

EVERYTHING you need to know regarding disaster relief information, weather it be hurricanes, tornados, small fires, winds, flooding etc., IS IN THE "SURVIVING THE STORM" PAMPHLET, READ IT, understand it pass the word around, help a neighbor if needed, CLEAN UP YOUR YARDS of anything that could become flying debris.

CLEAN UP YOUR YARDS during this pre-planning period is very important and not to be taken lightly. It takes a little extra work, but is needed for YOUR safety and that of your NEIGHBORS FRIENDS. If everyone handles this task, we'll all be safe from flying debris during a storm. I know that all of you will take this information to heart and DO WHAT'S RIGHT. Thanks, friends.

ANOTHER VERY IMPORTANT thing to do is to let your family, friends or someone know what your evacuation plan is. Give them the name and phone number of your motel or your safety place where you'll be.

BE SURE TO HAVE ENOUGH CASH ON HAND. In severe weather, the banks and ATMs may or may not be operable, or closed.

MAKE SURE YOUR CAR is at least half full. This is very important. "IT TAKES A VILLAGE... A RANCHERO VILLAGE".

MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER

Where has the summer gone? We hope all of you have had a relaxing summer so far. The management and staff will be relaxing, too, as we take Monday, September 7th off in observance of Labor Day. The office will be closed and there will be no garbage pickup that day. In case of a Park related emergency, please call 727-346-4819. **RENTING???**

If you plan to rent your home out for the upcoming season, or anytime, please inform the office. We have "renters" come to sign in at the office but we've never been informed that the homeowner is approving the arrangement. Of course, all renters must apply and be approved by management before they can take up residency. If a party has already been previously approved they can return the following year without re-applying. Please let us know who will be coming and for what time period.

We also get many calls from people looking to rent. If you let us know you are interested in renting we might be able to direct these folks to you.

PRECAUTION

Due to recent thefts in the park the manager is urging all residents to come to the office and register their bicycles. Registration forms from the City of Largo Police Dept. are available for registering bicycles. A sticker is then placed on your bike which will help in returning it to you

should you become the victim of a theft.

Let's take all steps possible in preventing these thefts. Be sure to keep bikes and golfcarts securely locked up or chained. Also remember to lock your vehicle. If you see suspicious activity call the Largo Police Dept. at 587-6730 and also alert the park office.

PARKING IN SOMEONE ELSE'S CARPORT

If you are leaving and are allowing someone else to park in your driveway or carport in your absence, please notify the office so that we can make a note in your file.

DOG WALKING

All dog walkers be sure to walk your pet **only in the dog section and only on the side of the street designated as dog section.** Many streets are designated "dog section" on one side of the street, but the other side is not in the dog section. Keep your neighbors happy and obey the pet rules. And, of course, don't forget the 'Litter" bag.

DOOR TO DOOR SALES

Call the Largo Police Department (587-6730) immediately and please notify the community office if you have a solicitor come to your door. Even if you think you can just send them away with no harm, please remember they will be preying on your neighbors. Be a good neighbor and help to get rid of these predators. If a solicitor tells you they have received permission from the office to be in the park, do not believe it. Management <u>NEVER</u> gives permission for solicitation.

BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR RENTERS AND RESIDENTS

Both long term and short term occupants of a home, whether a renter, an owner, or an additional occupant are required to have a background check run. Anyone staying in Ranchero Village as more than a guest of 15 days up to twice a year is required to have a background check run. <u>This rule applies to everyone</u>. If you have been here before but have had an absence of over two years you will be required to have a current background check run. These rules apply to everyone no matter what your past occupation may have been.

<u><u><u>G</u>UÉSTS</u></u>

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

POOL RULES

All the rules for the pool apply to all people at all times. The rules posted as well as those which we highlight in this Bulletin are to be followed at all hours and conditions. Just because no one else is at the pool when you are, does not mean the rules can be altered for your convenience. For example: If no one else is at the pool you must still abide by the No Smoking

Rule and only smoke in the designated area. Another example is: the children's hours remain the same whether or not others are there. These are just examples, but you get the idea. Let's all keep the rules and keep Ranchero a pleasant place to live and enjoy.

HOT TUB USE is **for adults only.**

No one under 18. <u>Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub.</u> The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, <u>no longer than 15 minutes</u>. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. Never swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

<u>GLASS BOTTLES – PLEASE REMEMBER</u> that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas.

TRÉE PÉRMITS

Permits MUST be obtained from the City of Largo for the removal of any tree with a trunk larger than 4" in diameter. Certain trees will require a fee before the permit can be obtained. The community office must submit the request to the City.

If you have gone through the permit process and have removed a tree please contact the community office and let us know so we can have the permit closed out with the City.

GET PERMISSION FIRST

Driveways, siding, roof-overs, windows, painting, planting, you name it! If you are making any type of change to the outside of your home, please come into the office first to apply for a permit. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. If work is started without the proper permits, management will put a stop to the work and in some cases, even demand removal. Don't put yourself or your contractor through the inconvenience of interrupted work just because you failed to follow the rules. Also, very important, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

PUT IT IN WRITING!

All requests and complaints should be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the office for your convenience

HANDICAP CHAIR LIFT

If you need assistance to go into a pool, we have a Handicap Chair Lift available at the Hacienda swimming pool.

STREET LIGHT OUT

Unknown to many, our streetlights do not belong to us. They are the property of Duke





Keeping up with current events

If the pew Research Center News IQ survey examined the knowledge of more than 3,000 U.S. residents in an interactive quiz that asked them to identify a series of photographs, charts, and maps. Here's how the participants measured up when asked to ...

- Identify a photo of Martin Luther King Jr.: 91 Percent
- Identify the country led by Kim Jong-il from a photo (North Korea): 82 percent
- Identify the location of Guantanamo on a map (Cuba): 78 percent
- Name the country the U.S. recently re-established relations with (Cuba): 76 percent
- Identify the proposed route of the Keystone Pipeline on a map: 73 percent
- Identify Malala from a photo (2014 Nobel Prize winner): 93 percent
- Identify Pope Francis's home country on a map (Argentina): 52 percent
- Give the correct number of female Supreme Court justices (three): 33 percent

Have you taken your fish oil today?

Atural dietary supplements are big business in the U.S. As part of the National Health Interview Survey, researchers looked at the use of natural supplements other than vitamins and minerals. Comparing figures from 2002, 2007, and 2012, the trends they found include:

- Fish oil. This was the top product used by adults in 2012, as well as among children (though in 2007, Echinacea was the most popular supplement among children).
- Melatonin. This sleep aid came in second for children in 2012, increasing significantly from 2007.
- Glucosamine/chondroitin. Use of this decreased between 2007 and 2012, along with a drop in the use of Echinacea and garlic.
- Ginseng. This showed another large decline from 2002 to 2007, along with the use of Gingko.
- Green tea and milk thistle. Use of these held steady (though low) between 2007 and 2012.
