

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

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

Tell, my friends this begins another Hurricane season, 2015. Please be informed that ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW regarding HURRICANE SEASON (including tornado season) you will find in these monthly bulletins from June 1- November 30,

which is hurricane season in Florida, namely Pinellas County, HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:

Last season, 2014, we began a new format to be PRO-ACTIVE. In other words, each of us should take full responsibility for ourselves, in obtaining ant information regarding our safety and well-being during the stormy weather issues we may or may not incur.

You will be given the opportunity to collect ALL INFORMATION NEEDED, including SAFETY TIPS (at every Saturday Morning coffee); in the MONTHLY BULLETIN, which is delivered to our homes every month; in the HURRICANE GUIDES, provided by the County and can be picked up at the HURRICANE TABLE, here at the HCH. The universal statement, "MAKE A KIT...HAVE A PLAN...BE PREPARED" means

to start a file system, whatever is easier for you, to collect information you'll need, from year to year and become PRO-ACTIVE in your safety during any inclement weather that may pop up, in case of an evacuation for an example here's how...

1.) ALL INFO GIVEN TO YOU or that you may PICKUP AT THE HURRICANE TABLE or receive in the MONTHLY BULLETIN OR HEAR AT SATURDAY MORNING COFFEE or in the HURRICANE GUIDE will go into a file and this will be YOUR KIT. Keep you FILE up to date and save it from year to year. 2.) THIS IS YOUR PLAN; 3.) This is how you will BE PREPARED. If you have a hurricane guide from last year or the year before, it's ok. It is still the same information and has EVERYTHING you need to know. 4.) Tear out the page (s) from the MONTHLY BULLETIN and put it in your FILE. 5.) Jot down ant notes from Saturday

Morning Coffee "Tips" and put this in your FILE. 6.) Put any HANDOUTS you get from the hurricane table INTO YOUR FILE. 7.) there will be a multitude of items to pick up to pack in your kit as you will find out once you read your HURRICANE GUIDE. 8.) ADD these items into your KIT.

### **MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER**

ave a Happy Independence Day! The management and staff will be off in celebration of the 4th of July, so the office will be closed Friday July 3rd. There will be no garbage pickup. In case of an after-hours Park related emergency, please call 727-346-4819.



### **EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION**

Please make sure all of your contact and emergency information is updated and correct. We recently had an incident in the park that required us to check on a resident. All of the contact numbers on file were no longer in service. Please, for your safety and peace of mind come to the office and update your records.

### PARKING IN SOMEONE ELSE'S CARPORT

If you are leaving and are allowing someone else to park in your driveway or carport in your absence, please notify the office so that we can make a note in your file.

### STOLEN BIKES AND OTHER ITEMS

It is sad to say but we must ask you to be diligent about locking up your bicycles. We have had a couple of bikes stolen recently. With the times we live in we must take every precaution to protect our homes and goods from predators. It is best to lock your bike in a shed or screen porch but if it must be left in view, use a padlock and chain to secure it to something unmovable. Also, please lock your vehicles and doors every night.

**Call Largo Police Dept.** If you hear or see anything that isn't right or someone around your home or neighbors home that doesn't belong there call the Largo Police Department at 727-587-6730. The number is in the Dial Directory on page 2.

Hurricane evacuation information is in the Hacienda Clubhouse.

### GOING ON VACATION OR HEADED NORTH?

Please pick up all the fruit off the ground and off the trees in your yard before you leave so that your neighbors don't have unwanted guests and rotting fruit while you're gone. Make sure that you have someone to care for your yard while you are away. If you trim and weed before you leave just keep in mind that this is a semi-tropical region and things grow like crazy in the summer. Once before you leave will not do it for the entire summer. If the park must arrange to have yard work done it will be billed to the home owner. This is the homeowner's responsibility and the park will not be sending out warning letters. Alexander's Lawn Maintenance does offer a summer service to residence if needed. Information can be obtained in the community office. Also, you may want to consult your neighbors and see who they use and what recommendations they have.

