We are not alone however, as the entire country has been struggling with all sorts of weather related disasters. Flooding, tornadoes, mudslides, just all sorts of things we must be watchful about. I hope you are all safe and sound up north, and here too.



What is going on this month? Well, the 1st of July is Canada Day, and of course, here in the US, the 4th of July is our Independence Day. Ramaden ends on the 17th of July. Not a very busy month. But, our Independence Day is celebrated with fireworks and pride every year for our freedom and the fact that our veterans have provided us with this freedom for centuries. Be sure to fly your American flag in honor of our country's veterans and our freedoms they have all fought so hard for all


these years. If you see a military person in uniform, thank them just shaking their hand or even a nod and a "thank you for your service". They put their lives and futures on the line for us so that we can continue to live in the manner we are so accustomed too. When I reflect back to my youth, I don't know that I would have been so brave as to even consider doing what these soldiers do every day.

In celebration of this Independence Day, there will be a Bar BQ here at the club-house. Check the bulletin boards for the information on times, what you need to bring and of course to sign up for attendance. Come out and enjoy the afternoon with a nice meal and socializing with the neighbors.

Life is pretty lazy here at the Riviera Estates this summer. The heat is up there, and the storms roll in with all of their force in the late afternoons and evenings. As ever, the lightning is something we need to know how to deal with down here, as I am told, we are the "Lightning Capital" of the world. It can be blue skies, sunshine and a beautiful day out, but if you hear thunder..........get inside.

Thunder is the first clue you will have that a storm is somewhere near you, and if you hear thunder, there is lightning close by. Don't take unnecessary chances, get inside where you are not susceptible to being struck.

On that same note, June first was the beginning of our "Hurricane Season". Are you prepared? You need to take a moment and make certain you are ready to "evacuate" quickly. Us mobile home park residents are among the first who need to evacuate our properties. The clubhouse is NOT a hurricane shelter for us to use. The news channels/Pinnellas County provides you with a listing of shelters and you should figure out exactly where you will have to go if we are required to evacuate. If you have pets, the shelter you choose must be "pet approved". Your pets must be in a carrier or cage, and you must have their shot certifications on you to get into the shelter with them. You need to have a supply of things to get you through the possibility of 3 to 4 days without util



a supply of things to get you through the possibility of 3 to 4 days without utilities to survive. This includes food items such as peanut butter, jelly, snacks/crackers, protein snacks like jerky, dried and canned meats, sticks, canned tuna, chicken breast, etc. (don't forget a hand crank can opener) !! Fresh fruit and nuts, canned vienna sausages, etc. Instant coffee, and other drinks. Of course you must have a supply of water, a gallon a day per person for 3-4 days.

Flashlights, portable radios etc are also required along with a supply of batteries for them. You should have a "hurricane evacuation" box ready with these items to grab and go. Food for the pets too. Clothing for all types of weather, rain, wind, etc. Being prepared is the quickest way of being able to evacuate at a moments notice. The meterologists are getting better each year on warning us where a storm path may be headed, but these hurricanes can turn on a moments notice and head another direction. I even have a camping cookstove in my survival box with propane cans that I can do my favorite thing, and that is "cook". A cooler with ice is a must so you can grab those food items out of the fridge and keep them cold and safe for use. Be sure that you keep your gas tanks full if you plan to drive out of the path of the storm, and make certain you have enough of your medications for a minimum of 3 to 4 days. You also will need cash, if we do have a direct hit, it is unlikely those ATM machines will be standing and operational. Just an idea of what you need to do to be prepared.

Many people take the attitude that they will gather up the things they need IF a storm is headed our way. Well, be aware that the stores will be bombarded, their supplies will be wiped out and the crowds will be difficult to deal with, as many people will be in the same boat as you are; scrambling for supplies. I find my girl (or boy) scout motto of "being prepared" much better suits my agenda. I hate crowds and that "undercurrent" of panic that sets in, and the whole craziness of last minute, so I always prepare for the worst at the beginning of the season.

