

Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

Morton Plant Hospital is now enrolling eligible patients in the Medtronic Evolut R low-risk trial, which investigates the safety and effectiveness of a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) system in patients with severe aortic stenosis who are at a low surgical mortality risk. TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.

To see if you or a loved one with severe aortic stenosis may be eligible for this trial, or for more information on the trial, call the Center for Advanced Valve and Structural Heart Care at Morton Plant Hospital at (855) 44-VALVE (855-448-2583) or visit MortonPlantValveTrial.org.





MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER

APPY THANKSGIVING to all! We have so much to be thankful to God for and living in Ranchero Village is certainly at the top of the list. Sometimes we forget how good we have it!

The Community Office will be closed Thursday and Friday, November 23rdh & 24th in observance of Thanksgiving. There will be NO GARBAGE pick-up that Friday. If you put trash out on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, it will be picked up.

In case of a Park related after hour's emergency, please call 727-346-4819.

We understand that many of you are still up North or just returning. Please contact your yard person to make sure the weeding and/or trimming has been done.

If you have any questions, please feel free to call the office so that we may assist you.

PLEASE SLOW DOWN!!!!

The speed limit in the park is 15mph. We have had multiple people filing complaints about speeding vehicles and near misses in the park. Please slow down and obey all street signs.

BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR RENTERS AND RESIDENTS

Both long term and short term occupants of a home, whether a renter, an owner, or an additional occupant are required to have a background check run. Anyone staying in Ranchero Village as more than a guest of 15 days up to twice a year is required to have a background check. This rule applies to everyone. If you have been here before but have had an absence of over two years you will be required to have a current background check run. These rules apply to everyone.

SEASONAL REMINDERS

Fall is here and it's time to check the batteries in your smoke alarms.

It is also the time to put the Root Kill down the sewer to keep roots from plugging up your plumbing. Cooper Sulfate, available at local hardware stores, should be used twice a year: once in spring and again in the fall.

PRECAUTION

The park the manager is urging all residents to come to the office and register their goflcarts and bicycles. Registration forms from the City of Largo Police Dept. are available for registering bicycles. A sticker is then placed on your bike which will help in returning it to you should you become the victim of a theft.

Let's take all steps possible in preventing these thefts. Be sure to keep bikes and golfcarts securely locked up or chained. If you see suspicious activity call the Largo Police Dept. at 727-587-6730 and also alert the park office.

DOG WALKING

All dog walkers be sure to walk your pet only in the dog section and only on the side of the street designated as dog section. Many streets are designated "dog section" on one side of the street, but the other side is not in the dog section. Keep your neighbors happy and obey the pet



rules. And, of course, don't forget the 'Litter" bag. If you have a service dog in the non-dog section, please be respectful and use your lawn only.

DOOR TO DOOR SALES Call the Largo Police Department (727-587-6730) immediately and please notify the community office if you have a solicitor come to your door. Even if you think you can just send them away with no harm, please remember they will be preying on your neighbors. Be a good neighbor and help to get rid of these predators. If a solicitor tells you they have received permission from the office to be in the park, do not believe it. Management NEVER gives permission for solicitation.

POOL RULES

All the rules for the pool apply to all people at all times. The rules posted as well as those which we highlight in this Bulletin are to be followed at all hours and conditions. Just because no one else is at the pool when you are, does not mean the rules can be altered for your convenience. For example: If no one else is at the pool you must still abide by the No Smoking Rule and only smoke in the designated area. Another example is: the children's hours remain the same whether or not others are there. These are just examples, but you get the idea. Let's all keep the rules and keep Ranchero a pleasant place to live and enjoy.

HOT TUB USE is for adults only.

No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub. The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, <u>no longer than 15 minutes</u>. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. <u>Never</u> swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

<u>GLASS BOTTLES</u> – PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

PUT IT IN WRITING!

All requests and complaints must be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the office for your convenience.

The office does not monitor Next Door.

One minute a day may lead to stronger bones

eeping your bones in good shape is vital to your health as you grow older, especially for women. Research reported on the Medical News Today website suggests that women may be able to keep their bones strong by running just one minute a day.

Examining data from more than 2,500 women, researchers found that women who participated in high-intensity, weight-bearing physical activity like running 60-120 seconds a day had 4 percent better bone health than women who took part in less than a minute of physical activity. Women who performed more than two minutes of exercise had 6 percent better bone health.

The researchers cautioned, though, that they can't be sure whether highintensity exercise leads to better bone health, or whether people with better bone health tend to exercise more.

New findings about the solar system intrigue scientists

ur solar system is full of interesting places—maybe not to live or even visit, but locations where life might flourish under the right conditions, or may once have been present. Two recent examples from the Science News website:

• Life on Titan? Scientists have discovered that the atmosphere of Saturn's moon Titan contains vinyl cyanide—a molecule that forms membrane-like structures and could support life. Computer simulations suggest the molecule is capable of forming flexible bubbles known as azotosomes, that could serve as an outer shell "protecting" genetic material from biochemical reactions in the moon's frigid methane seas. No one knows whether azotosomes actually exist on Titan, though. A probe would have to check out the seas to detect them.

• Water on Venus? With a surface temperature of 460 degrees, Venus is too hot to support water or life as we know it, but scientists speculate it might not always have been so inhospitable. The second planet's slow rotation—116 Earth days for a single Venusian day—might have led to a gradual cloud buildup in its atmosphere some 750 million years ago, bringing surface temperatures down to approximately 15 degrees Celsius—enough for the formation of a shallow ocean. What happened to the oceans, or whether they even existed, isn't clear. Scientists speculate they may have boiled away or been absorbed into the planet's interior.

Relax with a nice warm bath


hat's more relaxing than a long hot bath? Jacuzzi Luxury Bath commissioned a survey to explore Americans' bathing habits, and found that 38 percent of us take baths at least once a week. Frequent bathers take an average of 3.3 baths weekly for an average of 28 minutes. Among other results:

• **Timing**. The most popular times for taking a bath are weekend evenings and Monday mornings.

• **Demographics**. Bathing breaks down 50-50 between men and women. Younger people are more likely to be frequent bathers: 48 percent of people 25-44 said they bathe on a regular basis.

• **Benefits**. Women tend to take baths because it helps them relax, while men feel baths lead to better mental acuity. Bathers 18-44 said baths make them feel more alert.

• Exercise. Baths are popular for relieving soreness and fatigue caused by exercise. Forty-three percent of runner or joggers take a bath to recover after their workout, along with 34 percent who take exercise classes and 33 percent of weightlifters, followed by basketball players, bikers, and swimmers.