<u>Sewers and sinks</u> can be kept flowing and in good condition by the addition of enzymes available at nearby home improvement stores or hardware stores. Enzymes poured down the sink







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periodically will help to break down the grease and gunk that build up in the plumbing. Only a couple ounces a month will do the job. For the sewer a twice per year treatment of Copper Sulfate Pentahydrate flushed down the toilet is also available. (We have an empty container in the office if you care to see what it looks like.) This kills off the roots and growth that get into the sewer line. These small investments now can prevent costly plumbing bills later.

Another seasonal tip is to remind our gardeners to pull out the little oak seedlings that are popping up all around the homes from fallen acorns. Some of these "seedlings" have grown into rather large plants already and are up against homes. They might not seem like much now but trees in Florida grow fast....VERY FAST! The park cares for the currently established large oak trees but does not plant new oak trees nor take responsibility for any that residents plant or allow to grow from acorns or seeds. We really recommend that homeowners remove these plants while they are still able. As many know, oak trees can cause great damage to homes, drives and sidewalks. Once the tree reaches 4" in diameter the city requires a permit to take it down.

### **DOG WALKING**

Il dog walkers be sure to walk your pet only in the dog section and only on the side of the street designated as dog section. Many streets are designated "dog section" on one side of the street, but the other side is not in the dog section. Keep your neighbors happy and obey the pet rules. And, of course, don't forget the 'Litter" bag.

### **STOP SCAMMERS COLD**

tip from Pinellas County advises us that when we are thinking of hiring a company to do work on our homes to do a little research first. To help protect yourself, contact Pinellas County's Department of Justice and Consumer Services where you can search for a company's complaint history and learn valuable tips to make your repair experience a good one. Info: www.pinellascounty.org/consumer or call (727) 464-6200

DOOR TO DOOR SALES Call the Largo Police Department (587-6730) immediately and please notify the community office if you have a solicitor come to your door. Even if you think you can just send them away with no harm, please remember they will be preying on your neighbors. Be a good neighbor and help to get rid of these predators. If a solicitor tells you they have received permission from the office to be in the park, do not believe it. Management NEVER gives permission for solicitation.





### **BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR RENTERS AND RESIDENTS**

both long term and short term occupants of a home, whether a renter, an owner, or an additional occupant are required to have a background check run. This needs to be done prior to renters moving in or closing on the sale of a home.

Anyone staying in Ranchero Village as more than a guest of 15 days up to twice a year is required to have a background check run. This rule applies to everyone. If you have been here before but have had an absence of over two years you will be required to have a current background check run. These rules apply to everyone no matter what your past occupation may have been.

### **GUESTS**

uests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office or immediately if the owner is not present.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. Children are only allowed to go to the Corral Clubhouse pool between the hours of 10:00am-2:00pm and 4:00-sunset or 7pm. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

### **POOL UMBRELLAS**

f it is windy please do not open the umbrellas. When you do use them please remember to close them when you are done.

### **HOT TUB USE** is for adults only.

No one under 18. <u>Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub</u>. The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, <u>no longer than 15 minutes</u>. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. Never swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.



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

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### **GOLF CARTS**

olf carts are to only be driven by persons 16 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations.

Please do not take your golf card after dusk if you do not have lights on it. We have recently had a near miss. Golf carts must obey all traffic rules.

<u>GLASS BOTTLES</u> – PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>No smoking at the pools or hot tub</u>— please adhere to the **No Smoking Rules** at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. Please be respectful of community property and others.

### TREE PERMITS

Permits MUST be obtained from the City of Largo for the removal of any tree with a trunk larger than 4" in diameter. Certain trees will require a fee before the permit can be obtained. The community office must submit the request to the City. If you have gone through the permit process and have removed a tree please contact the community office and let us know so we can have the permit closed out with the City.

### **GET PERMISSION FIRST**

Tiveways, siding, roof-overs, windows, painting, planting, you name it! If you are making any type of change to the outside of your home, please come into the office first to apply for a permit. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. If work is started without the proper permits, management will put a stop to the work and in some cases, even demand removal. Don't put yourself or your contractor through the inconvenience of interrupted work just because you failed to follow the rules. Also, very important, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

Please be sure to display your permits.
