Not leave your garbage or recycling outside the yard gate. <u>The gate is opened from 7:00am til 10:00pm.</u> <u>Please plan accordingly.</u>

DOGS

Clubhouses are not in the dog section. Dogs are NOT to be walked around any of the clubhouses. We had potential buyer step in a "present" that someone did not pick up after their dog did it's business. It is rude and inconsiderate to leave your dog's mess. CLEAN IT UP!!

All dog walkers be sure to walk your pet only in the dog section and only on the side of the street designated as dog section. Many streets are designated "dog section" on one side of the street, but the other side is not in the dog section. Keep your neighbors happy and obey the pet rules. And, of course, don't forget the 'Litter" bag. If you have a service dog in the non-dog section, please be respectful and use your lawn only.

Good Morning/Good Night signs are available in the office for those who live alone and would benefit by having their friends/neighbors see a sign that all is well with them. The sign is placed in your window. In the morning you turn the sign so that the "Good Morning" side faces out. In the evening before you retire for the night you turn it to the "Good Night" side. If a neighbor should notice that the sign hasn't been turned they will try to contact you or they will call the office and have a welfare check made. The manager and maintenance also watch for the signs in the windows as they travel around the community. This system has been a great comfort to many of our residents already and many "buddy systems" have been set up. If you have questions, please call the community office and we'll be glad to explain it to you or supply a sign if you are unable to come to the office to pick one up.

STOLEN BIKES

It is sad to say but we must ask you to be diligent about locking up your bicycles. We have had a couple of bikes stolen recently. With the times we live in we must take every precaution to protect our homes and goods from predators. It is best to lock your bike in a shed or screen porch but if it must be left in view, use a padlock and chain to secure it to something



unmovable. Of course, everything should be anchored in case of storm, which is a reminder to be ready for hurricane season. So, please, please, pick up everything that isn't attached and put it safely away so that it won't become a projectile when the winds pick up.

GOING ON VACATION or headed north?

Please pick up all the fruit off the ground and off the trees in your yard before you leave so that your neighbors don't have unwanted guests and rotting fruit while you're gone. Make sure that you have someone to care for your yard while you are away. If you trim and weed before you leave just keep in mind that this is a semi-tropical region and things grow like crazy in the summer. Once before you leave will not do it for the entire summer. If the park must arrange to have yard work done it will be billed to the home owner. You may want to consult your neighbors and see who they use and what recommendations they have.

HOT TUB USE is for adults only. No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub. The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, no longer than 15 minutes. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. Never swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

POOL ETIQUETTE

Summer time is here and those new bathing suits look wonderful but they still need to be covered up when coming indoors. Remember shoes and cover-ups are required inside the clubhouses. Please remember that wet floors can be slippery so use caution when entering clubhouses from the pool.

SWIM DIAPERS ONLY

Please use only <u>swim diapers</u> in the pools. They are available in adult sizes as well as children sizes. Please dispose of properly and do not leave for someone else. Diapers are not recyclable and need to be placed in a plastic bag and disposed of properly in the trash.

GLASS BOTTLES – PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.





AT HOME FLOORS INC

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<u>STOP SIGNS</u> – Just your monthly reminder to please stop at all STOP signs in the Park. Cars, and bicycles, continue to roll through them and someone could easily get hurt one day. Just please pay attention.

DRIVEWAYS – When backing out of your driveway, please stop and look before entering the street. There have been several 'close calls' with residents backing out and not looking.

<u>I strongly urge residents</u> to obey the one-way arrows in the roads, especially around the clubhouses. Those following the correct direction of the arrow are not looking for those going the wrong way. We have seen many instances where someone has almost gotten run over because of someone going against the arrows.

Sewers and sinks can be kept flowing and in good condition by the addition of enzymes available at nearby home improvement stores or hardware stores. Enzymes poured down the sink periodically will help to break down the grease and gunk that build up in the plumbing. Only a couple ounces a month will do the job. For the sewer a twice per year treatment of <u>Copper Sulfate Pentahydrate</u> flushed down the toilet is also available. This kills off the roots and growth that get into the sewer line. These small investments now can prevent costly plumbing bills later.

Another seasonal tip is to remind our gardeners to pull out the little oak seedlings that are popping up all around the homes from fallen acorns. Some of these "seedlings" have grown into rather large plants already and are up against homes. They might not seem like much now but trees in Florida grow fast....VERY FAST! We really recommend that homeowners remove these plants while they are still able. As many know, oak trees can cause great damage to homes, drives and sidewalks. Once the tree reaches 4" in diameter the city requires a permit to take it down.

RENTERS

It is the responsibility of the homeowners to make sure that any additional occupants in their homes are properly registered with the park. If you are planning to rent out your home or have someone stay with you, review your Ranchero <u>Rules and Regulations</u> first. PET RESTRICTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED BY ALL AND APPROVED BY MANAGEMENT BEFORE A PET CAN BE BROUGHT INTO THE COMMUNITY. Additional occupants and renters must be registered with the office and a background check performed prior to their arrival. It is the Homeowners responsibility to meet all the requirements. There is an application fee to cover this expense. Applications are available in the Office. They must be accompanied by two legible forms of identification for each person. For international applicants, copies of passports and driver's licenses are required. These should be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the person's arrival. If you have any problems with the landscaping or mowing, DO NOT INTERUPT OR STOP THE WORKERS, contact the Ranchero office. The office will contact their managers and get the situation resolved as quickly as possible.

Do not park in the street on Tuesday or Wednesday when the street sweepers are here.

GUESTS

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are to only be driven by persons 18 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations.

Paint colors for homes, mansards, and driveways must be approved and a permit obtained from the office. The same applies to alteration requests; this includes plantings. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. Also, be sure to obtain any required City permits.