Those boxes are packed and ready to throw in the car and go. Important papers, like titles to your vehicles, homes, etc. along with wills, passports, insurance policies and the like should also be gathered together for a quick grab and go. You don't want to be fumbling around looking for these items at the last minute. There are plenty of places for you to get the information

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you will need in case I have omitted anything. Lastly, make sure your neighbors and friends are prepared and offer them a ride etc. to make certain they are not left behind. I have lived here seven years, and this is my 7th hurricane season. I have never had to face a storm yet, but I always prepare. I come from the midwest, where tornadoes are the enemy there, and have lived through three or four direct hits. You do not have near the warning before the storm as you do with a hurricane. Guess that is why I am preaching the "be prepared" agenda this month. However, I did have Charley chase me back to Indiana a few days earlier than I had planned in 2004. We were here on vacation, and had to evacuate. We sat on the Howard Franklin Bridge for close to 4 hours not moving an inch. The car's temperature got so hot, we had to turn off the a/c and open the windows. It tookus hours to get out of Florida and finally made it to Valdosta, Georgia for thenight. The storm "turned" that night and devastated Port Charlotte. That

experience alone taught me that I don't want to wait until the last moment. So I will get off my preaching box and hope that everyone I know and careabout so much, gets through another hurricane season without incident. And if we do have the inevitable this year, I hope many of you, after reading this, will prepare your "evacuation" box and be prepared.

In other news, you may have noticed that the rent bills have been put on your doorknobs last month. The post office is cracking down on anything other than mail being placed in the mailbox. This also will apply to our Media Magazine. So, my husband will be delivering the Media magazine starting with this issue. We are looking into the cost of buying doorknob bags also, but until we finalize that, he will be placing the magazine on your step, or perhaps on a windshield of your car under the wiper, or inside a storm door, etc. We will try to place it in an obvious spot, out of the weather if possible so be on the lookout for it. So remember to look for it.

Homes appear to be selling pretty well here in the park. The new home is in and ready to sell. We welcome the new residents of Riviera and hope you enjoy all that is offered here in the park. The pool has been wonderful, very warm and pleasant to relax and float around in. Just remember, if you hear thunder, get out of the pool and leave the area to be safe. Most of you are aware that I have hip issues which have been very bad here lately, but the pool has helped me quite a bit. I am thankful for it. I believe the front half of the park will be getting their roads paved also sometime this summer.

I guess I better close for this month. As ever, I ask that you keep a look out for your neighbor in these very hot humid months. Make certain they are okay, and their air conditioning is working and they are comfortable. Make an offer to run an errand for them, or help them with a chore they cannot do such as weeding or sweeping off their carport etc. Let them know you care and are thinking of them.

Pay it forward and feel better about life and yourself. Until next month....be safe.

POOL AND PET OWNER REMINDERS

FYI: Riviera Estates MHP would like to remind our residents that NO one is allowed to touch the temperature settings on the pool heater and/or the clubhouse air conditioner. Our manager and the Homeowner's Association Executive Board have insisted on this. Pool hours are 9:00 a.m. until dusk daily. Pool is heated in winter, the months of November through March.

ATTENTION PET OWNERS: Please be a responsible pet owner and a **RESPECTIBLE** pet owner as well. When walking your pets, please do not allow them to "potty" in other people's yards. Some are not pet lovers as we are. Your dogs must be leashed at all times, and there are plenty of areas where your dog can go. There is a pet cleanup station in the storage field for your use. Please be sure to clean up after your pet. Also, please try to keep your pet from barking or making loud disturbing noise that can bother a neighbor. Complaints are being received by the office on a constant basis of pet problems in the park. So, at this time, our pet rule policy should be noted. Pets are allowed in park, UP TO 20 POUNDS weight restriction. Copies of pet innoculation certificate must be givien to the office as proof the pet has been vaccinated. There is a LIMIT OF TWO PETS PER COACH. Fences for the pets are not allowed to be installed. All pets must be leased at all times when outside the coach. Make certain when you leave your pet, they are not barking the entire time you are gone and bothering your neighbors. If this is the case, please make some type of arrangements that will alter this situation, such as a pet sitter, taking pet with you, or if the problem continues, and complaints continue in the office from residents being bothered by the barking, the park is forced to take steps in resolving



the issue, such as requiring you to get rid of the dog, or face eviction procedures. Please be a responsible pet owner and obey the rules concerning them. It is **IMPERATIVE THAT YOU CLEAN UPAFTER YOUR PET EVERYWHERE, INCLUDING THE DOG WALKING AREA.** Please do not ignore these pet owner rules, so that we all can continue to love and enjoy our pets. But at all times we must be respectful of all the residents that live here, that they are not bothered by our pets in any way. Not by hearing them all the time, or stepping in their waste when out walking etc. Thank you for adhearance to the policies and rules.

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


