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



Please make sure that everything is picked up or anchored around your home whether you are leaving for a brief vacation or for the whole summer. We never know when a summer storm will strike and blow things around let alone a hurricane. Best to be ready for the unexpected and protect your property as well as your neighbor's.

If you are interested in weeding or doing other errands for fellow residents, please let the office know.

HURRICANE INFORMATION

Hurricane season is June 1st through the end of November. A door hanger is being distributed to every home in the community. If you are watching a neighbors' home, please bring it in and leave it where they will see it when they return.

If you need help with transportation, you must register BEFORE a storm is heading our way. The # is 727-464-3800. There are also forms in the Hacienda Clubhouse to register with the fire department if you need assistance.

Remember we are "Zone A" if a mandatory evacuation is called.

Have a plan in effect now to avoid stress and confusion later.

Protect Your Community

Please, if someone has broken the law or has stolen from you, do not be afraid to prosecute. Protect your neighbors and the community. The next victim may not be as lucky as you. Do not wait until the office is open to make a report, call Largo Police at 727-587-6730 or 911 if it is an emergency.

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TRASH

We would like to remind everyone that trash and recycling needs to be out by 8:00am But NOT overnight. Please bring trash and recycling to the end of your driveway or cul-desac. Trash must be in bags and tied. No loose trash will be picked up. You may also use the maintenance yard during the day. All the bins are marked. Do not put kitchen or household trash in the 2 large roll offs by the gate. The sign posted states "No Kitchen Trash". Use the 4 dumpsters marked "Kitchen Trash Only". The City of Largo has brought bags of trash back to us that was placed in the roll offs. We can get fined for this.

If you are putting out kitchen trash and yard waste, please separate yard waste from kitchen trash to make it easier for the maintenance crew to identify.

*****Do Not Leave your garbage or recycling outside the yard gate.****

The gate closes at 10:00pm and opens at 7:00am.

Please plan accordingly.

HOT TUB USE is for adults only. No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub. The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, no longer than 15 minutes. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. Never swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

<u>STOP SIGNS</u> – Just your monthly reminder to please stop at all STOP signs in the Park. Cars, and bicycles, continue to roll through them and someone could easily get hurt one day. Just please pay attention.

<u>**DRIVEWAYS**</u> – When backing out of your driveway, please stop and look before entering the street. There have been several 'close calls' with residents backing out and not looking.

<u>I strongly urge residents</u> to obey the one-way arrows in the roads, especially around the clubhouses. Those following the correct direction of the arrow are not looking for those going the wrong way. We have seen many instances where someone has almost gotten run over because of someone going against the arrows.

DO NOT MAKE LEFT TURNS ONTO BELCHER. It is considered driving into traffic and you can get ticket.

<u>WEEDS</u> – As our northerners go home, please remember to make arrangements to have your home cared for in your absence. The weeds grow during the summer and will need to be pulled while you are away.



<u>Sewers and sinks</u> can be kept flowing and in good condition by the addition of enzymes available at nearby home improvement stores or hardware stores. Enzymes poured down the sink periodically will help to break down the grease and gunk that build up in the plumbing. Only a couple ounces a month will do the job. For the sewer a twice per year treatment of Copper Sulfate Pentahydrate flushed down the toilet is also available. This kills off the roots and growth that get into the sewer line. You can get this at Lowes or Home Depot. These small investments now can prevent costly plumbing bills later.

Another seasonal tip is to remind our gardeners to pull out the little oak seedlings that are popping up all around the homes from fallen acorns. Some of these "seedlings" have grown into rather large plants already and are up against homes. They might not seem like much now but trees in Florida grow fast....VERY FAST! The park cares for the currently established large oak trees but does not plant new oak trees nor take responsibility for any that residents' plant or allow to grow from acorns or seeds. We really recommend that homeowners remove these plants while they are still able. As many know, oak trees can cause great damage to homes, drives and sidewalks. Once the tree reaches 4" in diameter the city requires a permit to take it down.

RENTERS

It is the responsibility of the homeowners to make sure that any additional occupants in their homes are properly registered with the park. If you are planning to rent out your home or have someone stay with you, review your Ranchero Rules and Regulations first. PET RESTRICTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED BY ALL AND APPROVED BY MANAGEMENT BEFORE A PET CAN BE BROUGHT INTO THE COMMUNITY. Additional occupants and renters must be registered with the office and a background

check performed <u>prior</u> to their arrival. <u>It is the Homeowners responsibility to meet all the requirements</u>. There is an application fee to cover this expense. Applications are available in the Office. They must be accompanied by two legible forms of identification for each person. For international applicants, copies of passports and driver's licenses are required. These should be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the person's arrival. Renters are to check in at the office upon arriving in the community.

IF YOU ARE A RENTER OR ADDITIONAL OCCUPANT and haven't done the above, please come to the office immediately and get properly registered. Thank You! Landscaping and Mowing

If you have any problems with the landscaping or mowing, please contact the Ranchero office and not the mowing crew. The office will contact their managers and get the situation resolved as quickly as possible.

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GUESTS

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are to only be driven by persons 18 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations.

SOLICITORS

<u>**DO NOT let them into your home! Call the Largo Police Department (587-6730)** immediately if you see solicitors and please let the management office know after you have called the police. We have been trying to catch and trespass them. If we can even get a license plate number, it would help immensely. Management has been working with the police in an attempt to stop these offenders. Ranchero is a plainly posted No Soliciting Community; no one should be coming to your door. These people are very bold and brazen; please help us stop them and any other solicitors before they take advantage of anyone else in our community.</u>

<u>GLASS BOTTLES – PLEASE REMEMBER</u> that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

HOME SITE ALTERATIONS

If you are making any changes or additions to your home site or the exterior of your home please come to the office and submit a completed request form. Paint colors must be approved, and a permit obtained from the office. The same applies to alteration requests; this includes plantings. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. Also, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

PUT IT IN WRITING!

All requests and complaints should be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the office for your convenience

HANDICAP CHAIR LIFT

If you need assistance to go into a pool, we have a Handicap Chair Lift available at the



Hacienda swimming pool.
